Subject: Resolution Ratifying Action Related to Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department's Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance pursuant to Section 2-8.2.12 of the Miami-Dade County Code

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) ratify the action of the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee, as authorized under Section 2-8.2.12 of the Miami-Dade County Code related to Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department's (WASD) Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance (WASD's Acceleration Ordinance) for the funded project identified below and on Exhibit A, as attached.

Consent Decree Project

Item 1 – Recommendation to Award: Construction Contract for CD 2.07(7) Electrical Improvements - Substations 7A, 8A, 9A, 10A, Contract No. S-943. This item requests ratification of a contract in the total amount not to exceed \$9,966,020 with a total contract period 540 days to Daniel O'Connell's Sons, Inc.

Scope

The commission district of the project location is noted in Exhibit A. The projects awarded through WASD's Acceleration Ordinance have a countywide impact.

Background

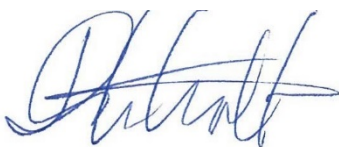

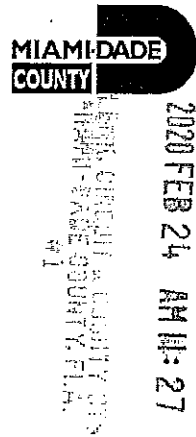

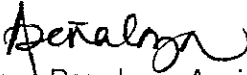

RECOMMENDATION:

Pursuant to the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance, Section 2-8.2.12 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, it is recommended that the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee approve this contract award recommendation to Daniel O'Connell's Sons, Inc. (hereafter "DOCS") for Contract No. S-943 to construct the Consent Decree (CD) Project 2.01(7) Electrical Improvements – Substations 7A, 8A, 9A, 10A. The total compensation amount is \$9,966,020 with a total contract term of 540 days. This contract award recommendation was prepared by the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD).

DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY:

Pursuant to Section 2-8.2.12 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee is authorized to amend and execute the Contract. Pursuant to the provisions of Sections 2-8.2.12 (4)(d) and (e) of the Code, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to amend and/or extend the Contract to complete any unfinished work, waive liquidated damages, negotiate and settle claims, and execute change orders that do not exceed ten percent (10%) of the base contract amount.

PROJECT NAME:

CD 2.01(7) Electrical Improvements – Substations 7A, 8A, 9A, 10A

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

This project is one in a series of projects that are being processed under Section 2-8.2.12 of the Code, entitled Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance. In general, the project consists of the construction of new electrical substation buildings for substations 7A, 8A, 9A and 10A located within the Central District Wastewater Treatment Plant (CDWWTP), located at 3989 Rickenbacker Causeway in Virginia Key, Florida.

The scope of work includes, but is not limited to, furnishing all materials, labor, and equipment necessary to construct a new electrical substation building for Substations 7A, 8A, 9A and 10A on auger cast piles. The substations provide power for the processes at the Oxygen Generation Plant 2 Building. The electrical improvements consist of removing the existing substation transformers within the existing building and installing new transformers and electrical gear within a new Substation Building. The foundation system of the new Substation Building will include grade beams and pile

caps on proposed auger cast-in-place (ACIP) concrete piles. Demolition will include the removal and disposal of the existing substation transformers and equipment associated with existing substations 7A, 8A, 9A, 10A and the existing motor starter cubicle for Compressor No. 3. In addition, the existing 1,500 HP motor will be removed and turned over to the owner and replaced with a larger owner furnished motor. General site civil work will include all grading, paving, drainage, utilities and pavement restoration. A driveway will be provided along with two on-site parking spaces. The new building will be designed to comply with sea level rise and storm surge design criteria for the CDWWTP which require all critical facilities to be placed at or above a finished floor elevation (FFE) of 20.9 NGVD. In addition, major portions of the work also include:

