



RESOLUTION NO. _____

RESOLUTION DESIGNATING AS "HORSE COUNTRY" A PORTION OF THE UNINCORPORATED AREA IN COUNTY COMMISSION DISTRICT 10 IN CENTRAL MIAMI-DADE COUNTY THAT IS BOUNDED ON THE NORTH BY S.W. 40TH STREET (BIRD ROAD), ON THE EAST BY THE FLORIDA TURNPIKE, ON THE SOUTH BY S.W. 72ND STREET AND ON THE WEST BY S.W. 127TH AVENUE

WHEREAS, "Horse Country" or the "Ranch Area" is an area that has approximately been bounded by S.W. 40th Street/Bird Road to the north, S.W. ~~[[88th]]~~¹ >>72nd<< Street to the south, the Florida Turnpike to the east, and S.W. 127th Avenue to the west, most of which has historically and intentionally retained a rural character despite being within the County's Urban Development Boundary; and

WHEREAS, the Comprehensive Development Master Plan (CDMP) Adopted Land Use Plan map designates the area between S.W. 40th Street/Bird Road to the north and S.W. 72nd Street/Sunset Drive to the south for Agriculture ~~[[and the Horse Country area between S.W. 72nd Street and S.W. 88th Street is designated on the CDMP Adopted Land Use Plan map as for Institutional and Estate Density development]]~~; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution Number R-605-15, a charrette report is being prepared for presentation on an agenda to this Board no later than January 2016 pursuant to Ordinance No. 14-6; and

WHEREAS, official designation will provide residents and businesses in the area with a greater visibility and unique sense of identity that fosters and protects the distinctive agricultural character of the neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, official designation may further encourage the development of agricultural businesses and attract agricultural technology investors to create innovative startups in the area and thereby have a positive fiscal impact on Miami-Dade County's economy; and

WHEREAS, Horse Country is located in Commission District 10,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are incorporated herein.

Section 2. Having conducted a public hearing, this Board designates as "Horse Country" that portion of the unincorporated area in County Commission District 10 that is bounded on the north by S.W. 40th Street (Bird Road), on the east by the Florida Turnpike, on the south by S.W. ~~[[88th]]~~ >>72nd<< Street, and on the west by S.W. 127th Avenue, as shown on the attached map which is incorporated into this resolution.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Senator Javier D. Souto. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
