Subject: Recommendation to Ratify Emergency Purchase and Increase in Expenditure Authority

under Prequalification Pool No. RVQ-01333, Moving Services

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve this request for ratification of a competitive emergency purchase in the amount of \$100,000 and an increase in expenditure authority in the amount of \$2,900,000, under Prequalification Pool No. *RTQ-01333, Moving Services* for the Elections Department (Elections). Elections is requesting the increase in expenditure authority to support future services through the remaining term of the pool. The County established this prequalification pool on September 25, 2019, under delegated authority, for a five-year term.

Elections started using this pool during municipal elections in 2019 to obtain moving services for the delivery and pickup of voting equipment and related supplies to and from the Elections Department warehouse, or other off-site warehouses, to Early Voting and Election Day locations. Voting equipment includes, but is not limited to, optical scanners, privacy booths, ballot transfer carts, check-in stations and general election supplies such as folding tables and chairs.

On July 13, 2020, the Director of the Elections Department declared an emergency in the amount of \$100,000, as there was insufficient expenditure authority available to obtain moving services for the August 2020 Primary Election. Although staff proceeded as an emergency due to the proximity of the August election, a request for quotes was issued to all the vendors on the prequalification pool to obtain the best pricing for these services.

Since the establishment of this prequalification pool, Elections has successfully utilized this delivery method for multiple municipal elections, the March 2020 Presidential Preference Primary and the August 2020 Primary Elections. Additional expenditure authority is needed to continue utilizing these services for the upcoming 2020 Presidential Election and to continue through the 2024 election cycle. Elections has realized operational efficiencies from shifting to these services as opposed to performing this function with temporary workers, allowing the redistribution of staff to other critical functions and eliminating the administrative functions associated with vehicular accident claims.

Scope

The impact of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The pool term will expire on September 30, 2024. The pool had an existing cumulative allocation of \$999,000 prior to the \$100,000 emergency purchase. If the additional allocation requested is approved, the pool will have a modified cumulative allocation of \$3,999,000. The requested increase in expenditure authority is based on actual spend during the first year of the pool, the immediate need for the upcoming elections and future scheduled elections through 2024.

Delegated Authority

The County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee will have the authority to solicit pricing and award contracts up to an aggregate amount of the allocation authorized by the Board. The County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee will also have the authority to (a) exercise all provisions of the solicitation documents and any resulting contracts pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the County Code and Implementing Order 3-38 and (b) add vendors to the pool at any time, subject to ratification by the Board on a bi-annual basis.

Due Diligence

RESOLUTION RATIFYING AN EMERGENCY PURCHASE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$100,000.00 AND INCREASE EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY IN THE **AMOUNT** \$2,900,000.00 FOR THE PURCHASE OF MOVING SERVICES FOR PREQUALIFICATION POOL NO. RTQ-01333 FOR THE MIAMI-DADE **ELECTIONS DEPARTMENT:** AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO SOLICIT PRICING, AWARD CONTRACTS, EXERCISE ALL PROVISIONS OF THE SOLICITATION DOCUMENTS AND ANY RESULTING CONTRACTS PURSUANT TO SECTION 2-8.1 OF THE CODE OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY. **FLORIDA** IMPLEMENTING ORDER 3-38, AND ADD VENDORS TO THE POOL AT ANY TIME, SUBJECT TO RATIFICATION BY THE **BOARD ON A BI-ANNUAL BASIS**

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board ratifies an emergency purchase in the amount of \$100,000.00 and an increase in expenditure authority in the amount of \$2,900,000.00 for moving services for Prequalification Pool No. RTQ-01333 for the Miami-Dade Elections Department as set forth in the incorporated memorandum, and authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to (a) solicit pricing and award contracts up to an aggregate amount of the allocation authorized by the Board, (b) exercise all provisions of the solicitation documents and any resulting contracts pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida and Implementing Order 3-38, and (c) add vendors to the pool at any time, subject to ratification by the Board on a bi-annual basis. 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resulting contracts are on file and available upon request from the Internal Services Department,
Strategic Procurement Division.