1. Installation of new 15 KV feeder cables from Main Switchgear Building to the new substation transformers T-7A, T-8A, T-9A and T-10A that will be located in the new Substation Building
2. Installation of two (2) new, less-flammable, liquid filled, indoor transformers for substation 7A and 8A each rated at 13.2KV-2400/4160V, 2000KVA to replace the existing transformers. The transformers will be anchored to the concrete pads.
3. Installation of new 15 KV primary fused switch units for each new substation transformer 7A and 8A.
4. Installation of two (2) new 4160V solid state reduced voltage starters with required interlocks between each such that only one starter can be operational at given time.
5. Installation of a new 1750HP, 4160V compressor motor on Compressor No. 3. motor (to be Owner-furnished).
6. Installation of two (2) new, less-flammable, liquid filled, indoor transformers for substation 9A and 10A each rated at 13.2KV-277/480V, 1500KVA to replace the existing substation transformers. The transformers will be anchored to concrete pads.
7. Installation of a new 15 KV primary fused switch units for each new substation transformer 9A and 10A.
8. Installation of a new arc-resistant, double-ended, 480V draw-out switchgear lineups with Main-Tie-Tie-Main configurations for Substations 9A & 10A.
9. Installation of a new 480V feeder cables from the new switchgear to MCC-4 and MCC-6 using the combination of existing ductbank/conduits and required duct bank extensions.
10. Installation of a new arc-resistant, double-ended, low voltage (480V), motor control center with Main-Tie-Tie-Main configuration to feed the 480V HVAC motor loads.
11. Installation of a new power panels, lighting transformers and lighting panels in the Switchgear Room to support building auxiliary loads.
12. Installation of a new LED lighting fixtures inside and outside of the new substation building.
13. Installation of lightning protection system for the new substation building.
14. Installation of a new fire alarm system with Fire Alarm Control Panel.
15. Each of the transformer rooms and switchgear rooms shall be provided with two water-cooled heat pump air conditioning (AC) units. Each set of AC units will be tied to individual cooling towers for each room. Each room will also have one Purafil air filtration unit
16. Instrumentation work includes installing an owner furnished Remote I/O panel which will receive all signals originating at the new Substation Building, including new signals from power monitoring equipment. The new Remote I/O panel will communicate with the existing remote telemetry unit (RTU) in the Oxygen Generation Plant 2 Building.

Due diligence was conducted by WASD and the Internal Services Department (ISD) in accordance with ISD's Procurement Guidelines to determine responsibility, including verifying corporate status, safety, performance and compliance data. The lists that were reviewed include: convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There were no adverse findings related to DOCS. This information is being provided pursuant to Resolution R-187-12.

EXPLANATION:

On November 22, 2019, WASD received and opened five (5) bids (See Bid Tabulation, attached as EXHIBIT "C") in response to an advertisement for an open competitive solicitation for Contract No. S-943, with bids summarized as follows:

Because contract measures were assigned, the two lowest bids were forwarded to Internal Services Department's (ISD) Division of Small Business Development (SBD) for a Compliance Review. On December 11, 2019, SBD issued the results of its Compliance Review. Both DOCS and Poole & Kent Company of Florida were determined to be in compliance with the Implementing Order for the Small Business Enterprise (SBE/Cons) program for construction services and (SBE/GS) program for goods and services. A copy of SBD's Compliance Review is attached hereto as EXHIBIT "D".

Upon review of the low bidder's submittal, the project's Engineer of Record, Stantec, confirmed that DOCS met the required minimum experience and recommended award to DOCS in correspondence dated December 31, 2019. (See EXHIBIT "E", as attached).

ISD's Capital Improvements Information System (CIIS) database contains two (2) contractor evaluations for DOCS. Both were interim evaluations performed in January 2020. The average overall rating of both was 2.6 points out of a possible 4 points. (See EXHIBIT "F", as attached).

