**Subject:** **Status Report on FEMA Reimbursements for Hurricane Irma – Directive No. 182307**

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Pursuant to a Board directive, attached as Exhibit I is the January 2022 monthly report regarding the status of Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) reimbursements of County expenditures incurred in response to Hurricane Irma. In summary, of \$265 million expended, \$242 million has been obligated to date and \$203 million collected.

### ***Background***

On September 10, 2017, Hurricane Irma made landfall in South Florida. In anticipation of landfall, the President of the United States declared a Federal Emergency on September 4, 2017, which allowed Miami-Dade to seek Federal and State grants for reimbursement of actual hurricane-related expenditures. The County anticipates that it will incur about \$265 million of Hurricane Irma expenditures overall. These projected expenditures constitute 223 distinct projects as of January 31, 2022. As FEMA continues its review process, estimate and cost share allocations may change.

As of January 31, 2022, FEMA has obligated \$231 million in federal funding with \$11 million in state funding. FEMA and the State of Florida have actually paid \$203 million to the County.

<sup>(1)</sup> The projected expenditures consist of 223 distinct projects as of 01/31/22. As FEMA continues to review and estimate, cost share allocations may change.

<sup>(2)</sup> 14 projects have a Federal cost share of 92% because they participated in the Public Assistance Alternative Procedures Pilot Program for Debris Removal.

<sup>(3)</sup> As per Amendment No. 18 to Notice of a Major Disaster Declaration issued by FEMA on August 23, 2019, all projects for all categories were authorized to be amended to 90 percent of total eligible costs, except assistances previously approved at 100%.

<sup>(4)</sup> The \$2,012,883 (includes local match) and \$1,912,239 (excludes local match) consist of 3 projects - 35457, 37519, and 80941 - that have been submitted to FEMA and the State but that have not been obligated.

<sup>(5)</sup> 8 projects - 5204, 28919, 29346, 29768, 32888, 33197, 84275, and 136417 - were previously obligated by FEMA, but are undergoing additional rework so their status changed to 'Pending Obligation'. However, the State keeps them as 'Obligated' until FEMA makes a final determination.

<sup>(6)</sup> Obligated funds for 220 projects as of 01/31/22. The \$242,812,290 is comprised of \$231,665,316.14 in federal funding with \$11,146,975.89 in state funding.

<sup>(7)</sup> Payments received for 201 projects through 01/31/22

<sup>(8)</sup> Project 29346 is being re-worked for SOW and cost. FEMA estimates the new obligated amount to be \$2,175,092.81 (with \$2,088,089.10 in Federal and State funding) but the State has not increased the obligated amount from \$1,910,542.31 (\$1,834,120.62 in Federal and State funding) until FEMA makes its final determination.

<sup>(9)</sup> Project 136417 had a successful appeal and is being re-worked. FEMA estimates the new obligated amount to be \$17,424,854.68 (with \$16,553,611.95 in Federal and State funding) but the State has not increased the obligated amount from \$14,695,536.62 (with \$13,960,759.79 in Federal and State funding).

<sup>(10)</sup> Project 29768 was appealed and additional documentation was provided. FEMA estimates the new obligated amount to be \$5,524,119.98 (with \$5,207,155.18 in Federal and State funding) but the State has not increased the obligated amount from \$4,444,203.11 (\$4,266,434.99 in Federal and State funding) until FEMA makes its final determination.

<sup>(11)</sup> Project 5204 had a successful appeal/arbitration. FEMA estimates the new obligated amount to be \$10,723,119.60 but the State has not increased the obligated amount from \$5,606,247.71.

<sup>(12)</sup> Project 28919, which is obligated, has expenses being transferred to 164028, a Category C project that has been obligated.
