RESOLUTION NO.

RESOLUTION URGING THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO ENACT SB 1092, HB 487 OR SIMILAR LEGISLATION THAT WOULD PROVIDE GRANTS TO ENABLE FIRE DEPARTMENTS TO PROCURE EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES DESIGNED TO MITIGATE EXPOSURE TO HAZARDOUS CANCER-CAUSING CHEMICALS

WHEREAS, firefighters are often the first responders on the scene of explosions, natural disasters, wildfires, traffic accidents and other catastrophes; and

WHEREAS, firefighters are increasingly exposed to toxic and hazardous chemicals released during catastrophes, disasters and fires; and

WHEREAS, a study conducted by the Centers for Disease Control's National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health ("NIOSH") found that firefighters in the line of duty are exposed to contaminants that are known or suspected to cause cancer; and

WHEREAS, the NIOSH determined that firefighters are more likely to develop respiratory, digestive and urinary system cancers than the general U.S. population; and

WHEREAS, the NIOSH also found that firefighters have a 9 percent higher chance of being diagnosed with cancer than the general U.S. population and a 14 percent increase in cancer-related deaths; and

WHEREAS, the International Association of Firefighters reports that cancer has surpassed heart disease as the leading cause of death among firefighters; and

WHEREAS, firefighters deserve protections to prevent and limit on the job exposure to toxic carcinogens; and

WHEREAS, SB 1092 and HB 487 has been filed for consideration during the 2020 session of the Florida Legislature by Senator Aaron Bean (R - Nassau) and Representative Elizabeth Fetterhoff (R - Volusia); and

WHEREAS, SB 1092 and HB 487 would create a Firefighter Cancer Decontamination Equipment Grant Program to protect the health and safety of firefighters in Florida; and

WHEREAS, SB 1092 and HB 487 would establish a program to award annual grants to fire departments as needed and would permit the distribution of equipment and training in a manner that leads to the greatest reduction in incidences of firefighters being exposed to hazardous post-fire contaminants; and

WHEREAS, the Firefighter Cancer Decontamination Equipment Grant Program would provide assistance to help fire departments procure equipment, supplies, and provide educational training to mitigate exposure to hazardous cancer-causing chemicals; and

WHEREAS, this Board supports SB 1092 and HB 487,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Urges the Florida Legislature to enact SB 1092, HB 487 or similar legislation that would provide grants to enable fire departments to procure equipment and supplies designed to mitigate exposure to hazardous cancer-causing chemicals.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Governor, Senate President, House Speaker, Senator Aaron Bean, Representative Elizabeth Fetterhoff, and the Chair and Members of the Miami-Dade County State Legislative Delegation.

Section 3. Directs the County's state lobbyists to advocate for the legislative action set forth in section 1 above and authorizes and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to amend the 2020 State Legislative Package to include this item.