It is recommended that the project be awarded to Daniel O'Connell's Sons, Inc., the lowest responsible, responsive bidder, whose base bid of \$8,554,000 is approximately 6.96% below the engineer's base estimate of \$9,194,154.

The Contract, Collusion Affidavit and the Firm's Responsibility Affidavit (also called "Combined Affidavit") executed by DOCS are attached as EXHIBIT "G", EXHIBIT "H" and Exhibit "I", respectively.

PREVIOUS EXPERIENCE WITH THE COUNTY IN THE PAST FIVE (5) YEARS:

According to the Firm History Report (attached as EXHIBIT "J") provided by the Internal Services Department, Division of Small Business Development, DOCS has been awarded two (2) construction contracts in the past three (3) years with the County, with a total value of \$35,186,787.83. Their first County project was awarded by the Board of County Commissioners (Board) pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the Miami-Dade County Code, and the second was awarded pursuant to the WASD Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance and ratified by the Board.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS EXCEED LEGAL REQUIREMENTS: Yes

In addition to licensing requirements, bidders shall demonstrate relevant minimum experience by submitting proof with their bid contract experience as required below:

- Bidders shall be experienced in chemical storage and metering facilities, specifically for sodium hypochlorite applications.

- The Bidder or Bidder's Electrical Subcontractor shall have successfully completed a minimum of three (3) projects demonstrating experience with installation of electrical equipment rated for 13.2KV and 480V power supply within the last 10 years.

In the event a firm is established by executives, supervisors and other senior field staff (key employees) that would have met these minimum experience requirements with a prior firm, the County reserves the right to qualify the firm based on its sole determination and evaluation of the knowledge and prior experience of these key employees employed by the new firm. The experience of key senior personnel with other firms may be counted towards the experience requirement, if acceptable to the County.

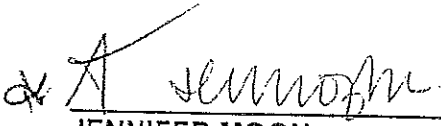
BACKGROUND:

On May 21, 2013, the Board of County Commissioners authorized the execution of a Consent Decree between Miami-Dade County, the United States of America, the State of Florida and the Florida Department of Environmental Protection in United States District Court for the Southern District of Florida Case No. 1:12-cv-24400-FAM for improvements to the County's wastewater collection and treatment system.

In accordance with Appendix D of the Consent Decree, Project Number CD 2.01 requires Electrical Improvements to the Central District Wastewater Treatment Plant, which is owned and operated by the Water and Sewer Department. The USEPA compliance date for CD 2.01(7) is June 14, 2021. The purpose of this project is to rehabilitate and replace the electrical controls and wiring for electrical substations. These substations are also in need of electrical upgrades and renovations, such as the raising of finished floor elevations, due to Sea Level Rise concerns, because loss of electrical controls or faulty wiring could result in plant shutdowns, wastewater overflows and effluent violations.

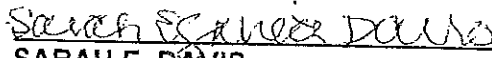

The bid opening for Contract S-943 - Consent Decree project CD 2.01(7) CDWWTP Electrical Improvements - Substations 7A, 8A, 9A, 10A, took place on November 22, 2019 at 2:00 PM at the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department's (WASD) Douglas Office. There were five bidders: Poole & Kent, Daniel O'Connell's Sons, Intercounty, Lanzo, and Lunacon; refer to Table 1 for a summary of the bid results. Daniel O'Connell's Sons submitted the low bid with a Base Bid price of \$8,554,000.00.

