The Children's Trust consists of 33 members.

Further, section 2-1522 of the Code stipulates that seven members of The Children's Trust be appointed by the Governor from a list of candidates recommended by the Board. Section 2-1522 also requires the Board submit the names of at least three persons for each gubernatorial vacancy.

My name is Stacey E. Blau, and I am writing to express my strong interest in serving as a board member of the Children's Trust.

I am passionate about children's advocacy. I have been a guardian *ad litem* in the Eleventh Judicial Circuit of Florida since 2013, advocating for abused, neglected, and abandoned children.

I currently serve as a member of the Educational Council of Miami for the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), my alma mater, and am an alumna interviewer of undergraduate applicants to the school.

I previously served as a mentor for the Take Stock in Children program, which is focused on mentoring under-resourced youth and coaching them for college readiness. I mentored an incredible young woman from 2012 until her graduation from high school in 2017, I and have remained in touch with her through college (she recently completed her undergraduate studies at the University of Florida).

I was the vice president of fundraising for the Parent-Teacher Association (PTA) of Coconut Grove Elementary school from 2013 to 2015.

I also served as secretary on the board of the Miami chapter of the National Association of Women Business Owners (NAWBO) in 2012 and 2013.

I moved to Miami-Dade County in November 2010 and have lived here ever since. I currently reside with my family in the North Beach section of the City of Miami Beach.

Professionally, I work as a security specialist and co-own with my partner 5326 Consultants, Inc., a security and investigations firm based in Miami Beach. We specialize in security assessments, red teams, and complex investigations. We founded the company in October 2010 in Florida shortly before moving to Miami. I am the company's chief operating officer. Prior to starting this company, I worked as a defense contractor in Tampa and the Washington, DC metro areas. Before this, I served with the Central Intelligence Agency for just shy of ten years, mainly as an operations officer. I worked in the Washington, DC area and several posts overseas. I speak Polish and Russian well. I also speak some Spanish and French.

I attended MIT, completing my undergraduate studies in 1998 in mathematics with computer science. I grew up in Great Neck, New York and attended Great Neck South High School.

Why am I interested in serving as a board member of the Children's Trust? I am truly dedicated to children's advocacy am interested in a volunteer role that gives me an opportunity to make a larger positive impact on the lives of children and their families. My personal values compel me to volunteer and be an active participant in my community. I believe that my knowledge, abilities, and skills give me a strong background that will add value to the board of the Children's Trust.

My experience—particularly as a guardian *ad litem*, a TSIC mentor, and a parent of two schoolage children—has given me a window into a range of children, families, and their experiences in our community over many years. I have been amazed at the resiliency of many children and families in the face of hardship, and I have had the honor of collaborating with volunteers and professionals alike from various organizations who have dedicated themselves to helping children and families.

I do believe any entity must be an excellent steward of the resources with which it is entrusted. This is especially so for the Children's Trust because its mission to serve the interests of children and families is so critical and because it derives its funds through a tax of homeowners in Miami-Dade County.

As the allocation of resources to organizations is a major responsibility of the Children's Trust, I welcome the chance to participate in this important role. If given the privilege to serve on the board of the Children's Trust, I will bring both my passion for children's advocacy as well as a high level of rigor and scrutiny to my position.

This brief encounter inspired the creation of Mr. Octopus, a children's record, featuring an 8-year-old who performs on several of Kim's children's songs. After completing the song, she inspired to turn it into a story. The book *Seaper Powers, In Search for Bleu Jay's Treasure* began a series, now 5 books strong in hard copy, ebook and audio.

It has been my honor to be in service to The Children's Trust over the past three years, as an appointee of Governor Scott, approved by this Commission. My role on the Board in advancing the education, health and safety of all children in our community has been deeply meaningful, especially as we have faced the unprecedented challenges wrought by this pandemic.

