RESOLUTION URGING THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO APPROPRIATE FUNDING FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW WASTE-TO-ENERGY FACILITY IN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY

WHEREAS, the Miami-Dade County Resources Recovery Facility ("RRF"), located in Doral, Florida, began commercial operations in 1982 and was originally sited on 100 acres of land, including the adjacent ash fill; and

WHEREAS, the RRF was the keystone of Miami-Dade County's (the "County") solid waste system, operating 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, and resulting in an average annual processing of over 1,000,000 tons of waste produced in the County; and

WHEREAS, on February 12, 2023, a fire occurred at the RRF and, except for tire shredding, the RRF has remained inoperable since that date; and

WHEREAS, since the RRF fire, the County has faced significant challenges with respect to waste management as a result of the County's reduced ability to process solid waste; and

WHEREAS, on March 7, 2023, this Board adopted Resolution No. R-240-23, which (i) rescinded Resolution No. R-728-22, (ii) authorized the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to analyze and recommend siting alternatives for a new waste-to-energy ("WTE") facility to replace the RRF, (iii) directed the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to explore alternative technologies to a WTE facility, and (iv) directed the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to prepare a report regarding said analysis and recommendations, including costs and potential funding sources, within 90 days and to place the completed report on an agenda of the full Board without committee review pursuant to Rule 5.06(j) of the Board's Rules of Procedure; and

WHEREAS, on May 16, 2023, this Board adopted Resolution No. R-480-23, which amended Resolution No. R-240-23 to extend until September 13, 2023 the deadline for the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to provide to this Board the report and recommendations required by such resolution; and

WHEREAS, on August 18, 2023, the County Mayor issued a Report Related to the Development of an Integrated Solid Waste Management Plan in Miami-Dade County – A Combined Response to Directives 222097, 230509 and 230998 (the "Report"); and

WHEREAS, the Report contains 11 recommendations; and

WHEREAS, the Report recommended the creation of a solid waste campus including a new mass burn Waste-to-Energy ("WTE") facility capable of processing at least 4,000 tons of waste daily, to be sited on County-owned property located at the intersection of Krome Avenue and U.S. Route 27 and commonly referred to as Opa-Locka West Airport, and to not reopen the existing RRF; and

WHEREAS, while the specifics of the WTE facility are still being finalized, this Board is committed to developing a new solid waste campus to serve the residents of this County and convert waste to energy; and

WHEREAS, the new WTE facility will enable the County to meet its solid waste concurrency requirements and conserve landfill space for decades to come; and

WHEREAS, the development of a new WTE facility will require significant capital; and WHEREAS, on November 16, 2023, Senator Ana Maria Rodriguez (R – Doral) submitted Local Funding Initiative Request No. 1420 for Fiscal Year 2024-2025, which requested \$2,825,000.00 for the Miami-Dade Solid Waste Campus, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, this Board wishes to pursue all available funding for the development of a new WTE facility,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Urges the Florida Legislature to appropriate funding for the construction of a new waste-to-energy facility in Miami-Dade County.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Governor, the Senate President, the House Speaker, Senator Ana Maria Rodriguez (R – Doral), and the remaining Members of the Miami-Dade County State Legislative Delegation.

Section 3. Directs the County's state lobbyists to advocate for the action described in section 1 above, and authorizes and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to amend the 2024 State Legislative Package to include this item.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Juan Carlos Bermudez. It was offered by Commissioner , who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:

The funds will go towards air quality impact analysis and modeling testing and consultant preliminary design for the Miami-Dade Solid Waste Campus.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Miami-Dade Solid Waste Campus will host several waste management and landfill diversion technologies. The centerpiece of the campus will be a new, state-of-the-art, 4,000 tons per day mass burn waste-to-energy facility.
