Subject: Resolution Approving the Waiver of Plat of Habitat for Humanity of Greater

Miami Field by Habitat for Humanity of Greater Miami

Recommendation

The following waiver of plat is submitted for consideration by the Board of County Commissioners (Board) for approval. This waiver of plat for Habitat for Humanity of Greater Miami is bounded on the north by SW 180 Street, on the east approximately 190 feet west of SW 102 Avenue, on the south by SW 181 Street, and on the west approximately 220 feet east of SW 103 Avenue.

The Miami-Dade County Plat Committee recommends approval of this waiver of plat. The Plat Committee is comprised of representatives from:

- Florida Department of Transportation;
- Florida Department of Health;
- Miami-Dade County School Board; and
- Miami-Dade County Departments of Fire Rescue; Parks, Recreation and Open Spaces; Regulatory and Economic Resources; Transportation and Public Works; and Water and Sewer.

Pursuant to Ordinance No. 16-73, this quasi-judicial matter may be submitted directly for placement on the Board's meeting agenda by the Director of the Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources.

A location sketch is attached to this memorandum as Exhibit A.

Legal description of the boundaries of the land are on file with the Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources.

Scope

This waiver of plat is located in Commission District 9, which is represented by Commissioner Kionne L. McGhee.

Delegation of Authority

There are no delegation requirements with this item.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

If this waiver of plat is approved, the fiscal impact to the County would be approximately \$50.00 annually for new drainage and sidewalk construction adjacent to the project. These costs would be covered by the Department of Transportation and Public Works' annual General Fund allocation.

The Development Services Division within the Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources administers the processing of plats and waivers of plat, and the person responsible for this function is Raul A. Pino, P.L.S.

- Zoning: PECUC.
- Proposed usage: Four single family residences.
- Number of parcels: Four.
- This waiver of plat meets concurrency.
- Available public water and sewer lines abut the proposed subdivision. The parcels are required to connect to public water and public sanitary sewers.



RESOLUTION APPROVING THE WAIVER OF PLAT OF HABITAT FOR HUMANITY OF GREATER MIAMI, D-24387, FILED BY HABITAT FOR HUMANITY OF GREATER MIAMI, LOCATED IN THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 32, TOWNSHIP 55 SOUTH, RANGE 40 EAST (BOUNDED ON THE NORTH BY SW 180 STREET, ON THE EAST APPROXIMATELY 190 FEET WEST OF SW 102 AVENUE, ON THE SOUTH BY SW 181 STREET, AND ON THE WEST APPROXIMATELY 220 FEET EAST OF SW 103 AVENUE)

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS Habitat for Humanity of Greater Miami, Inc., a Florida not-for-profit 501(c)3 corporation, has this day presented to this Board a waiver of plat of certain lands lying in Miami-Dade County, Florida, said waiver of plat of the property legally described as a portion of land lying and being in the Southwest 1/4 of Section 32, Township 55 South, Range 40 East, Miami-Dade County, Florida, and it appears that all requirements of law concerning said with,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that said waiver of plat is hereby approved; that the property has been found to be in compliance with Chapter 28, Subdivisions, of the Miami-Dade County Code; that approval of this waiver of plat is not a waiver of any zoning regulations; and that the requirements of the zoning existing on this land at the time this resolution is approved shall be enforced whether or not the various parcels on this waiver of plat conforms to those requirements.
