Subject: Extension of Grant Agreement with Catalyst Miami, Inc. and The Miami Foundation for
The Future Bound Miami Children's Savings Account Program

Executive Summary

This item seeks approval by the Board of County Commissioners (Board) of an amendment to the grant agreement with Catalyst Miami, Inc. ("Catalyst Miami") and The Miami Foundation, acting as the fiscal surrogate, to extend the contract term of the grant agreement for the Future Bound Miami, Children's Savings Accounts ("CSA") Program ("Program") until September 30, 2028, to allow time for the expenditure of all County funding provided to support the Program. It also seeks authority for the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute any future agreements or documents relating to the Program, including but not limited to extensions of the grant agreement beyond this contract term up to ten years or September 30, 2038, and amendments to provide any additional grant funds that may be allocated by the Board, and to exercise all provisions contained therein. The item provides for annual reporting to the Board for the length of the contract term, including any extensions thereof.

It's important to note, the CSA program provides Miami-Dade County Public School (M-DCPS) families with a free, long-term savings account for their child's college or postsecondary education, and as such, said account is accessible only to the child upon high school graduation, to help pay for postsecondary education.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board approve an extension of the grant agreement for the Program, in substantially the form attached as Exhibit 1 to the resolution, with Catalyst Miami and The Miami Foundation acting as the fiscal surrogate for four years, until September 30, 2028.

It also seeks authority for the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute any future agreements or documents relating to the Program, including but not limited to extensions of the grant agreement beyond this contract term up to ten years or September 30, 2038, and amendments to provide any additional grant funds that may be allocated by the Board and to exercise all provisions contained therein.

Scope

The scope of this item is countywide in nature.

Delegation of Authority

This item delegates authority to the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute an amendment to the grant agreement with Catalyst Miami, and The Miami Foundation, acting as fiscal surrogate, for the Program to extend the contract term of the grant agreement by four years, until September 30, 2028, and to exercise all provisions contained therein. It further authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute any future agreements or documents relating to the Program, and to exercise all provisions contained therein, including but not limited to amendments and extensions of the agreement for up to ten years, or September 30, 2038, based on sufficient progress being attained in the Program (i.e. activation of CSAs) and to account for, and subject to, future additional grant funds allocated by the Board.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

There is no fiscal impact to this item as all funds have been allocated in prior budget cycles and provided pursuant to the terms and conditions of the grant agreement, for a total of \$2,750,000 in County funds. Any future funds provided for the Program would be subject to allocation by the Board.

Track Record/Monitor

The Office of Management and Budget Assistant Director, Daniel T. Wall, will be responsible for monitoring compliance with all programmatic, fiscal, and administrative terms and conditions contained in this agreement.

Background

At the June 9, 2020, Community Disparities Subcommittee (“CDS”) meeting, members of the Board of County Commissioners (“Board”) heard a presentation about the Future Bound Miami program, a children’s savings account program designed to increase postsecondary education attainment. Future Bound Miami is the first universal CSA program in the State of Florida, but there are over 500,000 children in 34 other states participating in similar CSA programs. As part of the Program, upon entering kindergarten, each child automatically gains access to a no-fee savings account in their name at the South Florida Educational Federal Credit Union. The account is opened with an initial seed deposit of \$25, or \$50 for children who qualify for free and reduced lunch. Over time, the CSA grows through family contributions and earned incentives and helps children and their families build savings for the future.

The Program is led by Catalyst Miami, and managed through the Future Bound Miami Consortium, a non-legal entity that oversees and approves decisions guiding the CSA program. This consortium includes Catalyst Miami, The Children’s Trust, the United Way of Miami-Dade County, the Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS), the Miami Foundation, South Florida Educational Federal Credit Union (Edfed), Junior Achievement of Greater Miami, the City of Miami, and Sant La Haitian Neighborhood Center.

Future Bound Miami addresses the economic challenges facing Miami-Dade County and is a key strategy for achieving a vision of postsecondary attainment. The design team, which ultimately became the consortium assisting with the implementation of this program, settled on two program goals:

- *Educational Achievement*: increase postsecondary readiness among students in Miami-Dade County by fostering a postsecondary-bound identity that will help reduce the achievement gap among racial and socioeconomic groups.
- *Financial Capability*: help low and moderate wealth families lead healthier financial lives through financial education and sound savings habits among children and parents.

During the 2019-2020 school year, Future Bound Miami launched for 2,300 kindergarten students in 30 M-DCPS elementary schools within the City of Miami. In the 2021-2022 school year, with the funding provided by the County, the Program expanded to 78 schools across Miami-Dade County. That year, 295 accounts were activated (i.e. seeded with the initial \$25 or \$50), for a total of 1,480 activated CSAs. Based on the County’s continued support, the Program was able to exceed the initial 2023-2024 countywide expansion goal. In the 2022-2023 school year, the Program expanded to be available to all 16,300 kindergarteners in all 220 M-DCPS elementary and K-8 centers in the County with a cumulative total of CSAs for 7,584 students for all Program years.

Funding History:

On October 6, 2020, the Board approved Resolution No. R-1044-30, which authorized an initial allocation of \$500,000 from the CDS Reserve that was part of the FY 2019-2020 County budget to fund the expansion of the Program. The grant agreement was executed on August 16, 2021 (see Attachment A). On

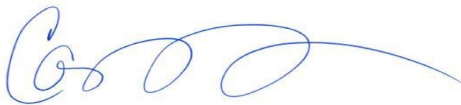
September 28, 2021, as part of the FY 2021-2022 budget, the Board allocated an additional \$1 million to the Program. A contract amendment adding these additional dollars to the original agreement was executed on April 12, 2022 (see Attachment B). On September 22, 2022, as part of the FY 2022-2023 budget, the Board allocated an additional \$1 million to the Program to ensure all eligible students would be able to open an account. A contract amendment adding these funds was executed on September 29, 2023 (see Attachment C). On September 21, 2023, as part of the FY 2023-2024 budget, the Board allocated an additional \$250,000 to the Program. A contract amendment adding these additional dollars to the original agreement was executed on February 7, 2024 (See Attachment D). The County has allocated \$2,750,000 to the Program to date.

