**Subject:** Southeast Overtown/Park West Community Redevelopment Agency FY 2024-25 Budget

#### **Executive Summary**

As required by the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement (interlocal) between Miami-Dade County (County), the City of Miami (City) and the Southeast Overtown Park West Community Redevelopment Agency (Agency), and Section 163.387, Florida Statutes, the Board of County Commissioners (Board), as the governing body of all community redevelopment agencies in the County, is required to approve annual budgets of such community redevelopment agencies, and any amendments to the budgets. This item seeks approval of the fiscal year (FY) 2024-25 budget totaling \$100,466,278 for the Agency and the Southeast Overtown Park West Community Redevelopment Area (redevelopment area).

#### Recommendation

It is recommended the Board adopt the attached resolution approving the Agency's and the redevelopment area's FY 2024-25 budget in the amount of \$100,466,278. The interlocal requires that the Agency submit an annual budget for County approval but does not require Board approval prior to spending funds on allowable activities. Notwithstanding the interlocal, Section 163.387, Florida Statutes, which was amended after the execution of the interlocal, requires a community redevelopment agency created by a municipality to submit its annual budgets and amended budgets to the Board within 10 days after the adoption of such budget or amended budget.

#### Scope of Agenda Item

The redevelopment area is located within County Commission Districts 3 and 5, which are represented by Commissioner Keon Hardemon and Commissioner Eileen Higgins, respectively.

#### Fiscal Impact / Funding Source

The Agency's revenue source is tax increment financing (TIF), which is generated through the incremental growth of ad valorem revenues beyond an established base year, as defined in Section 163.387, Florida Statutes. For FY 2024-25, the County TIF payment into the Agency's trust fund (trust fund) is \$19,709,668 and the City's TIF payment is \$30,694,090. The County will continue to make annual payments to the Agency based on each year's growth of ad valorem revenues over the base year until both the Agency and the redevelopment area sunset on March 31, 2042. The budget also includes a contribution from the Children's Trust Fund in the amount of \$2,017,387 and an estimated \$48,045,133 carryover from prior years.

#### **Delegation of Authority**

This item does not delegate any authority to the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee.

#### **Track Record / Monitor**

This item does not provide for contracting with any specific entity. The resolution approves the Agency's and the redevelopment area's FY 2024-25 budget.

#### **Background**

On January 20, 1981, the Board adopted Resolution No. R-39-81, which established the boundaries of the redevelopment area and declared the redevelopment area to be slum or blighted. On December 21, 1982, the Board approved the establishment of the Agency by adopting the Agency's community redevelopment plan

(plan), through Resolution No. R-1677-82, and the funding of the plan when it enacted Ordinance No. 82-115, which created the Agency's trust fund. The interlocal was approved by the Board on March 31, 1983, requiring the Agency to submit an annual budget for County approval. On July 21, 2009, the Board approved a finding of necessity which expanded the redevelopment area and amended plan which extended the life of the Agency until March 31, 2030. On June 16, 2012, the Board approved the issuance of up to \$50,000,000 in debt for needed capital projects in the Agency's plan (Resolution No. R-516-12). Further, the Board adopted Resolution No. R-480-13, which amended Resolution No. R-516-12, to allow the Agency to issue up to \$60,000,000 in debt.

On July 7, 2022, the Board adopted Resolution No. R-654-22, which approved an amendment to the interlocal and waiver of several prior resolutions (Resolution Nos. R-1382-09, R-871-11, R-599-15 and R-499-16). Most notably, the resolution approved an extension of life through March 31, 2042, wherein the County will contribute 95 percent of the TIF to the trust fund through the life of the Agency and waive the 1.5 percent administrative fee.

#### Fiscal Year 2024-25 Budget

On September 7, 2024, the Agency's FY 2024-25 budget totaling \$100,466,278 was adopted by the Agency through Resolution CRA-R-24-0055 and on September 26, 2024, by the City through Resolution No. R-24-0387 (Attachment A). The budget includes revenue sources of \$19,709,668 in County TIF, \$30,694,090 in City TIF, carryover funds of \$48,045,133, and a Children's Trust contribution of \$2,017,387.