As a full-time volunteer, Founder and Executive Director of the Lotus House Women's Shelter, located here in Miami and serving all of Miami-Dade County, I am deeply committed to the health, safety, and wellbeing of the children and families of our community. From the humblest of beginnings in 2004, Lotus House is now the largest women's shelter in the State of Florida and in the top five nationally. We have done so by working closely with leaders in business, finance, philanthropy, non-governmental organizations and government at all levels to provide sanctuary, support, education, tools and resources that empower women and children to improve the quality of their lives on every level, achieve greater self-sufficiency, and build safe, secure lives. In their dreams come true, we enrich our community with the fruit of their potential realized. To support this mission, Lotus House, also known as the Sundari Foundation, Inc., advocates on behalf of homeless women, youth and children to raise awareness of their special needs; inspire innovative, holistic solutions that truly break the cycle of childhood abuse, domestic violence and homelessness; and advances research and enlightened social policies for greater understanding, social inclusion and resources for homeless women and children. Since opening Lotus House, we have sheltered over 6,000 high special needs women, youth and children over the past fifteen years, empowering them to improve the quality of their lives on every level, with over 80% successfully exiting outside the shelter system. We are proud to say over 250 newborns, and counting, will someday call Lotus House their first home.

In late 2017, thanks to the generosity of our philanthropic community, including the Micky and Madeleine Arison Family Foundation, Norman and Irma Braman Charitable Foundation, Carnival Foundation, David and Leila Centner Family Foundation, Martin Z. Margulies, Royal Caribbean Cruise Lines, and Bank of American Foundation among many others. Lotus House found its new home in a new \$28 Million state-of-the-art, comprehensive homeless services facility, called Lotus Village because ~ it takes a village! In addition to expanding our capacity to serve over 500 women and children nightly, Lotus Village features a trauma informed, therapeutic children's wellness

Lotus Village was developed in response to having to turn away literally thousands of homeless women/youth and children every year. Now we have the capacity to shelter over 500 homeless women and children each night (1000+ annually) with emergency or transitional shelter and extensive support services. Despite the challenges of this pandemic, Lotus House remained at full capacity throughout and sheltered a record 1,354 women and children in 2020, with only 2% testing positive for COVID. We have our state of the art facilities, dedicated team, an enormous outpouring of grass roots community support and our government partners like Miami Dade County, Miami Dade Homeless Trust and The Children's Trust to thank for our health and safety.

Winner of the 2016 Non-Profit Innovation Award of the Greater Miami Chamber of Commerce and 2018 Project of the Year by the South Florida and Caribbean Urban Land Institute, Lotus Village is a center for innovation, education, research, dialogue and information sharing to end and prevent homelessness in our community and across this nation. Equally important, unlike most shelter systems, our work is deeply child centered. Lotus House children and families receive care in a supportive, enriched, and therapeutic environment with wraparound services including educational, and therapeutic mental health services. The Lotus House Therapeutic Mother-Child Program Research Project - with Florida International University as our partner and funded by The Children's Trust is the largest study of its kind in the nation - ensuring that the high special needs population of homeless mothers and children in our shelter receive much needed evidence-based assessments and therapeutic interventions most effective for their needs. This service driven research project increases access to behavioral health care for these high-risk. fragile families; strengthens the family environment; reduces child maltreatment; improves cognitive and emotional development of children; increases parenting skills; and increases the capacity of traumatized parents to nurture and appropriately care for their children. Ultimately, via these well-researched factors, the therapy modalities can lead to a more successful transition to adulthood for these children. The project offers parent child interaction therapy (PCIT) to children and their mothers, comparing PCIT with child parent dyadic psychotherapy (CPP currently provided at Lotus House), and trauma-focused cognitive behavioral therapy (TF-CBT) for children over 7 years (a small number at Lotus House) to ensure therapeutic services are data driven, optimized, and well tailored to meet the needs of the children and mothers served. Outside referrals (Early Steps, FDLRS) are made when needed. In addition, the assessments conducted to identify infant/child needs will yield highly valuable information of interest nationally about this population and its responsiveness to state-of-the art therapeutic services.