The funding provided by the County for the Program can solely be used as seed deposit money and not for administrative, programmatic or indirect costs. As of December 14, 2023, \$525,650 of the County funds have been expended for the seed deposit money across the M-DCPS public schools. An expansion of the contract term is needed to provide time for the Program to expend these funds in the form of seed deposit money. Although the expanded contract term would expire on September 30, 2028, the grant agreement contains reporting requirements and other terms and conditions beyond the contract term, which will ensure monitoring of expenditures for the next decade. These requirements would be in place at least until October 2037, which is the high school graduation year for the kindergarten class of 2024 (the year the Program was anticipated to reach full expansion).

In addition to the funding received by the County, the Program receives funding from other organizations. In FY 2022-2023, the Program received funds and services from the following organizations:

- The Children's Trust - \$285,000 for program infrastructure and indirect costs;
- The City of Miami - \$120,000 for financial incentives for City of Miami residents to deposit into the accounts;
- United Way Miami - \$116,000 for financial supplements to school champions responsible for account activations at the school level;
- Jorge M. Perez Family Foundation - \$50,000 in unrestricted funds for program infrastructure and operations; and
- In-kind services are provided by EdFed, Junior Achievement of Greater Miami, M-DCPS, and Sant La Haitian Neighborhood Center.

**GRANT AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN
MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA
AND
CATALYST MIAMI, INC.
AND
THE MIAMI FOUNDATION, INC.**

This Grant Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into by and between Miami-Dade County, Florida, hereinafter referred to as "the County" or "Grantor," and Catalyst Miami, Inc., hereinafter referred to as the "Grantee," and The Miami Foundation, Inc., acting as a fiscal surrogate for Catalyst Miami, Inc., hereinafter referred to as the "Fiscal Surrogate", collectively referred to as the "parties."

WHEREAS, on October 8, 2020, the Miami-Dade Board of County Commissioners (the "Board") adopted Resolution No. R-1044-20 which approved the allocation of \$500,000.00 (the "Grant") to Grantee for the Future Bound Miami, Children's Savings Accounts Program (the "Program"); and

WHEREAS, as part of the Program, upon entering kindergarten, each child automatically gains access to a no-fee savings account in their name at the South Florida Educational Federal Credit Union; and

WHEREAS, the account is opened with an initial seed deposit of \$25, or \$50 for children who qualify for free and reduced lunch; and

WHEREAS, over time, the children's savings account grows through family contributions and earned incentives and helps children and their families build savings for the future; and

WHEREAS, the savings account is accessible only to the child upon high school graduation and for use to help pay for postsecondary education; and

WHEREAS, the Program is being implemented by a regional consortium which is responsible for overseeing and approving the decisions guiding the children's savings accounts program; and

WHEREAS, membership of the consortium includes Catalyst Miami, Inc., The Children's Trust, the United Way of Miami-Dade County, the Miami-Dade County Public Schools ("M-DCPS"), the Miami Foundation, the Health Foundation of South Florida, the South Florida Educational Federal Credit Union, Junior Achievement of Greater Miami, and Sant La Haitian Neighborhood Center; and

WHEREAS, during the 2019-2020 school year, Future Bound Miami launched for 2,300 kindergarten students in 30 M-DCPS elementary schools within the City of Miami; and

WHEREAS, the Program has a goal of expanding to a countywide M-DCPS program by the 2023-2024 school year, reaching approximately 23,000 kindergarten students once the Program is at scale; and

WHEREAS, the Grant is being provided for the purpose of expanding the Program into a countywide M-DCPS program, and into 98 additional elementary schools in the County (“expanded Program”), and

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Grant Purpose.** The above recitals are incorporated herein by reference. The purpose of the Grant is to expand the Children’s Savings Accounts (“CSA”) Program beyond the City of Miami and into a countywide M-DCPS expanded Program. Grant funds shall be used solely as seed deposit money for the expansion of the CSAs and shall not be used for administrative or programmatic or indirect costs. The Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate shall render services in accordance with the Scope of Work, incorporated herein and attached hereto as Attachment A. The Grantee and Fiscal Surrogate agrees that all expenditures or costs shall be made in accordance with the eligible use of grant funds listed below in Section 3.
- 2. Amount Payable.** The maximum provisional amount payable for services rendered under this Agreement shall not exceed \$500,000.00.
- 3. Eligible Use of Grant Funds.** Grant funds shall be used exclusively as initial seed deposits in the CSAs in the expanded Program. No administrative, programmatic, or indirect costs may be attributed to these funds.
- 4. Payment of Grant and Accounting for Grant Funds.** All funds will be issued to the Fiscal Surrogate within sixty (60) calendar days of a written request for funding issued on company letterhead. The Grantee and Fiscal Surrogate agree that Grant funds shall be transferred to, and be administered from, a separate account and shall continuously be held, tracked, and administered from such separate account for the duration of this Agreement or for the duration of the expenditure of the Grant funds, whichever occurs later in time, and in accordance with the purposes and restrictions set forth in this Agreement.
- 5. Payment Recapture.** Should the Program be unable to fully utilize all dollars allocated herein for the purpose described herein by September 30, 2024, the unallocated funds shall be returned to the County.
- 6. Length of Agreement.** This Grant Agreement shall be effective as of the date of last signature and shall expire on September 30, 2024, unless earlier terminated or extended pursuant to the terms of this Agreement. Certain provisions of this Agreement, as specified herein, shall survive the expiration of this Agreement.
- 7. Contract Administration.** The parties are legally bound by the requirements of this Agreement. The parties’ respective grant managers, named below, will be responsible for monitoring their performance under this Agreement, and will be the official contact for their organization. Any notice(s) or other communications regarding this Agreement shall be directed to or delivered to the other party's grant manager by utilizing the information below. Any change in the contact information below should be submitted in writing to the grant manager within 10 days of the change.

8. Required Information Needed with Return of Signed Agreement. Prior to the disbursement of Grant funds, the Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate must provide the following with the return of the signed Agreement.