The Agency's administrative expenditures of \$5,216,607, which includes employee salaries and fringes, represents approximately five percent of total budgeted expenditures, satisfying the 20 percent cap for administrative costs allowed by the interlocal. Pursuant to the interlocal, the County's required 1.5 percent administrative fee for staff administrative support and oversight of \$295,645 has been waived and charged to the general fund.

Operating expenses total \$90,569,040 and include:

- \$63,943,605 for grants and aid:
- \$8,000,000 for the Tri-Rail project;
- \$4,502,500 for debt service payments;
- \$4,500,000 for the 2007 Global Agreement payment;
- \$2,513,709 for Professional and Contractual Services;
- \$2,017,387 for Children's Trust Fund payment:
- \$2,000,000 for land/building acquisitions;
- \$1,641,657 for building construction/redevelopment related expenses:
- \$600,000 transfer to the City for enhanced police services; and
- \$850,182 transfer to the City for the Gibson Park Project.

The Agency's projects are budgeted on a cash basis and are not started until all project funding is in place. The budget also includes a reserve of \$4,680,631. All expenditures are detailed in Exhibit 1 to the resolution.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

A Resolution of the Board of Commissioners of the Southeast Overtown/Park West Community Redevelopment Agency ("SEOPW CRA"), with attachment(s), approving and adopting the proposed general operating and tax increment fund ("TIF") budget of the SEOPW CRA ("Budget"), attached and incorporated as Exhibit "A", in the amount of One Hundred Million Four Hundred Sixty-Six Thousand Two Hundred Seventy-Eight Dollars and Zero Cents (\$100,466,278.00) ("Funds"), for the fiscal year commencing October 1, 2024, and ending September 30, 2025, and directing the Executive Director to transmit copies of the Budget to the City of Miami ("City) and Miami-Dade County ("County"). The Board of Commissioners of the SEOPW CRA hereby approves the de-allocation of funds in the amount of One Million One Hundred One Thousand Three Hundred Five Dollars and Zero Cents (\$1,101,305.00), attached and incorporated as Exhibit "B."

#### **JUSTIFICATION:**

Pursuant to Section 163.387, Florida Statutes, the SEOPW CRA is bound to annually prepare and transmit a proposed budget to the City and County, attached and incorporated herein as Exhibit "A." The Board of Commissioners of the SEOPW CRA finds that the attached Resolution would fulfill that requirement and approves the Budget, and hereby authorizes the de-allocation of funds in the amount of \$1,101,305.00, attached and incorporated as Exhibit "B."

#### **BUDGET SUMMARY**

The 2025 Budget amounted to \$100,466,278.00. The Budget included the following revenue sources:

\$19,709,668.00 – Miami Dade County TIF \$30,694,090.00 – City of Miami TIF \$4,833,515.00 – Non-TIF Revenue fund \$2,017,387.00 – Children's Trust Contribution \$43,211,618.00 – 2024's carryover fund balance Administrative expenses total \$5,216,607.00, include employee salaries and fringes, and which represents ten percent (10%) of total budgeted expenditures, satisfying the twenty percent (20%) cap for administrative costs allowed by the Interlocal Agreement, and Section 163.387, Florida Statutes. This allocation of funds contemplates a six percent (6%) salary increase in the Executive Director's compensation, effective October 1, 2024.

Operating expenses total \$95,249,671.00 and include:

\$63,943,605.00 for Grants and Aid, including:

- Affordable/Workforce housing projects (\$19,017,660.00)
- MWC and Avanti economic incentive payments (\$6,351,320.00)
- A reserve for Eligible Activities under Chapter 163 (\$17,969,075.00)
- Other grants and projects such as arts, culture, infrastructure, job creation and quality of life (\$20,605,550.00)

\$15,967,569.00 for Interfund Transfer, including:

- Refund to the County for the Global Agreement (\$4,500,000.00)
- Grant to City for Construction of Gibson Park debt service (\$850,182.00)
- Disbursement to the Children's Trust (\$2,017,387.00)
- Enhanced Policing Services (\$600,000.00)
- Contribution to the Tri-Rail project (\$8,000,000.00)

\$4,502,500.00 for Debt Service payment/reserves \$2,000,000.00 for Purchase of Land \$2,513,709.00 for Professional and Contractual Services \$1,641,657.00 for Construction in Progress \$4,680,631.00 for Revenue Shortfall Reserve for future years.

