RESOLUTION URGING THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO ADOPT SENATE BILL 194 OR SIMILAR LEGISLATION THAT WOULD (1) REQUIRE MOTOR VEHICLE REPAIR SHOPS TO REQUEST WRITTEN CRASH REPORTS FROM CUSTOMERS OR TO PREPARE REPAIR WORK TRANSACTION FORMS DETAILING COLLISION DAMAGE TO A CUSTOMER'S VEHICLE PRIOR TO PROVIDING OTHER SERVICES; (2) TRANSMIT SUCH REPAIR WORK TRANSACTION FORMS TO LAW ENFORCEMENT; AND (3) PROVIDE A CRIMINAL PENALTY FOR VIOLATIONS

WHEREAS, on October 12, 2023, Senator Joe Gruters (R – Sarasota) introduced Senate Bill ("SB") 194, entitled the "Lilly Glaubach Act," in honor of Lilly Glaubach, a 13-year-old who was killed in a hit-and-run car accident while riding her bicycle in 2022, for consideration during the 2024 session of the Florida Legislature; and

WHEREAS, SB 194 would require motor vehicle repair shops to request written crash reports from customers when a customer seeks the repair shop's services to restore a motor vehicle's damages from an accident or collision or, in the alternative and when a customer fails to provide a crash report, require motor vehicle repair shops to prepare an accident or collision "repair work transaction form" detailing the condition of the customer's vehicle if the vehicle was damaged in a collision or accident prior to providing other services such as preparing a written repair estimate; and

WHEREAS, SB 194 would also require motor vehicle repair shops to transmit such repair work transaction forms to law enforcement on a daily basis; and

WHEREAS, SB 194 provides that any person who violates the requirements of the bill commits a second-degree misdemeanor with up to 60 days imprisonment or a \$500.00 fine; and

WHEREAS, the Board supports legislation designed to increase transparency regarding the nature of a motor vehicle's condition prior to repair shops providing accident or collision damage restoration services,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Urges the Florida Legislature to adopt Senate Bill 194 or similar legislation that would (1) require motor vehicle repair shops to request written crash reports from customers or to prepare repair work transaction forms detailing collision damage to a customer's vehicle prior to providing other services; (2) require motor vehicle repair shops to transmit such repair work transaction forms to law enforcement; and (3) provide a criminal penalty for violations.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit certified copies of the resolution to the Governor, Senate President, House Speaker, Senator Joe Gruters, and the Chair and Members of the Miami-Dade State Legislative Delegation.

Section 3. Directs the County's state lobbyists to advocate for the action set forth in section 1 above and authorizes and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to amend the 2024 State Legislative Package to include this item.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Vice Chairman Anthony Rodríguez. It was offered by Commissioner , who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