- a. A copy of the Grantee and Fiscal Surrogate's Florida Substitute Form W-9;
- b. Electronic funds transfer information; and
- c. Attachment A: Scope of Work

9. Marketing and Promotion. It is understood and agreed between the parties hereto that this Program is funded, in part, by Miami-Dade County. By the acceptance of the Grant funds, the Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate agrees that events funded by this Agreement shall recognize and adequately reference the County as a funding source. The Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate, as appropriate, shall ensure that all publicity, public relations, advertisements and signs recognize and reference the County for its support of the Program. This is to include, but is not limited to, all posted signs, pamphlets, wall plaques, cornerstones, dedications, notices, flyers, brochures, news releases, media packages, promotions, and stationery. The use of the official County logo is permissible for the publicity purposes stated herein and must adhere to the standards established at <https://www.miamidade.gov/branding/logo.asp>. The Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate, as appropriate, shall submit sample or mock up of such publicity or materials to the County for review and prior approval, which shall not be unreasonably withheld. The Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate, as appropriate, shall ensure that all media representatives, when inquiring about the activities funded by this contract, are

informed that the County is a funding source. The Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate, as appropriate, agrees to use commercially reasonable efforts to send out periodic press releases and other public announcements on a County-wide basis promoting the Program.

The provisions of Article 9. Marketing and Promotion shall survive the termination or expiration of this Agreement.

10. Grant Reporting Requirements. The Grantee shall submit to the County's OMB Assistant Director, on an annual basis, a summary report detailing the activity of the expanded Program and the expenditure of the Grant funds. Such report shall include, at a minimum, the following information: (i) which schools received Grant funds and when; (ii) how many children from each school received the seed deposit Grant funds and when their accounts were activated (including identifying number of children on free and reduced lunch); (iii) the number of families with activated accounts; (iv) the number of families that deposited funds into accounts; (v) the total amount of funds deposited into accounts; (vi) the number of training sessions held for teachers and administrators on the financial literacy content and the program overview; (vii) the number of teachers and administrators engaged in training; (viii) the number of engagement activities held for students and/families and the number of participants who attended; (ix) the number of inquiries made by families on the expanded Program; and (x) the number of students who ultimately utilized the funding on post-secondary education.

- a. **First Project Progress Report** is due by October 2021 with subsequent reports due by October of each subsequent year until the high school graduation of the Kindergarten class of 2024, or October 2037.
- b. **Additional Reports.** At the request of the County, the Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate agrees to provide the County with status updates on the progress of the expanded Program.

The provisions of Article 10. Grant Reporting Requirements shall survive the termination or expiration of this Agreement.

11. Retention of Accounting Records. The Grantee and Fiscal Surrogate must keep accurate and complete books and records for all receipts and expenditures arising out of or relating to the expanded Program in conformance with reasonable general accounting standards. Notwithstanding Florida's Public Records Act, financial records, supporting documents, statistical records, and all other records including electronic storage media pertinent to the expenditure of the Grant funds shall be retained for at least a period of sixteen (16) years after payment of the Grant. If any litigation or audit is initiated, or claim made, before the expiration of the five-year period, the records shall be retained until the litigation, audit, or claim has been resolved.

12. Florida Public Records Act. As it relates to this Agreement and the Grant funds provided herein, the Grantee and Fiscal Surrogate, pursuant to section 119.0701, Florida Statutes, shall:

- a. Keep and maintain public records that ordinarily and necessarily would be required by the County in order to perform its obligations under this Agreement.

- b. Upon request from the County's custodian of public records identified herein, provide the County with a copy of the requested records or allow the public with access to public records on the same terms and conditions that the County would provide the records and at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided in the Florida Public Records Act, Miami-Dade County Administrative Order No. 4-48, or as otherwise provided by law.
- c. Ensure that public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of this Agreement's term and following completion of the obligations under this Agreement if the Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate does not transfer the records to the County.
- d. Meet all requirements for retaining public records and transfer to the County, at no cost to County, all public records created, received, maintained and/or directly related to the performance of this Agreement that are in possession of the Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate upon termination of this Agreement. Upon termination of this Agreement, the Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate shall destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements, except to the extent prohibited by record retention requirements applicable to federal credit unions.

For purposes of this Section, the term "public records" shall mean all documents, papers, letters, maps, books, tapes, photographs, films, sound recordings, data processing software, or other material, regardless of the physical form, characteristics, or means of transmission, made or received pursuant to law or ordinance or in connection with the transaction of official business of the County. Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate's failure to comply with the public records disclosure requirement set forth in Section 119.0701 of the Florida Statutes shall be a breach of this Agreement. In the event the Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate does not comply with the public records disclosure requirements set forth in Section 119.0701 of the Florida Statutes and this Section of this Agreement, the Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate shall be responsible for indemnifying the County in any resulting litigation. Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate's obligations under this Section of this Agreement shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

13. Independent Private Sector Inspector General Reviews and Rights of Access. Pursuant to Miami-Dade County Administrative Order 3-20, the County has the right to retain the services of an Independent Private Sector Inspector General (“IPSIG”), whenever the County deems it appropriate to do so. Subject to all applicable laws, upon written notice from the County, Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate shall make available to the IPSIG retained by the County all requested records and documentation pertaining to this Agreement for inspection and reproduction. Nothing contained in this provision shall impair any independent right of the County to conduct an audit or investigate the operations, activities and performance of Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate in connection with, and as and when provided under, this Agreement.

The County shall maintain rights of access to review and monitor all books and records of the Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate and all partners as it relates to the Agreement.

14. Miami-Dade County Inspector General Review. According to Section 2-1076 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida, as amended by Ordinance No. 99-63, the County has established the Office of the Inspector General which may, on a random basis, perform audits on all County contracts, throughout the duration of said contracts, except as otherwise provided below. The audit cost shall be assumed by the County, and Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate shall have no liability to pay the cost therefore.

- a. Nothing contained above shall in any way limit the powers of the Miami-Dade County Inspector General to perform audits on all County contracts, provided that neither the Miami-Dade County Inspector General nor IPSIG shall be entitled to receive, review or copy any documents that are privileged, confidential or proprietary to Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate. The Miami-Dade County Inspector General is authorized and empowered to review past, present and proposed County contracts, transactions, accounts, records and programs. In addition, the Miami-Dade County Inspector General has the power to subpoena witnesses, administer oaths, require the production of records and monitor existing projects and programs, all at no cost or expense to Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate. The Miami-Dade County Inspector General is empowered to retain, at no expense or cost to Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate, the services of an IPSIG to, subject to all Applicable Laws, audit, investigate, monitor, oversee, inspect and review operations, activities, performance and procurement processes, including but not limited to project design, specifications, proposal submittals, activities of Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate, its officers, agents and employees, lobbyists, County staff and elected officials to ensure compliance with the Agreement and to detect fraud and corruption.
- b. Subject to all Applicable Laws and the terms and conditions herein, upon written notice to Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate from the Inspector General or IPSIG retained by the Inspector General, Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate shall make all requested records and documents available to the Inspector General or IPSIG for inspection and copying, at no cost or expense to Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate. The Inspector General and IPSIG shall have the right to inspect and, at no cost or expense to Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate, copy all such documents

and records in the Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate's possession, custody or control which, in the Inspector General's or IPSIG's sole judgment, pertain to performance of the Agreement.

