MIAMI-DADE COUNTY CONTROLLED PLANT SPECIES

Controlled species may not be planted within 500 feet of natural plant communities. These plant species have been documented by the Florida Exotic Pest Plant Council, the Miami-Dade County Parks, Recreation and Open Spaces Department's Natural Area's Management Program, and the Miami-Dade County Division of Environmental Resources Management to be invasive pests in natural areas of Miami-Dade County. Natural plant communities include coastal and freshwater wetlands, beach dunes, coastal strand communities, natural forest communities, protected preservation areas, pinelands, scrub, and hardwood hammocks. These species should also be removed if present within 500 feet of natural plant communities and these species are not recommended by Miami-Dade County for landscaping purposes due to their invasive nature.
