Subject:	Appointment of Tropical Fruit Crop Representative to the Agricultural Practices Advisory Board

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) appoint Mark Philcox as the Tropical Fruit Crops representative to the Agricultural Practices Advisory Board (APAB) as recommended by the Florida Avocado Administrative Committee. Pursuant to Section 2-934 of the Code of Miami-Dade County (Code), members of the APAB serve fouryear terms commencing upon appointment by the Board.

Scope

The recommendations and actions of the APAB have a countywide impact.

Delegation of Authority

The proposed resolution does not delegate authority to the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

There is no fiscal impact to Miami-Dade County.

Track Record/Monitor

Jerry Bell, Assistant Director, Department of Regulatory and Economic Resources, Planning Division, monitors the Agricultural Practices Advisory Board.

Background

The APAB consists of 13 members representing a variety of agricultural industries:

- Two representatives from the Tropical Fruit Crops Industry of Miami-Dade County, one recommended by the Florida Avocado Committee, and one recommended by the Tropical Fruit Growers of South Florida, Inc.;
- Two representatives from the nursery industry, recommended by the Miami-Dade County Chapter of the Florida Nursery Growers & Landscape Association;
- Two representatives from the vegetable industry, recommended by the Dade County Farm Bureau;
- One representative of the aquaculture industry, recommended by the Ornamental Aquaculture Association of South Florida;
- One representative of a citizens' association supportive of agriculture, recommended by the Redland Citizens' Association;

- One representative of allied agribusiness recommended by the Dade AgriCouncil;
- One representative of agri-banking, agri-financial consulting, or agri-lending recommended by the Homestead-Florida City Chamber of Commerce;
- One representative of Farm Labor, recommended by Coalition of Florida Farmworkers Organizations;
- One representative of the South Dade Soil & Water Conservation District, recommended by the South Dade Soil & Water Conservation District; and
- One at large representative recommended by the Miami-Dade Agricultural Practices Advisory Board.

Section 2-935 of the Code requires that the Board fill vacancies occurring on the APAB. Pursuant to Section 2-933 of the Code, each designated organization shall submit, for Board review, at least one nominee for their vacant position(s), including the nominee's resume and the minutes of the organization's meeting at which the nominee was selected. The required documentation for Mr. Philcox is attached as Exhibit A.

Tropical Fruit Crops Industry Representative

Mr. Mark Philcox is the owner, President, and General Manager of Grove Services, Inc. of Miami located in Homestead, Florida. Mr. Philcox began his career with Grove Services in 1972 as a tractor operator and worked in various positions until 1984, when he and his wife purchased the company from the previous owner. He currently assists the University of Florida's Tropical Research and Education Center (UF/TREC) in harvesting and selling tropical fruits grown on TREC property. Mr. Philcox is a member of the Florida Avocado Administrative Committee and has served as Chairman for five years during his more than 20 years with the organization; he is a UF/TREC Advisory Board member of which he has served for more than 10 years; he is also the Director of the Florida Avocado Administrative Committee recommended Mr. Philcox's appointment at their June 9, 2021, meeting. Mr. Philcox's resume and the minutes of the meeting at which he was selected are attached as Exhibit A.