15. Accounting Requirements. The Grantee and/or fiscal surrogate, as appropriate, must maintain an accounting system that provides a complete record of the use of all Grant funds as follows:

- a) The accounting system must be able to specifically identify and provide audit trails that trace the receipt, maintenance, and expenditure of Grant funds.
- b) The accounting records must have effective control over and accountability for all Grant funds, property, and other assets.
- c) Accounting records must be supported by source documentation and be in sufficient detail to allow for a proper pre-audit and post-audit (such as invoices, bills, and canceled checks).

16. Independent Contractor Status of Grantee. The Grantee and Fiscal Surrogate agree that its officers, agents and employees, in performance of this Agreement, shall act in the capacity of independent contractors and employees of Grantee or Fiscal Surrogate, as appropriate, and not as officers, agents, or employees of the County.

17. Liability and Indemnification. The County will not assume any liability for the acts, omissions to act, or negligence of the Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate, its agents, servants, employees, or subcontractors; nor may the Grantee exclude liability for its own acts, omissions to act, or negligence, to the County.

Grantee and Fiscal Surrogate shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the County and its officers, employees, agents, and instrumentalities from any and all liability, losses, or damages, including attorney's fees and costs of defense, which the County or its officers, employees, agents, or instrumentalities may incur as a result of claims, demands, suits, causes of actions or proceedings of any kind or nature arising out of, relating to, or resulting from the performance of this Agreement by the Grantee and Fiscal Surrogate or its respective employees, agents, servants, partners principals, or subcontractors. Additionally, Grantee and Fiscal Surrogate shall pay all claims and losses in connection therewith and shall investigate and, at the option of the County, defend all claims, suits, or actions of any kind or nature in the name of the County, where applicable, including appellate proceedings, and shall pay all costs, judgments, and attorney's fees which may issue thereon. Grantee and Fiscal Surrogate expressly understands and agrees that any insurance protection required by this Agreement or otherwise provided by Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate shall in no way limit the responsibility to indemnify, keep, and save harmless and defend the County or its officers, employees, agents, and instrumentalities as herein provided.

Neither the County nor any agency or subdivision of the state waives any defense of sovereign immunity, or increases the limits of its liability, by entering into this Agreement.

The provisions of Article 17. Liability and Indemnification shall survive the termination or expiration of this Agreement.

18. Strict Compliance with Laws. The Grantee and Fiscal Surrogate shall perform all acts required by this Agreement in strict conformity with all applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations, including but not limited to conducting applicable background screenings.

19. No Discrimination. The Grantee and Fiscal Surrogate may not discriminate against any employee employed under this Agreement, or against any applicant for employment because of race, religion, gender, national origin, age, handicap or marital status.

20. Breach of Agreement. If the Grantee, Fiscal Surrogate, or its respective subcontractors fails to fulfill its obligations herein, improperly expends or manages Grant funds, fails to provide reports required by this Agreement, fails to prepare, preserve or surrender records required by this Agreement, or otherwise violates this Agreement or fails to materially conform with any of the provisions of the Agreement or its attachments referenced herein, the Grantee and Fiscal Surrogate shall be in breach of this Agreement, and the County may demand the return of any or all of the Grant funds already provided, withhold subsequent payments, and/or terminate this Agreement in accordance with the provisions of Section 21 below.

21. Termination of Agreement. In the event the Grantee or Fiscal Surrogate breach this Agreement, the County shall provide the Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate a notice of such violation by letter and may, in the County's sole discretion, give the Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate fifteen (15) calendar days from the date of receipt of such letter to cure the violation. If the violation is not cured within the stated period, the County may terminate this Agreement. The notice of violation letter shall be delivered to the Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate's Contract Manager, personally, electronically, and/or mailed to his/her specified address by a method that provides proof of receipt. In the event that the Agreement is terminated, the County shall have no further obligation to the Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate under this Agreement. Additionally, any Grant funds previously advanced and not encumbered (i.e. distributed to the CSAs as part of the expanded Program) in accordance with this Agreement shall be returned to the County, with any accumulated interest, within thirty (30) days after termination of this Agreement. Notwithstanding the return of Grant funds under this Section, the County does not waive any of its rights to pursuing any additional remedies which may be available to it under the law.

22. Preservation of Remedies. No delay or omission to exercise any right, power, or remedy accruing to either party upon breach or violation by either party under this Agreement, shall impair any such right, power or remedy of either party; nor shall such delay or omission be construed as a waiver of any such breach or default, or any similar breach or default.

23. Non-Assignment of Agreement. The Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate may not assign, sublicense or otherwise transfer its rights, duties, or obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the County, which consent shall not unreasonably be withheld. The agreement transferee must demonstrate compliance with the requirements of the Program. If the County approves a transfer of the Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate's obligations, the Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate

shall remain liable for all work performed and all expenses incurred in connection with this Agreement.

24. Parties in Interest; Limitation on Rights of Others. The terms of this Agreement shall be binding upon, inure to the benefit of and be enforceable solely by the parties and their permitted successors and assigns, and nothing in this Agreement or by virtue of the transactions contemplated hereby, whether express or implied, shall be construed to constitute, create, or confer rights, remedies, or claims in or upon any person (as third-party beneficiary or otherwise) not a party hereto, or to create obligations or responsibilities of the parties to such persons, or to permit any person other than the parties and their respective successors and assigns to rely upon or enforce the covenants, conditions, and agreements contained herein.

25. Binding of Successors. This Agreement shall bind the successors, assigns, and legal representatives of the Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate and of any legal entity that succeeds to the obligations of the Grantee and/or Fiscal Surrogate.

26. Severability. If any term or provision of the Agreement is found to be illegal and unenforceable, the remainder will remain in full force and effect, and such term or provision shall be deemed stricken.

27. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be construed, performed, and enforced in all respects in accordance with the laws and rules of the State of Florida. Venue or location for any legal action arising under this Agreement will be in Miami-Dade County, Florida.

