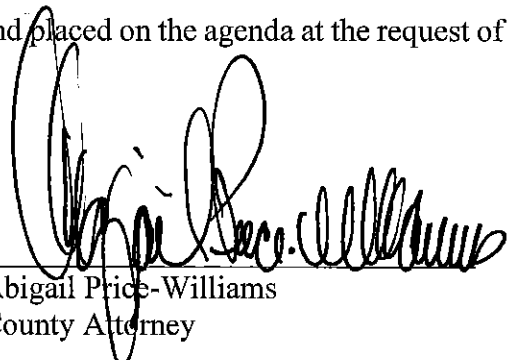

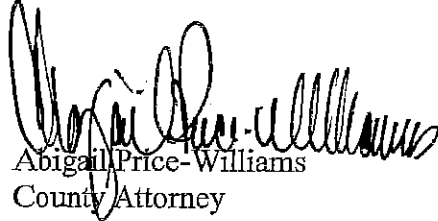

RESOLUTION NO. _____

RESOLUTION CODESIGNATING THAT PORTION OF SW
54TH AVENUE FROM SUNSET DRIVE TO SW 80TH STREET
AS "SGT. CARL P. ENIS AVENUE"

WHEREAS, Sergeant Carl P. Enis was born on March 31, 1986 in Miami Beach, Florida and grew up in Coral Gables, Florida; and

WHEREAS, Sergeant Enis earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Environmental Studies and a Master's Degree in Business Administration at Florida State University; and

WHEREAS, thereafter, Sergeant Enis bravely served in the United States Air Force as a pararescuemen in the 308th Elite Rescue Squadron based at Patrick Air Force Base in Melbourne, Florida; and

WHEREAS, pararescuemen are an elite team of airmen who serve as highly trained rescue specialists, providing life-saving trauma care and search and rescue; they are expert marksmen, parachutists, scuba divers, mountaineers, and trauma medics; their special skillset allows them to perform rescue operations at all times; and

WHEREAS, on March 15, 2018, at 31 years of age, Sergeant Enis was killed in a helicopter crash on the Syrian Iraq border, along with six other airmen; and

WHEREAS, Sergeant Enis was named the 920th Rescue Wing Airman of the Year as well as Air Force Reserve Command Pararescuemen of the Year and was posthumously awarded the Meritorious Service Medal and the Air Force Commendation Medal (with combat device); and

WHEREAS, Sergeant Enis was a true American hero who was known to his family and friends as being the most genuine, selfless, talented and humble man anyone could ever know; and

WHEREAS, Sergeant Enis is survived by his wife, Angela Drzewiecki; his mother, Dr. Colleen Enis; brother, Edward Alexander Enis; and sister, Heather Hyatt and family; and

WHEREAS, this Board would like to honor Sergeant Enis' legacy by codesignating that portion of SW 54th Avenue from Sunset Drive to SW 80th Street as "Sgt. Carl P. Enis Avenue"; and

WHEREAS, that portion of SW 54th Avenue from Sunset Drive to SW 80th Street is a County road located in unincorporated Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, this proposed codesignation is located in County Commission District 7,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Having considered this matter at a public hearing, codesignates that portion of SW 54th Avenue from Sunset Drive to SW 80th Street as "Sgt. Carl P. Enis Avenue".

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the United States Postal Service, the Traffic Signals and Signs Division of the Transportation and Public Works Department, the Development Services Division of the Regulatory and Economic Resources Department, the Miami-Dade County Police Department, and the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Xavier L. Suarez. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:

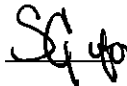
