	RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MIAMI-DADE COUNTY	

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MIAMI-DADE COUNTY LESBIAN, GAY, BISEXUAL, TRANSGENDER, QUEER ("LGBTQ") ADVISORY BOARD TO TAKE ANY AND ALL NECESSARY STEPS TO JOIN THE ANTI-DEFAMATION LEAGUE'S FLORIDA HATE CRIME COALITION

WHEREAS, on May 5, 2020, this Board adopted Resolution No. R-423-20, which authorized Miami-Dade County to join the Anti-Defamation League's Florida Hate Crime Coalition ("FHCC") and directed the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to take any and all necessary steps to ensure that Miami-Dade County becomes a member of the FHCC; and

WHEREAS, the FHCC was established in 2016 with a mission to make Florida's hate crime law comprehensive by expressly providing for the inclusion of bias crimes committed because of physical disability, gender, or gender identity, as well as "association with" or "mixed motive" hate crimes, in Florida's hate crime law; and

**WHEREAS**, this Board adopted Resolution No. R-423-20 in furtherance of its belief that "diversity in our community is a source of strength and opportunity" and that the Board should be "committed to promoting tolerance, inclusion, and public safety"; and

WHEREAS, at the February 2, 2022 meeting of the Miami-Dade County Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer ("LGBTQ") Advisory Board, the LGBTQ Advisory Board voted unanimously to urge the Board of County Commissioners to authorize the LGBTQ Advisory Board to join the FHCC, as memorialized in the attached letter from Chairwoman Patricia Hernandez of the LGBTQ Advisory Board; and

WHEREAS, section 2-2405 of the Code of Miami-Dade County sets forth the powers and duties of the LGBTQ Advisory Board, and subsection (n) provides that the LGBTQ Advisory Board shall "perform such other duties as may from time to time be assigned to it by the Board of County Commissioners"; and

WHEREAS, according to the Florida Attorney General, hate crimes based on sexual orientation currently account for 22 percent of all hate crimes, surpassing religion as the second highest category; and

WHEREAS, the Human Rights Campaign Foundation, a national LGBTQ organization, in a report titled "An Epidemic of Violence 2021," concluded that 2021 was the deadliest year for transgender and gender non-conforming people in the U.S. on record with at least 50 transgender and gender non-conforming people killed, some of whom lived in Florida; and

WHEREAS, further, Equality Florida, a statewide LGBTQ organization, reported that when taking into account the size of the targeted communities, LGBT Floridians are at the highest risk of being targeted with a hate crime; and

WHEREAS, to promote safety, tolerance, and diversity in Miami-Dade County, this Board believes that LGBTQ Advisory Board membership on the FHCC would be invaluable; and WHEREAS, this Board wishes to authorize the LGBTQ Advisory Board to take all

necessary steps to join and become a member of the FHCC, which membership shall be at no cost,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board authorizes the Miami-Dade County Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer ("LGBTQ") Advisory Board to take any and all necessary steps to join the Anti-Defamation League's Florida Hate Crime Coalition ("FHCC"). This Board further authorizes the LGBTQ Advisory Board to select a board member to represent the LGBTQ Advisory Board on the FHCC.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Sally A. Heyman. It was offered by Commissioner , who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:

Dear Commissioner Heyman:

As the newly elected chairwoman of the Miami-Dade County LGBTQ Advisory Board (LGBTQ Board), it is a pleasure to be addressing you for the first time on behalf of the LGBTQ Board.

On February 2, 2022, our board held a general board meeting where the Board heard from Mr. Steve Atkins of the Miami-Dade Gay & Lesbian Chamber of Commerce, Mr. Eric Ross of the Florida Hate Crime Coalition, and Board member Orlando Gonzalez.

Mr. Adkins addressed the LGBTQ Board regarding The National Gay and Lesbian Chamber of Commerce (NGLCC) certification program, which was created as part of the NGLCC's LGBT Supplier Diversity Initiative. Mr. Adkins explained that when a business is NGLCC certified, it means that the business is at least 51% owned, operated, managed, and controlled by a person or persons who identify as part of the LGBT community, includina transgender and non-binary/gender non-conforming individuals, and who are either U.S. citizens or lawful permanent residents.

Mr. Eric Ross of the Florida Hate Crime Coalition provided information regarding the need and purpose of hate crime laws. Mr. Ross explained that hate crimes target victims simply for who they are and to the assailant all that matters is that the victim appears to be of a particular race, religion, or other group. Mr. Ross requested that the LGBTQ Board join the more than 340 members of the Florida Hate Crime Coalition, including several elected officials, law enforcement agencies, civil rights groups, and other non-profit organizations, in the Coalition's efforts to

ensure that anybody at risk of being victimized by a hate crime simply for who they are, what religion they practice, who they love, or what their national origin may be, are considered and covered under Florida's hate crime law. Joining the Florida Hate Crime Coalition is free of charge and allows the coalition to share the name of the LGBTQ Board as one of its members.

The LGBTQ Board also heard from fellow Board member Orlando Gonzales, who expressed the need for Miami -Dade County to include an LGBTQ services assessment survey for Fiscal Year 2023. This assessment will be useful in making policy recommendations where there are gaps in services to the LGBTQ community.

Based on the above presentations, in accordance with section 2-23.97 subsection (F) of the Miami-Dade Code, the Miami-Dade County LGBTQ Advisory Board voted unanimously to urge the Board of County Commissioners and the County Mayor to: 1) support the Miami-Dade County Gay and Lesbian Chamber of Commerce in its efforts to provide a list to the Miami-Dade County procurement office of local NGLCC certified businesses so that these businesses can be considered in outreach efforts and trainings on bidding for procurement contracts with Miami-Dade County; 2) authorize the LGBTQ Board to join the Florida Hate Crime Coalition; and 3) provide funding to the LGBTQ Board to participate or conduct an LGBTQ services assessment survey for Fiscal Year 2023.

Thank you for your kind consideration of these matters. We look forward to receiving your support, authorization, and comments regarding our urgings.
