Subject: Resolution Approving the Plat of Princeton Point

Agenda Item No. 5(J)

Recommendation

The following plat is submitted for consideration by the Board of County Commissioners (Board) for approval. This plat for Princeton Point is bounded on the north by U.S. Highway No. 1, on the east by Canal C-102, on the south by SW 248 Street, and on the west approximately 340 feet east of SW 133 Avenue.

The Miami-Dade County Plat Committee recommends approval of this plat. The Plat Committee is comprised of representatives from:

- Florida Department of Transportation;
- Florida Department of Health;
- Miami-Dade County School Board; and
- Miami-Dade County Departments of Fire Rescue; Parks, Recreation and Open Spaces; Regulatory and Economic Resources; Transportation and Public Works; and Water and Sewer.

Pursuant to Ordinance No. 16-73, this quasi-judicial matter may be submitted directly for placement on the Board's meeting agenda by the Director of the Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources.

A location sketch is attached to this memorandum as Exhibit A.

Scope

This plat is located in Commission District 8, which is represented by Commissioner Daniella Levine Cava.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

If this plat is approved, the fiscal impact to the County would be approximately \$100 annually for new roadway construction adjacent to the project. These costs would be covered by the Department of Transportation and Public Works' annual General Fund allocation.

Track Record/Monitor

The Development Services Division of the Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources administers the processing of plats and waivers of plat, and the person responsible for this function is Raul A. Pino, P.L.S.

- Proposed Usage: 150 multifamily rental apartments.
- Number of Parcels: One.

Developer's Obligation



RESOLUTION APPROVING THE PLAT OF PRINCETON POINT, LOCATED IN THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 23, TOWNSHIP 56 SOUTH, RANGE 39 EAST (BOUNDED ON THE NORTH BY U.S. HIGHWAY NO. 1, ON THE EAST BY CANAL C-102, ON THE SOUTH BY SW 248 STREET, AND ON THE WEST APPROXIMATELY 340 FEET EAST OF SW 133 AVENUE)

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, HTG Princeton Park, LLC, a Florida limited liability company, has this day presented to this Board a plat of certain lands lying in Miami-Dade County, Florida, said plat to be known as Princeton Point, the same being a subdivision of a portion of land lying and being in the Southwest 1/4 of Section 23, Township 56 South, Range 39 East, Miami-Dade County, Florida, and it appears that all requirements of law concerning said plat insofar as the authority of this Board is concerned have been complied with,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that said plat is hereby approved; that the dedication of the streets, alleys and other rights-of-way however designated or depicted on said plat is hereby accepted; that the Miami-Dade County Plat Restrictions as listed on said plat are approved and are to be enforced; that approval of the plat is not a waiver of any zoning regulations; and that the requirements of the zoning existing on this land at the time this resolution is approved shall be enforced whether or not the various parcels on this plat conform to those requirements.

The foregoing resolution was offered by Commissioner who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:


