	RESOLUTION EXPRESSING THE B AND CONDOLENCES ON THE RE	

GENERAL ERNEIDO ANDRES OLIVA, DEPUTY COMMANDER OF BRIGADE 2506

WHEREAS, Erneido Andres Oliva was born on June 20, 1932, in Aguacate, Cuba, and left Cuba for the United States in 1960 at the age of 28, fleeing the Communist regime of dictator Fidel Castro; and

WHEREAS, shortly after emigrating to the United States, General Oliva was recruited by the Central Intelligence Agency for training and was subsequently appointed deputy commander, or second-in-command, of Brigade 2506; and

WHEREAS, in April 1961, Brigade 2506 carried out the historic Bay of Pigs Invasion landings in Cuba, which were aimed at liberating Cuba from the Communist dictatorship imposed by Fidel Castro; and

**WHEREAS**, during the Bay of Pigs, an estimated 114 drowned or were killed in action, and estimated 1,183 were captured, tried, and imprisoned; and

WHEREAS, General Oliva was one of the Brigade members imprisoned in the wake of the Bay of Pigs; and

WHEREAS, in December 1962, after spending 20 months imprisoned in Cuba, General Oliva was released, and returned to the United States; and

WHEREAS, at the 1962 Orange Bowl held in Miami on December 29, 1962, General Oliva presented the Brigade 2506 flag to President John F. Kennedy; and

WHEREAS, after the Bay of Pigs invasion, Erneido Andres Oliva was commissioned as a second lieutenant into the United States Army and ultimately became a Major General in the District of Columbia Army National Guard; and

WHEREAS, General Oliva served the armed forces of the United States in various roles until his retirement in 1993; and

WHEREAS, in 1996, General Oliva founded the Cuban-American Military Council (CAMCO), to promote cooperation between all Cuban military veterans; and

**WHEREAS**, the stated mission of CAMCO was to peacefully bring freedom to the Cuban people through cooperation with the Cuban military; and

WHEREAS, General Oliva passed away on January 30, 2020, at the age of 87, in Maryland; and

WHEREAS, General Oliva is survived by his wife of 61 years, Graciela; his daughter, Maria Oliva-Hemker; his son, Antonio Oliva; and his sister and two grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, upon his passing, this Board wishes to honor Erneido Andres Oliva's life and memory through this expression of sympathy and condolences to his family, friends, and loved ones,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board expresses its sympathy and condolences on the passing of General Erneido Andres Oliva, deputy commander of Brigade 2506.