28. Expenses. Each Party shall bear its own expenses in connection with the negotiation and preparation of this Agreement, and the performance of all of its obligations under this Agreement.

29. Entire Agreement. This Agreement and its schedules, exhibits and appendices constitute the entire agreement of the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersede all prior written and oral agreements and understandings with respect to such subject matter. Neither this Agreement nor any of the terms hereof may be amended, supplemented, waived or modified orally. All such amendments, supplements, waivers and modifications must be in writing signed by the party against which the enforcement of the amendment, supplement, waiver or modification shall be sought.

30. Headings. Any heading preceding the text of the several sections of this Agreement shall be solely for convenience of reference and shall not affect the meaning, construction or effect of this Agreement. In the event of any conflict between any such heading and the text thereunder, the text shall control.

31. Attachments. This Agreement and Attachments, with its recitals on the first page of the Agreement and with its attachments as referenced below contain all the terms and conditions agreed upon by the parties:

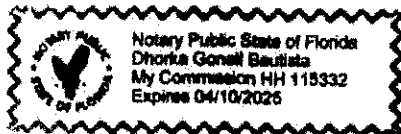

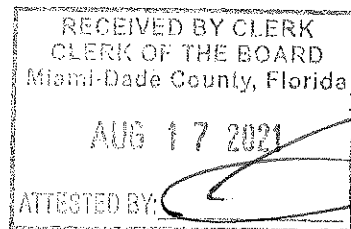

Over time, the children's savings account grows through family contributions and earned incentives and helps children and their families build savings for the future. The savings account is accessible only to the child upon high school graduation and to help pay for postsecondary education.

This funding fund is being allocated to allow for the expansion of the Future Bound Miami, children's savings accounts program, beyond the City of Miami and into a countywide program by 2024.

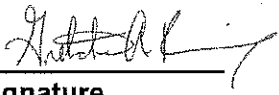
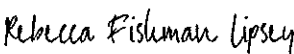

Miami-Dade County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, by and through its Office of Management and Budget – Grants Coordination division located at 111 N.W. 1st Street, 22nd Floor, Miami, FL 33128 (hereinafter “the County” “OMB-GC” or “OMB” or “Grantor”), and Catalyst Miami, Inc. (hereinafter “Grantee”), and The Miami Foundation, Inc., acting as a fiscal surrogate for Catalyst Miami, Inc. (hereinafter “Fiscal Surrogate”), collectively referred to as the “parties”, hereby agree on this 12th day of April, 2022 to amend the Grant Agreement (Contract MFND-FBM21) dated August 17, 2021, between the parties (hereinafter called “the Agreement”) and therefore makes the following recitals.

WHEREAS, the Agreement relates to a grant for the Future Bound Miami, Children's Savings Accounts Program (the “Program”);

WHEREAS, at the final FY 2021-2022 budget hearing on September 28, 2021, the Miami-Dade Board of County Commissioners (the “Board”) approved an additional allocation of \$1,000,000.00 to Grantee for the Program;

WHEREAS, the Agreement allows for amendment in writing by written consent of the parties;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants recorded herein and made part of this Amendment, the County, the Grantee, and the Fiscal Surrogate agree to amend the Agreement as follows:

- I. The “whereas” clauses above are fully incorporated and adopted herein as if fully set forth herein.

This Amendment #1 shall be effective once it has been signed by all parties and shall expire on September 30, 2024, unless earlier terminated or extended pursuant to the terms of this Agreement.

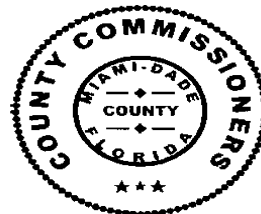

Through the Future Bound Miami program, upon entering kindergarten, each child enrolled in Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS) automatically gains access to a no-fee savings account in their name at the South Florida Educational Federal Credit Union, which will be opened with an initial seed deposit of \$25, or \$50 for students who are eligible for free/reduced lunch. Over time, the children's savings account grows through family contributions and earned incentives and helps children and their families build savings for the future. The savings account is only accessible to the child upon high school graduation and is to be utilized to help pay for postsecondary education.

This funding is being allocated to allow for the expansion of the Future Bound Miami, children's savings accounts program, beyond the City of Miami and into a countywide program by 2024.

All schools will have a school employee assigned to be a Future Bound Miami champion whose role will be to make sure the program is publicized to all kindergarten parents. The program will make sure that all Future Bound Miami Champions are properly trained and provided with promotional and marketing materials to share with all kindergarten parents. The marketing materials will include an opt-in registration form that all parents must submit back to the school to ensure program participation. After the account activation period ends, parents will receive online access to the Future Bound Miami account and will be able to begin saving for their child's future.

3.2 - How will your organization provide continuous quality control of this program, including its staff and operations?

A Regional Consortium, as opposed to a single organization, leads the implementation of Future Bound Miami and will assist in providing quality control of this program. This consortium acts as a formal advisory board responsible for overseeing and approving the decisions guiding the Future Bound Miami program, ensuring that each decision is guided by a community-wide vision for all of Miami-Dade's children.

Participation in the consortium is formalized by each organization signing a joint agreement delineating membership criteria, roles, and the responsibilities of each organization. Furthermore, the consortium developed a number of working groups with the intent of spreading different duties and responsibilities across all members.

The agreements/contracts workgroup is responsible for ensuring that all contracts and MOUs are drafted, reviewed, and approved by the members of the consortium, as well as third-party vendors. We have completed and executed agreements with a majority of the consortium partners and we are finalizing our contracts with third-party vendors.

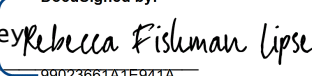
ATTACHMENT A-1 - SCOPE OF WORK

**AMENDMENT #2
TO THE GRANT AGREEMENT BETWEEN
MIAMI-DADE COUNTY,
CATALYST MIAMI, INC.,
AND
THE MIAMI FOUNDATION, INC.**

Miami-Dade County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, by and through its Office of Management and Budget – Grants Coordination division located at 111 N.W. 1st Street, 22nd Floor, Miami, FL 33128 (hereinafter “the County” “OMB-GC” or “OMB” or “Grantor”), and Catalyst Miami, Inc. (hereinafter “Grantee”), and The Miami Foundation, Inc., acting as a fiscal surrogate for Catalyst Miami, Inc. (hereinafter “Fiscal Surrogate”), collectively referred to as the “parties”, hereby agree on this 29 day of Sept., 2023 to amend the Grant Agreement (Contract MFND-FBM21) dated August 17, 2021, between the parties (hereinafter called “the Agreement”) and therefore makes the following recitals.

WHEREAS, the Agreement relates to a grant for the Future Bound Miami, Children’s Savings Accounts Program (the “Program”);

WHEREAS, at the final FY 2022-2023 budget hearing on September 20, 2022, the Miami-Dade Board of County Commissioners (the “Board”) approved an additional allocation of \$1,000,000.00 to Grantee for the Program;

WHEREAS, the Agreement allows for amendment in writing by written consent of the parties;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants recorded herein and made part of this Amendment, the County, the Grantee, and the Fiscal Surrogate agree to amend the Agreement as follows:

- I. The “whereas” clauses above are fully incorporated and adopted herein as if fully set forth herein.
- II. **ARTICLE 2. Amount Payable.** is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following language:

The maximum provisional amount payable for services rendered under this Agreement shall not exceed \$2,500,000.00 (“Program funds” or “Grant funds”), which is inclusive of the initial award of \$500,000.00 in the Agreement, the \$1,000,000.00 allocation to the Program approved by the Board in the fiscal year 2021-2022 budget and reflected in Amendment # 1, and an additional \$1,000,000.00 allocation to the Program as approved by the Board on September 20, 2022.

- III. **ARTICLE 3. Eligible Use of Grant Funds** is hereby amended by removing the strikethrough language and adding the underlined language, as shown below.

Grant funds shall be used exclusively for a public purpose as initial seed deposits in the CSAs in the expanded Program. No administrative, programmatic, legal, or other indirect costs may be attributed to these Program funds.

"Initial seed deposits" means the first \$25, or \$50 for students who are eligible for free/reduced lunch, deposit into activated CSAs.

"Expanded Program" means the expansion of the Program into M-DCPS schools outside of the City of Miami kindergarten schools.

- IV. **ARTICLE 4. Payment and Accounting of Grant Funds** is hereby amended by removing the strikethrough language and adding the underlined language, as shown below.

All Undistributed funds will be issued to the Fiscal Surrogate within sixty (60) calendar days of a written request for funding issued on company letterhead. The Grantee and Fiscal Surrogate agree that Grant funds shall be transferred to, and be administered from, a separate account and shall continuously be held, tracked, and administered from such separate account for the duration of this Agreement or for the duration of the expenditure of the Grant funds, whichever occurs later in time, and in accordance with the purposes and restrictions set forth in this Agreement. Any and all accrued interest on Program funds shall be considered Program funds and subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

- V. **ARTICLE 5. Payment Recapture** is hereby amended by removing the strikethrough language and adding the underlined language, as shown below.

Should the Program be unable to fully utilize all Grant funds ~~dollars~~ allocated herein for the purpose described herein by September 30, 2024, the unallocated funds shall be returned to the County.

Such report shall include, at a minimum, the following information: (i) which schools are participating in the Program, broken down by school year ~~received Grant funds and when~~; (ii) for each school participating in the Program, and for each school year, the number of how many children from each school that activated their accounts, i.e. received the seed deposit Grant funds, date and when their accounts were activated, and (including identifying number of children on free and reduced lunch) whose accounts were activated; (iii) for funds obtained from sources other than Grant funds, the same information as in (ii) ~~the number of families with activated accounts~~; (iv) the number of families that deposited funds into the activated accounts; (v) the total amount of funds deposited into the activated accounts; (vi) the number of training sessions held for teachers and administrators on the financial literacy content and the program overview, for each school year; (vii) the number of teachers and administrators engaged in training, including the name and contact information for each employee assigned to be a Future Bound Miami champion; (viii) the number of engagement activities held for students and/families, for each school year, the dates of activities, and the number of participants who attended; (ix) the number of inquiries made by families on the expanded Program; and (x) the number of students who ultimately access the funds upon graduation and utilized the funding on post-secondary education.

- IX. **ARTICLE 31. - X. **ARTICLE 32. E-Verify.** Shall be added to the contract agreement with the following terms: By entering into this Contract, the Grantee/Contractor and its Subcontractors (if applicable) are jointly and severally obligated to comply with the provisions of Section 448.095, Florida Statutes, as amended, titled "Employment Eligibility." The Grantee/Contractor affirms that (a) it has registered and uses the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify system to verify the work authorization status of all new employees of the Contractor; (b) it has required all Subcontractors to this Contract to register and use the E-Verify system to verify the work authorization status of all new employees of the Subcontractor; (c) it has an affidavit from all Subcontractors to this Contract attesting that the Subcontractor does not employ, contract with, or subcontract with, unauthorized aliens; and (d) it shall maintain copies of any such affidavits for duration of the Contract.

If County has a good faith belief that Grantee/Contractor has knowingly violated Section 448.09(1), Florida Statutes, then County shall terminate this contract in accordance with Section 448.095(5)l, Florida Statutes. In the event of such termination the Grantee/Contractor agrees and acknowledges that it may not be awarded a public contract for at least one (1) year from the date of such termination and that Grantee/Contractor shall be liable for any additional costs incurred by the County because of such termination.

In addition, if County has a good faith belief that a Subcontractor has knowingly violated any provisions of Sections 448.09(1) or 448.095, Florida Statutes, but Grantee/Contractor has otherwise complied with its requirements under those statutes, then Grantee/Contractor agrees that it shall terminate its contract with the Subcontractor upon receipt of notice from the County of such violation by Subcontractor in accordance with Section 448.095(5)l, Florida Statutes.

Any challenge to termination under this provision must be filed in the Circuit or County Court by the County, Contractor, or Subcontractor no later than twenty (20) calendar days after the date of contract termination. Public and private employers must enroll in the E-Verify System (<http://www.uscis.gov/e-verify>) and retain the I-9 Forms for inspection.

- XI. **ARTICLE 33. Background Screenings.** Shall be added to the contract agreement with the following terms: Where applicable, Provider agrees to comply with all federal, state, and local laws, regulations, ordinances, and resolutions regarding any and all background screenings of its employees, volunteers, subcontractors, and independent contractors, including, but not limited to: Florida Statutes, Chapters 39, 393, 394, 397, 402, 408, 409, 413, 429, 430, 435, 775, 782, 787, 800, 826, 827, 943, 984, 985, 1012; Sections 26-37 through 26-39, 2-8.6.5, and 8A-281 through 8A-287 of the Code of Miami-Dade County; Titles 58, 59, 63 and 65 of the Florida Administrative Code. Provider's failure to comply with any applicable laws, regulations, ordinances and resolutions regarding background screening is grounds for a material breach and termination of this contract at the sole discretion of the County.

