



RESOLUTION NO. _____

RESOLUTION CODESIGNATING THAT PORTION OF SW
112TH AVENUE BETWEEN SW 124TH ROAD AND SW 128TH
STREET AS "ANTHONY D. MELLADO WAY"

WHEREAS, Anthony D. Mellado, who passed away on September 23, 2015 at just 18 years old, left a lasting impact on his neighborhood community; and

WHEREAS, although Mellado was diagnosed with hypertrophic cardiomyopathy (enlargement of the heart) at age 13, he contributed greatly to his community, participating in youth sports before his diagnosis, rescuing and adopting stray animals, and being a great friend to many; and

WHEREAS, Mellado was a dedicated student who excelled in Advanced Placement and Honors courses during his tenure at Christopher Columbus High School, which led to his acceptance at his dream university, the University of Oklahoma, just a month before he passed away; and

WHEREAS, Mellado's dream was to become a pediatrician to care for children who were diagnosed with similar heart conditions; and

WHEREAS, the loss of a youth full of promise and who had yet to reach his full potential is nothing short of a tragedy; and

WHEREAS, a codesignation spanning an area where Mellado lived and enjoyed his life will help preserve his life's memories for the members of his neighborhood who knew him best; and

WHEREAS, Anthony D. Mellado's parents, Mina McEwan and Antonio Mellado, hope to encourage other parents to have their children evaluated by a cardiologist to detect any possible hidden heart conditions; and

WHEREAS, a codesignation honoring Anthony D. Mellado would raise awareness about heart disease in young people; and

WHEREAS, this Board would like to honor Anthony D. Mellado by codesignating that portion of SW 112th Avenue between SW 124th Road and SW 128th Street as "Anthony D. Mellado Way"; and

WHEREAS, that portion of SW 112th Avenue between SW 124th Road and SW 128th Street is a County road located in unincorporated Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, this proposed codesignation is located in County Commission District 8,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Having considered this matter at a public hearing, codesignates that portion of SW 112th Avenue from SW 124th Road to SW 128th Street as "Anthony D. Mellado Way".

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the United States Postal Service, the Traffic Signals and Signs Division of the Department of Transportation and Public Works, the Development Services Division of the Regulatory and Economic Resources Department, the Miami-Dade County Police Department, and the Miami-Dade County Fire Rescue Department.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Daniella Levine Cava. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:


