Subject: Report on a Plan to Construct Dog Parks at Homestead Air Reserve Park and Ferguson Park – Directive No. 202583

On February 2, 2021, the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approved Resolution No. R-180-21 (Attachment A) from the prime sponsor Commissioner Kionne L. McGhee directing the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to prepare a report to the Board on developing a plan to construct dog parks at Homestead Air Reserve Park and Ferguson Park to:

- 1. Conduct due diligence to identify any obstacles or restrictions to constructing dog parks at Homestead Air Reserve Park and Ferguson Park:
- 2. Prepare a plan to construct dog parks at Homestead Air Reserve Park and Ferguson Park, including consideration of any limitations or restrictions on the use of the properties and recommendations for further action;
- 3. Identify all legally available funding necessary for the design and construction of the dog parks;
- 4. Consult with the district Commissioner Kionne L. McGhee in the development of the plan within 60 days of the effective date of this resolution; and
- 5. Submit a written report to the Board within 90 days of the effective date of the resolution.

Recommendation

A report has been prepared and includes the following:

1. Conduct due diligence to identify any obstacles or restrictions to constructing dog parks at Homestead Air Reserve Park and Ferguson Park:

Homestead Air Reserve Park is located at 27401 SW 127 Avenue, in unincorporated Miami-Dade County, and is assigned to the Parks, Recreation and Open Spaces (PROS) Department. The park is zoned RU-1, which allows for park use, including a dog park. The general plan for Homestead Air Reserve Park includes a dog park located in the northeast portion of the property.

Ferguson Park is located at 10101 SW 152 Street, in unincorporated Miami-Dade County. The parcel is owned by the School Board of Miami-Dade County and it is part of the Master Joint Use Agreement between PROS and Miami-Dade County Public Schools (MDCPS). PROS contacted MDCPS to inquire about the feasibility of developing a dog park within Ferguson Park. MDCPS does not permit dog parks on their properties; therefore, a dog park at Ferguson Park is not feasible. PROS has consulted with the County Commissioner of District 9, Kionne L. McGhee, and will construct a fitness court and picnic pavilions at Ferguson Park. PROS contacted MDCPS to inquire about the feasibility of developing a fitness court and picnic pavilions at Ferguson Park.

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pavilions within Ferguson Park. MDCPS is supportive of PROS' installation of the proposed fitness court and picnic pavillions.

2. Prepare a plan to construct dog parks at Homestead Air Reserve Park and Ferguson Park, including consideration of any limitations or restrictions on the use of the properties and recommendations for further action;

The scope of work for a proposed dog park at Homestead Air Reserve Park includes planning, consultant selection, design, permitting, procurement, and construction of a dog park, including demolition of existing concrete walkways and asphalt pavement. The timeline for the implementation of this project would be approximately 18 months.

The scope of work for a proposed fitness court and picnic pavilions at Ferguson Park includes planning, consultant selection, design, permitting, procurement and construction of a fitness court, including fitness equipment, two picnic pavilions, concrete surfaces, benches, picnic tables, bike racks, and shade trees. The timeline for the implementation of this project would be approximately 18 months.

3. Identify all legally available funding necessary for the design and construction of the park improvements:

The overall estimated order of magnitude total project cost for a dog park at Homestead Air Reserve Park is approximately \$449,000, inclusive of design and construction. Approximately \$449,000 could be allocated from the Countywide Infrastructure Investment Program (CIIP) to fund the design and construction of a dog park at Homestead Air Reserve Park.

The overall estimated order of magnitude total project cost for a fitness court at Ferguson Park is approximately \$704,000, inclusive of design and construction. Approximately \$704,000 could be allocated from the CIIP to fund the design and construction of a fitness court at Ferguson Park.

4. Consult with the district Commissioner in the development of the plan within 60 days of the effective date of this resolution:

In response to Commissioner Kionne L. McGhee's request for a dog park at Homestead Air Reserve Park and a fitness court and picnic pavilions at Ferguson Park, PROS has developed conceptual plans and project budgets for both projects.

5. Submit a written report to the Board within 90 days of the effective date of the resolution:

This report is provided in response to Resolution R-180-21.

RESOLUTION NO. R-180-21

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO DEVELOP A PLAN TO CONSTRUCT DOG PARKS AT HOMESTEAD AIR RESERVE PARK AND FERGUSON PARK; AND REQUIRING A REPORT

WHEREAS, dog parks provide a safe space for dogs to exercise off-leash; and

WHEREAS, dog parks allow owners an opportunity to be physically active alongside their

pets; and

WHEREAS, dog parks promote a sense of community among dog owners; and

WHEREAS, there are not currently any County operated dog parks in District 9; and

WHEREAS, it would benefit the residents of District 9 to have dog parks that did not

require travel to other parts of the County; and

WHEREAS, Ferguson Park located at SW 146th Street and SW 103rd Avenue is a 7-acre

park that would benefit from the introduction of dog park; and

WHEREAS, Homestead Air Reserve Park located at 27401 SW New York Avenue in

Homestead would also benefit from the introduction of dog park; and

WHEREAS, both Ferguson Park and Homestead Air Reserve Park are located in District

9; and

WHEREAS, this Board desires that dog parks be established at both Ferguson Park and Homestead Air Reserve Park,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

<u>Section 1.</u> This Board directs the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to: (i) conduct due diligence to identify any obstacles or restrictions to constructing dog parks at Ferguson Park and Homestead Air Reserve Park; (ii) prepare a plan to construct dog parks at Ferguson Park and Homestead Air Reserve Park, including consideration of any limitations or restrictions on the use of the properties and recommendations for further action; (iii) identify all legally available funding necessary for the design and construction of the dog parks; and (iv) consult with the district Commissioner in the development of the plan within 60 days of the effective date of this resolution.

<u>Section 2.</u> This Board directs the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to submit a written report to this Board within 90 days of the effective date of this resolution, which shall be placed on an agenda of the Board pursuant to Ordinance No. 14-65, setting forth all of the information sought in section 1, (i)-(iii) of this resolution.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Kionne L. McGhee. It was offered by Commissioner Joe A. Martinez , who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Danielle Cohen Higgins and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