The Provider shall furnish the County with a Background Screening Affidavit (Attachment D) as proof that it is in compliance with the foregoing provisions. In the event the Provider fails to furnish such proof to the County, the County shall not disburse any further funds and this Contract may be subject to termination at the sole discretion of the County.

- XII. Other than as expressly amended herein, all other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect. If any conflict in language exists between the Agreement and this Amendment #2, the language in this Amendment #2 shall prevail.
- XIII. This Amendment #2 is hereby made a part of the Agreement and is binding upon the County and the Grantee and Fiscal Surrogate. This Amendment #2 shall be effective once it has been signed by all parties and shall expire on September 30, 2024, unless earlier terminated or extended pursuant to the terms of this Agreement.

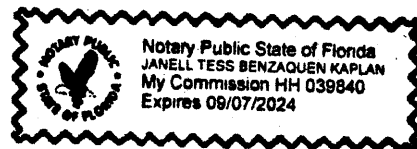

Through the Future Bound Miami program, upon entering kindergarten, each child enrolled in Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS) automatically gains access to a no-fee savings account in their name at the Educational Federal Credit Union (EdFed), which will be opened with an initial seed deposit of \$25, or \$50 per student who are eligible for free/reduced lunch. Over time, the children's savings account grows through family contributions and earned incentives and helps children and their families build savings for the future. The savings account is only accessible to the child upon high school graduation and is to be utilized to help pay for postsecondary education.

This funding is being allocated to allow for the provision of seed money for the expansion of the Future Bound Miami, children's savings accounts program, beyond the City of Miami and into a countywide program by 2024.

2.2 – Client Eligibility and Demographics

Kindergarten students enrolled in M-DCPS in the fully scaled expanded Program, which encompasses M-DCPS schools located outside of the City of Miami.

Kindergarten students enrolled in M-DCPS.

To be eligible for the \$50 initial seed deposit, students should be eligible for free/reduced lunch. All other students are eligible for the \$25 initial seed deposit.

The official definition of the "activation" or "activated accounts" of a Future Bound Miami account is when a parent decides they want to participate in the Future Bound Miami Savings Program by completing the account activation form and submitting it to the school. That form gives permission to open up the children's savings account, collect certain data points from M-DCPS, open the savings account through EdFed and seed the account with \$25 for students who do not qualify for free or reduced lunch and \$50 for students who do qualify for free and reduced lunch.

All schools will have a school employee assigned to be a Future Bound Miami champion whose role will be to make sure the program is publicized to all kindergarten parents. The program will make sure that all Future Bound Miami Champions are properly trained and provided with promotional and marketing materials to share with all kindergarten parents. The marketing materials will include an opt-in registration form that all parents must submit back to the school to ensure program participation. After the account activation period ends, parents will receive online access to the Future Bound Miami account and will be able to begin saving for their child's future.

3.2 - How will your organization provide continuous quality control of this program, including its staff and operations?

A Regional Consortium, as opposed to a single organization, leads the implementation of Future Bound Miami and will assist in providing quality control of this program. This consortium acts as a formal advisory board responsible for overseeing and approving the decisions guiding the Future Bound Miami program, ensuring that each decision is guided by a community-wide vision for all of Miami-Dade's children.

The consortium leads the direction of the future of the program on all levels and is fully implemented through a committee structure.

Furthermore, the the consortium developed a number of working groups with the intent of spreading different duties and responsibilities across all members.

ATTACHMENT A-2 - SCOPE OF WORK

The agreements/contracts workgroup is responsible for ensuring that all contracts and MOUs are drafted, reviewed, and approved by the members of the consortium, as well as third-party vendors. We have completed and executed agreements with all of the consortium partners, and we have finalized our contracts with third-party vendors.

The curriculum workgroup is tasked with developing a curriculum for both the kindergarten classes across M-DCPS as well as their parents. This curriculum will introduce sound financial habits to children, as well as present concepts such as needs vs wants, earning, and saving.

Our communications/marketing workgroup, which includes the M-DCPS communications department, developed a brand for the program and put together a timeline and outreach strategy for successfully launching Future Bound Miami.

Lastly, the fund development workgroup is charged with creating a plan to raise funds for extending the reach of Future Bound Miami over the next 3 years.

(hereinafter “Grantee”), and The Miami Foundation, Inc., acting as a fiscal surrogate for Catalyst Miami, Inc. (hereinafter “Fiscal Surrogate”), collectively referred to as the “parties”, hereby agree to amend the Grant Agreement (Contract MFND-FBM21) dated August 17, 2021, between the parties (hereinafter called “the Agreement”) and therefore makes the following recitals.

WHEREAS, the Agreement relates to a grant for the Future Bound Miami, Children’s Savings Accounts Program (the “Program”); and

WHEREAS, at the final FY 2023-2024 budget hearing on September 21, 2023, the Miami-Dade Board of County Commissioners (the “Board”) approved an additional allocation of \$250,000.00 to Grantee for the Program; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to amend the agreement to add these additional funds; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement allows for amendment in writing by written consent of the parties;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants recorded herein and made part of this Amendment, the County, the Grantee, and the Fiscal Surrogate agree to amend the Agreement as follows:

- II. **ARTICLE 2. Amount Payable.** is hereby amended by removing the strikethrough language and adding the underlined language, as shown below:

The maximum provisional amount payable for services rendered under this Agreement shall not exceed ~~\$2,500,000.00~~ \$2,750,000.00 (“Program funds” or “Grant funds”), which is inclusive of the initial award of \$500,000.00 in the Agreement, the \$1,000,000.00 allocation to the Program approved by the Board in the fiscal year 2021-2022 budget and reflected in Amendment # 1, ~~and~~ an additional \$1,000,000.00 allocation to the Program as approved by the Board on September 20, 2022 and

reflected in Amendment # 2, and an additional \$250,000.00 allocation to the Program as approved by the Board on September 21, 2023.