During the course of bidding, additional bid items and the Compressor #3 Additional Work Dedicated Allowance were added via addenda to the Proposal Form originally advertised. The Base Bid values in Table 1 were obtained from Item 17 Subtotal of the final Proposal Form from each bidder. The Total Bid values in Table 1 were calculated by adding the Base Bid and the corresponding allowances for each bidder, which included:

- Permitting Dedicated Allowance: 3% of the Base Bid
- Utility Conflict Dedicated Allowance: set at a fixed value of \$150,000
- Contaminated Soils Dedicated Allowance: set at a fixed value of \$100,000
- Compressor #3 Additional Work Dedicated Allowance: set at a fixed value of \$50,000
- Contingency Allowance: 10% of the Base Bid

Analysis

The construction market is the principal factor leading to variations between engineering cost estimates and actual contractor bid prices. A variety of factors may lead to market conditions that result in above-normal bid prices, including the number of bidders, bidders' perception of risk associated with the project, the bidders' ability to obtain performance bonds, the degree of construction activity in the national and local markets, etc.

The Engineer's Opinion of Probable Construction Cost (OPCC) for this project was \$9,194,154.00 for the Base Bid and \$10,639,394.02 for the Total Bid. The Engineer's OPCC was prepared in accordance to AACE standards for a Class 2 Cost Estimate, which has an expected accuracy range between -5% to -15% on the low side, and +5% to +20% on the high side. Daniel O'Connell's Sons' Base Bid price of \$8,554,000.00 is \$640,154.00 (6.96%) lower than the Engineer's Base Bid Estimate. Daniel O'Connell's Sons' bid price is within the expected accuracy range of the OPCC.

Review of Qualifications

Special Provision 1.3 – Specific Project Experience As Required in the Contract Documents identifies the minimum construction experience required for the bidding contractors, which includes successfully completing a minimum of three (3) projects demonstrating experience with installation of electrical equipment rated for 13.2KV and 480V line voltages within the last ten (10) years by the Bidder or the Bidder's electrical sub-contractor. As part of the bid documents, Daniel O'Connell's Sons submitted a list of projects as proof of experience to meet the minimum qualifications. Stantec has reviewed this information and confirmed that Daniel O'Connell's Sons meets the required minimum experience.

Recommendation

Daniel O'Connell's Sons' bid price is within 10% of the Engineer's OPCC and meets the minimum experience qualifications as required in the Contract Documents. As such, Stantec recommends that Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department award the contract to Daniel O'Connell's Sons.

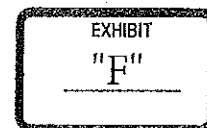

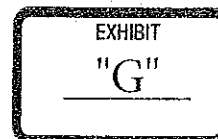

sureties as shall be satisfactory to the County. In such event, no further payment to the Contractor shall
be deemed to be due under this Contract until such new or additional security shall have been furnished
in a manner and form satisfactory to the County.

5. The "Contract Documents" are hereby defined as the Questionnaire, the Advertisement for Bids,

6. 7. The County retains the right to audit any and all information regarding this Contract as described in the General Covenants and Conditions, Section 41 "Audit Rights and Review of Records".

8. Notwithstanding and prevailing over any other provision of the Contract Documents to the contrary, the County Mayor or Mayor's designee's, may exercise the provisions of Section 2-8.2.12 (4)(d) and (e) of the Code of Miami-Dade County. Any change orders or amendments shall not exceed 10 percent of the base contract price in cumulative percentage amount; provided however, that the foregoing limitation shall not apply to any change order or amendment related to emergency actions impacting remediation, public safety, health requirements or recovery from natural disaster and the foregoing change orders and amendments shall require ratification by the Board; provided further that the County Mayor or his designee may reduce in any amount the scope and compensation payable under this Contract and grant compensable and non-compensable time extensions thereunder. Pursuant to Section 2-8.2.12 (5), the County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee's award and execution of this Contract is subject to ratification by the Board of County Commissioners. If the Mayor or the Mayor's designee's action is not ratified, and such legislative action becomes final, this Contract shall be deemed terminated without further notice. In such event, the Contractor shall not be entitled to recovery of any lost profits or other consequential or indirect damages. However, the Contractor is eligible for payment for any work done prior to failure of the ratification, in accordance with General Terms and Conditions Article 11.D(1) Termination for Convenience.
