RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR TO ON AN INDEFINITE BASIS. THE DEVELOPED AND IMPLEMENTED AS DIRECTED BY RESOLUTION NO. R-1136-20 FOR IMPROVED SECURITY AT METRORAIL AND **METROMOVER** STATIONS. INCLUDING THE POSTING OF SWORN OFFICERS FROM THE MIAMI-DADE COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT AT SUCH STATIONS; DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR TO IDENTIFY AND ALLOCATE LEGALLY AVAILABLE FUNDS FROM WITHIN THE FISCAL YEAR 2020-2021 COUNTY BUDGET AND, TO THE EXTENT AVAILABLE FROM ANY CORONAVIRUS AID, RELIEF, AND ECONOMIC SECURITY ACT OR AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN FUNDS ALLOCATED COUNTY BYTHE **FEDERAL** ADMINISTRATION, TO ACCOMPLISH SUCH PURPOSES; AND TO INCLUDE THE FUNDING OF SAID PLAN IN THE MAYOR'S PROPOSED BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2021-2022; AND REQUIRING A REPORT

WHEREAS, on October 26, 2020, this Board adopted Resolution No. R-1136-20, which directed the County Mayor to develop and implement a plan to improve security at all Metrorail and Metromover stations, including by: (a) posting sworn officers from the Mami-Dade Police Department (MDPD) at such stations for as long as the state of local emergency for Miami-Dade County related to coronavirus disease 2019 ("COVID-19") remained in effect, and thereafter at the County Mayor's discretion; and (b) providing MDPD's Real Time Crime Center with access to the Department of Transportation and Public Works's closed-circuit television system (the "plan"); and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. R-1136-20 further directed the County Mayor to allocate \$10,000,000.00 from legally available funds to accomplish the plan, including, to the extent available, from any Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act funds allocated by the Federal Transit Administration to accomplish the plan; and

**WHEREAS**, on May 4, 2021, the report required by section 4 of Resolution No. R-1136-20, was presented to the Board; and

**WHEREAS**, the report indicated that MDPD will continue providing the security detail on the County's transit system until the \$10,000,000.00 directed to such purposes by Resolution No. R-1136-20 have been exhausted, and that further discussions regarding funding will be made with the Department of Transportation and Public Works if the operation shall continue; and

WHEREAS, this Board believes it is in the best interest of the County and its transit patrons to extend the plan for improved security at the County's Metrorail and Metromover stations on an indefinite basis, including by the posting of sworn officers from the Miami-Dade County Police Department at such stations,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

<u>Section 1</u>. Adopts the foregoing recitals as if fully set forth herein.

Section 2. Directs the County Mayor to extend, on an indefinite basis, the plan developed and implemented as directed by Resolution No. R-1136-20 for improved security at all Metrorail and Metromover stations, including the posting of sworn officers from the Miami-Dade County Police Department at such stations.

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Section 3. Directs the County Mayor to identify and allocate legally available funds from within the fiscal year 2020-2021 County Budget and, to the extent available from any Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act or American Rescue Plan funds allocated to the County by the Federal Transit Administration, to accomplish the directive required by section 2 of this resolution, and to include the funding of said plan in the Mayor's Proposed Budget for fiscal year 2021-2022 when submitted to this Board for approval.

Section 4. Directs the County Mayor to provide a written report detailing the status of the implementation of the directive required by section 2 of this resolution within 30 days of the effective date of this resolution, and to place the completed report on an agenda of this Board pursuant to Ordinance 14-65.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Joe A. Martinez. It was offered by Commissioner , who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
