RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE WEEK OF SEPTEMBER 27, 2021, THROUGH OCTOBER 1, 2021, AS "STORMWATER AWARENESS WEEK"; URGING ALL RESIDENTS OF MIAMIDADE COUNTY AND LOCAL BUSINESSES TO HELP IMPROVE THE HEALTH OF BISCAYNE BAY AS WELL AS WATER QUALITY IN CANALS AND WATERWAYS BY KEEPING STORM DRAINS FREE OF DEBRIS AND POLLUTION

WHEREAS, rain can lead to stormwater, and stormwater that does not soak into the ground may in turn become runoff; and

WHEREAS, runoff may become polluted by a myriad of substances (including automotive fluids, fertilizers, pesticides, bacteria, sediments, litter, or pet waste) as the water runs along surfaces such as sidewalks, parking lots, roofs, or lawns; and

WHEREAS, runoff can flow into storm sewers that eventually lead into waterways such as canals, rivers, streams, lakes, beaches, and Biscayne Bay; and

WHEREAS, plants and soil can filter water and improve water quality; and

WHEREAS, onsite improvements, such as porous pavement, stormwater ponds, native plants, rain gardens, bioswales, and green infrastructure may help with pollution prevention in stormwater runoff; and

WHEREAS, the Miami-Dade County National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System ("NPDES") program promotes pollution prevention for our stormwater discharges; and

WHEREAS, by focusing attention on pollution prevention in stormwater runoff, Miami-Dade County—working with neighboring municipalities—will attempt to meet the challenges of environmental protection and environmental regulation; and **WHEREAS**, "Stormwater Awareness Week" is an opportunity for government, industry, and environmental organizations to recognize the potential of stormwater pollution prevention within our canals, waterways, and Biscayne Bay,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Recognizes the week of September 27, 2021, through October 1, 2021, as "Stormwater Awareness Week."

<u>Section 2.</u> Urges all residents of Miami-Dade County and local businesses to help improve the health of Biscayne Bay as well as water quality in canals and waterways by keeping storm drains free of debris and pollution.