The latest research indicates that it is possible to break the cycle of childhood abuse, domestic violence and homelessness with life changing support, tools, education and resources that heal broken bodies, minds and spirits. Critical to this process is participation in trauma-focused group and individual counseling, comprehensive case management/service coordination and referrals for treatment of any mental illness. Over half those at Lotus House are children and more than 60% are impacted by physical, behavioral, emotional, developmental and/or learning disabilities. Approximately 2/3 of the children have 1 or more problems such as mental health issues (53%), developmental delays (30%), physical disabilities, vision, or hearing problems (6%), and chronic

health issues (21%). Lotus House is the only program in Miami-Dade exclusively sheltering homeless women, pregnant women, newborns, infants/toddlers, children, female youth and LBTQ women, elders and youth. Virtually all of those we serve have lived through major trauma, ranging from sexual abuse, physical abuse, psychological abuse and domestic violence to sex trafficking and other crimes. Our evidence-based and informed counseling, parenting and life skills programming in holistic and safe environment help women and their children heal from past trauma.

Because of my work over the past 16 years at Lotus House, I possess useful insights into the special needs of homeless and trauma-impacted newborns, infants/toddlers and children that are an asset to work of The Children's Trust Board. Since 2018, I have also been appointed by the Commission and serve on the Miami-Dade Domestic Violence Oversight Board, and in 2019 its Executive Committee, and I have chaired the DVOB Gaps and Needs Work Group for the past two years. With violence as a lead cause of homelessness for women and children, I am uniquely positioned to help bridge these three systems of care – homeless, domestic violence and children's needs - to ensure fragile children and families receive much needed services to help them heal, grow and thrive together. With a prior successful career in law, business and finance, I also bring those real world experiences, expertise and skills to The Children's Trust Board. My dedication to caring for this most disadvantaged group of children in our community has led me to seek re-appointment to The Children's Trust Board, to ensure the needs and interests of all children in our community are advanced.



I immigrated to Miami-Dade County from Haiti in 1983, so at the age of 12, I was introduced to a new way of life that included a culture of tenacity and resilience in what is known as the Melting Pot of the United States- Miami-Dade. As a teenager, I experienced first-hand the reality that unfortunately, many residents of Dade continue to wake up to on a daily basis. Having attended Miami Edison Senior High Schooling, living in high poverty, high crime areas helped me to garner a better understanding of the complex barriers faced by families. The epiphany that I had at an early age was that if parents and families, on a whole, are plagued with emotional, mental, social, and economic hardships, then children were certainly at the highest point of vulnerability and sufferings.

Having lived experiences like those in my community strengthened my resolve and fueled my mission to exemplify servant leadership. Consequently, in 2005, I incorporated Gang Alternative, Inc. (GA) as 501(c) (3) faith and community-based organization. What started out with unpaid volunteer staff and a budget of zero dollars, has now evolved to a learning organization with over 100 staff with an annual revenue of over \$12Mil. With over 30 programs, GA has led the way for other minority-led non-profit organizations in Dade to not only strive for, but to advocate for equality in opportunities for the county's most underserved communities. Since 2008, GA has consistently secured funding from The Children's Trust (TCT) or various positive youth development and strengthening programs including the UPLIFT Service Partnership, a network of over two dozen direct service providers in Miami-Dade County that GA convenes monthly to facilitate the provision of quality continuum of care for children and families. Currently, GA manages over \$3Mil in funding from TCT for the effective and efficient operation of five programs with a focus on Little Haiti, Little West River, El Portal, Miami Shores, North Miami, Florida City, and Homestead.

GA's mission is to build character that lasts and has been successfully doing this by enhancing the capacity at the micro and macro levels: being the individual child, his/her family, and the community in which he/she lives. GA designs and monitors programming from the community level. Our programs are not based on what we think communities need, but rather, on what the communities say that they need as documented in our annual community needs assessment.