- III. **Attachment A-2: Scope of Work No. 3:** The Scope of Work No. 3 is amended to update the Program Funding Amount from \$2,500,000.00 to \$2,750,000.00.
- IV. Other than as expressly amended herein, all other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect. If any conflict in language exists between the Agreement, Amendments 1 and 2, and this Amendment # 3, the language in this Amendment # 3 shall prevail.

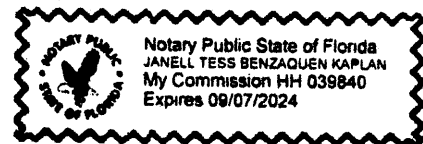

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE AN AMENDMENT TO THE GRANT AGREEMENT WITH CATALYST MIAMI, INC., AND THE MIAMI FOUNDATION, ACTING AS FISCAL SURROGATE, FOR THE FUTURE BOUND MIAMI CHILDREN'S SAVINGS ACCOUNTS PROGRAM TO EXTEND THE CONTRACT TERM OF THE GRANT AGREEMENT BY FOUR YEARS FROM SEPTEMBER 30, 2024 TO SEPTEMBER 30, 2028; AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE ANY FUTURE AGREEMENTS OR DOCUMENTS RELATING TO THE FUTURE BOUND MIAMI PROGRAM, AND TO EXERCISE ALL PROVISIONS CONTAINED THEREIN, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO AMENDMENTS AND EXTENSIONS OF THE AGREEMENT; REQUIRING ANNUAL REPORTS

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are approved and incorporated into this resolution.

Section 2. This Board authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute an amendment to the grant agreement with Catalyst Miami, Inc., and The Miami Foundation, acting as fiscal surrogate, for the Future Bound Miami Children's Savings Account Program in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit 1, in order to extend the contract term of the grant agreement by four years, from September 30, 2024 to September 30, 2028. The County Mayor or County Mayor's designee is further authorized to exercise the provisions contained therein, including but not limited to amendment and termination provisions, provided that such amendments do not alter the purpose of the Agreement, subject to approval by the County Attorney's Office for form and legal sufficiency.

Section 3. This Board further authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute any future agreements or documents relating to the Future Bound Miami Children's Savings Account Program, subject to approval by the County Attorney's Office for form and legal sufficiency, and to exercise all provisions contained therein, including but not limited to amendments and extensions of the agreement for up to 10 years, or September 30, 2038, based on sufficient progress being attained in the Program (i.e. activation of children's savings accounts) and to account for, and subject to, future additional grant funds allocated by the Board for the Program.

Section 4. This Board directs the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to provide an annual written report to this Board for the length of the contract term, including any extensions thereof, on the progress of the Future Bound Miami Children's Savings Account Program, and to place the completed report on an agenda of the full Board without committee review pursuant to rule 5.06(j) of the Board's Rules of Procedure.

**AMENDMENT #4
TO THE GRANT AGREEMENT BETWEEN
MIAMI-DADE COUNTY,
CATALYST MIAMI, INC.,
AND
THE MIAMI FOUNDATION, INC.**

Miami-Dade County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, by and through its Office of Management and Budget – Grants Coordination division located at 111 N.W. 1st Street, 22nd Floor, Miami, FL 33128 (hereinafter “the County” “OMB-GC” or “OMB” or “Grantor”), and Catalyst Miami, Inc. (hereinafter “Grantee”), and The Miami Foundation, Inc., acting as a fiscal surrogate for Catalyst Miami, Inc. (hereinafter “Fiscal Surrogate”), collectively referred to as the “parties”, hereby agree to amend the Grant Agreement (Contract MFND-FBM21) dated August 17, 2021, between the parties (hereinafter called “the Agreement”) and therefore makes the following recitals.

WHEREAS, the Agreement relates to a grant for the Future Bound Miami, Children's Savings Accounts Program (the “Program”); and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to amend the agreement to extend the contract term of the grant agreement for the Future Bound Miami, Children's Savings Accounts (“CSA”) Program beyond September 30, 2024, until September 30, 2028, to allow time for the expenditure of all County funding provided to support the Program; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement allows for amendment in writing by written consent of the parties;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants recorded herein and made part of this Amendment, the County, the Grantee, and the Fiscal Surrogate agree to amend the Agreement as follows:

- I. The “whereas” clauses above are fully incorporated and adopted herein as if fully set forth herein.
- II. **ARTICLE 5. Payment Recapture.** Is hereby removed in its entirety and replaced with the following language:

Should the Program be unable to fully utilize all Grant funds allocated herein for the purpose described herein by September 30, 2028, the unallocated funds shall be returned to the County within thirty (30) days of such date, without further notification from the County.

Should insufficient progress be made toward the activation of the CSAs or insufficient evidence of the efficacy of the Program and Program goals, as determined in the sole discretion of the County, the County shall be entitled to recapture any and all

unseeded or unallocated Grant funds. Repayment of the funds shall be made to the County within sixty (60) days of such notice.

- III. **ARTICLE 6. Length of the Agreement.** Is hereby amended by removing the strikethrough language and adding the underlined language, as shown below:

This Grant Agreement shall be effective as of the date of last signature and shall expire on September 30, ~~2024~~ 2028, unless earlier terminated or extended pursuant to the terms of this Agreement. Certain provisions of this Agreement, as specified herein, shall survive the expiration of this Agreement.

- IV. **ARTICLE 10. Grant Reporting Requirements** and **ARTICLE 13. Independent Private Sector Inspector General Reviews and Rights of Access.** and **ARTICLE 14. Miami-Dade County Inspector General Review.** are hereby amended to reflect that its terms and conditions survive the termination or expiration of the Agreement, at least until October 2037.

- V. Other than as expressly amended herein, all other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect. If any conflict in language exists between the Agreement, Amendments 1, 2, 3 and this Amendment # 4, the language in this Amendment # 4 shall prevail.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have caused this Amendment #4 to the Agreement to be executed by their officials thereunto duly authorized.

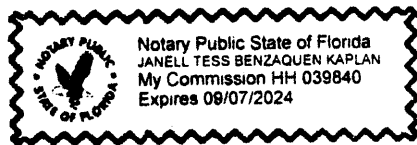

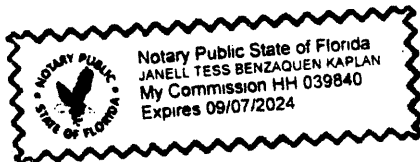
