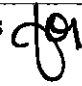

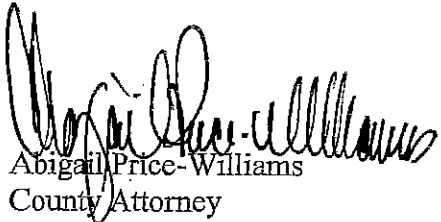

RESOLUTION NO. _____

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO CONDUCT A FEASIBILITY STUDY REGARDING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF A CARPOOL AND RIDESHARING PROGRAM FOR MIAMI-DADE COUNTY EMPLOYEES AND TO PROVIDE A REPORT PROVIDING RECOMMENDATIONS AND AN IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

WHEREAS, traffic congestion on roadways is a serious problem in Miami-Dade County, and the problem is even more pronounced during rush hour, when residents are driving in their cars to or from work; and

WHEREAS, cars are also a source of air pollution in our environment; and

WHEREAS, the practices of carpooling and ridesharing aim to reduce the problems caused by car traffic by having two or more individuals share a car when those individuals would otherwise drive their own separate cars; and

WHEREAS, the reduction of car traffic that may result from increased carpooling and ridesharing would promote public health, safety, and welfare; and

WHEREAS, state and local governments across the country have implemented different types of carpool and ridesharing programs; and

WHEREAS, employees of Miami-Dade County drive in their cars to and from work every day, often taking similar routes; and

WHEREAS, employees of Miami-Dade County could potentially be encouraged to engage in increased carpooling and ridesharing, thereby promoting public health, safety, and welfare; and

WHEREAS, an increase in carpooling and ridesharing by employees of Miami-Dade County could also reduce the costs of employee parking and parking maintenance; and

WHEREAS, this Board wishes to encourage participation in programs that increase carpooling and ridesharing in Miami-Dade County,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board directs the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee: (1) to conduct a feasibility study regarding the implementation of a carpool and ridesharing program for Miami-Dade County employees; and (2) to provide a report of this feasibility study, including recommendations and a plan for implementation of the carpool and ridesharing program, to this Board within 180 days of the effective date of this resolution and to place the completed report on an agenda of the Board pursuant to Ordinance No. 14-65.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Jose "Pepe" Diaz. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
