RESOLUTION NO. _____

RESOLUTION URGING THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO
CODESIGNATE THAT PORTION OF STATE ROAD
997/KROME AVENUE/WEST 177TH AVENUE FROM
SOUTHWEST 8TH STREET TO THE ENTRANCE OF THE
MICCOSUKEE CASINO & RESORT AS “MICCO WAY”

WHEREAS, the history of the Miccosukee Tribe of Indians of Florida (the “Miccosukee”) predates Florida’s statehood; and

WHEREAS, the Miccosukee have over 600 tribal members and three reservation areas in Florida, including within the Tamiami Trail Reservation area; and

WHEREAS, the Tamiami Trail Reservation area, located west of the Miccosukee Casino & Resort, is the site of most Miccosukee operations and the center of the Miccosukee population; and

WHEREAS, the Miccosukee have made significant social, political, and economic contributions to Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, this Board wishes to honor the Miccosukee with a road codesignation on State Road 997/Krome Avenue/West 177th Avenue from Southwest 8th Street to the entrance of the Miccosukee Casino & Resort as “MICCO WAY” in unincorporated Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, because State Road 997/Krome Avenue/West 177th Avenue is a state road, the Florida Legislature must codesignate this road; and

WHEREAS, section 334.071, Florida Statutes, provides that the erection of markers for a state road codesignation shall be contingent upon the appropriate city or county commission passing a resolution in support of the particular honorary designation; and

WHEREAS, this proposed codesignation is located in County Commission District 12,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Urges the Florida Legislature to codesignate that portion of State Road 997/Krome Avenue/West 177th Avenue from Southwest 8th Street to the entrance of the Miccosukee Casino & Resort as “MICCO WAY”.

Section 2. Approves the codesignation of that portion of State Road 997/Krome Avenue/West 177th Avenue from Southwest 8th Street to the entrance of the Miccosukee Casino & Resort as “MICCO WAY”.

Section 3. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit certified copies of the resolution to the Governor, Senate President, House Speaker, the Chair and Members of the Miami-Dade State Legislative Delegation, the Secretary of the Florida Department of Transportation, the United States Postal Service, the Traffic Signals and Signs Division of the Department of Transportation and Public Works, and the Development Services Division of the Regulatory and Economic Resources Department.

Section 4. Directs the County’s state lobbyists to advocate for the action set forth in section 1 above and authorizes and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to amend the 2024 State Legislative Package to include this item.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Juan Carlos Bermudez. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
