RESOLUTION URGING CONGRESS AND THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO ALLOCATE FUNDING FOR PEDIATRIC CANCER RESEARCH AT NICKLAUS CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL, HOLTZ CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL AND THE UNIVERSITY OF MIAMI SYLVESTER COMPREHENSIVE CANCER CENTER

WHEREAS, pediatric cancer (childhood cancer) is the leading cause of disease-related death among children and adolescents (ages one to 19 years) in the United States, according to the National Cancer Institute; and

WHEREAS, the causes of pediatric cancer are not well understood, but the disease spares no group, striking every ethnic and socioeconomic group in every country; and

WHEREAS, for some pediatric cancer types, survival rates remain low, and approximately 2,000 children die each year due to pediatric cancer; and

WHEREAS, funding from both the private sector and the federal government for pediatric cancer research is scarce; and

WHEREAS, most cancer research funding from the federal government is devoted to adult cancers with only four percent of federal research funding devoted toward research on childhood cancers; and

WHEREAS, despite significant advances in adult cancer research, there have been only three drugs approved specifically for pediatric cancer in the last 20 years; and

WHEREAS, cancer treatments for children are often toxic, leaving many child survivors with permanent disabilities, secondary cancers, and other lifelong challenges including poor educational attainment, less-than-optimal employment status, and interpersonal relationship issues; and

WHEREAS, increased research devoted to pediatric cancer is necessary not only to find cures for the different forms of pediatric cancer but also to find more humane, less toxic treatments; and

WHEREAS, Nicklaus Children's Hospital, Holtz Children's Hospital and the University of Miami Sylvester Comprehensive Cancer Center are engaged in more than 100 clinical cancer research studies, trying to find new cures, treatments and diagnostic procedures for pediatric cancers; and

WHEREAS, pediatric cancer research offers hope that lasting treatments will be found to successfully fight pediatric cancer; and

WHEREAS, pediatric cancer research is costly as hospitals comply with trial standards, hire laboratory staff, adhere to research protocols, and process and submit data; and

WHEREAS, in order to advance childhood cancer research and to offer the newest treatments in development to local patients, pediatric cancer hospitals must rely upon federal and state funding; and

WHEREAS, funding for Nicklaus Children's Hospital, Holtz Children's Hospital and the University of Miami Sylvester Comprehensive Cancer Center is needed to ensure that children of the County suffering from pediatric cancer receive the best possible care and opportunities for healing; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to urge Congress and the Florida Legislature to fund pediatric cancer research at Nicklaus Children's Hospital, Holtz Children's Hospital and the University of Miami Sylvester Comprehensive Cancer Center,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

<u>Section 1.</u> Urges Congress and the Florida Legislature to allocate funding for pediatric cancer research at Nicklaus Children's Hospital, Holtz Children's Hospital and the University of Miami Sylvester Comprehensive Cancer Center.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit certified copies of this resolution to the members of the Florida Congressional Delegation, the Governor, the Senate President, the House Speaker and the Chair and Members of the Miami-Dade County State Legislative Delegation.

Section 3. Directs the County's federal and state lobbyists to advocate for the funding as set forth in Section 1 above, and authorizes and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to amend the 2016 State Legislative Package to include this item and to include this item in the 2016 Federal Legislative Package when it is presented to the Board.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Rebeca Sosa. It was offered by Commissioner , who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