The Budget was prepared by taking into consideration the following eligible activities below, as specified under Section 163.387(6(c)) and (7), Florida Statutes, respectively.

- s. 163.387, Florida Statutes:
- 6(c) The annual budget of a community redevelopment agency may provide for payment of the following expenses:
  - 1. Administrative and overhead expenses directly or indirectly necessary to implement a community redevelopment plan adopted by the agency.
  - 2. Expenses of redevelopment planning, surveys, and financial analysis, including the reimbursement of the governing body or the community redevelopment agency for such expenses incurred before the redevelopment plan was approved and adopted.

- 3. The acquisition of real property in the redevelopment area.
- 4. The clearance and preparation of any redevelopment area for redevelopment and relocation of site occupants within or outside the community redevelopment area as provided in s.163.370.
- 5. The repayment of principal and interest or any redemption premium for loans, advances, bonds, bond anticipation notes, and any other form of indebtedness.
- 6. All expenses incidental to or connected with the issuance, sale, redemption, retirement, or purchase of bonds, bond anticipation notes, or other form of indebtedness, including funding of any reserve, redemption, or other fund or account provided for in the ordinance or resolution authorizing such bonds, notes, or other form of indebtedness.
- 7. The development of affordable housing within the community redevelopment area.
- 8. The development of community policing innovations.
- 9. Expenses that are necessary to exercise the powers granted under s. 163.370, as delegated under s. 163.358.
- (7) On the last day of the fiscal year of the community redevelopment agency, any money which remains in the trust fund after the payment of expenses pursuant to subsection (6) for such year shall be:
  - (a) Returned to each taxing authority which paid the increment in the proportion that the amount of the payment of such taxing authority bears to the total amount paid into the trust fund by all taxing authorities for that year;
  - (b) Used to reduce the amount of any indebtedness to which increment revenues are pledged;
  - (c) Deposited into an escrow account for the purpose of later reducing any indebtedness to which increment revenues are pledged; or
  - (d) Appropriated to a specific redevelopment project pursuant to an approved community redevelopment plan. The funds appropriated for such project may not be changed unless the project is amended, redesigned, or delayed, in which case the funds must be reappropriated pursuant to the next annual budget adopted by the board of commissioners of the community redevelopment agency.

Any redevelopment project apart from the activities mentioned above will be funded from non-tax increment funding (Non-TIF) sources.

WHEREAS, this Board desires to approve the Agency's Fiscal Year 2024-25 budget totaling \$100,466,278.00 for the Southeast Overtown/Park West Community Redevelopment Area; and

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purpose outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

Section 2. This Board approves the Southeast Overtown/Park West Community Redevelopment Agency's and the Southeast Overtown/Park West Community Redevelopment Area's Fiscal Year 2024-25 budget in the total amount of \$100,466,278.00, in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and incorporated herein by reference.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

A Resolution of the Board of Commissioners of the Southeast Overtown/Park West Community Redevelopment Agency ("SEOPW CRA"), with attachment(s), approving and adopting the proposed general operating and tax increment fund ("TIF") budget of the SEOPW CRA ("Budget"), attached and incorporated as Exhibit "A", in the amount of One Hundred Million Four Hundred Sixty-Six Thousand Two Hundred Seventy-Eight Dollars and Zero Cents (\$100,466,278.00) ("Funds"), for the fiscal year commencing October 1, 2024, and ending September 30, 2025, and directing the Executive Director to transmit copies of the Budget to the City of Miami ("City) and Miami-Dade County ("County"). The Board of Commissioners of the SEOPW CRA hereby approves the de-allocation of funds in the amount of One Million One Hundred One Thousand Three Hundred Five Dollars and Zero Cents (\$1,101,305.00), attached and incorporated as Exhibit "B."

#### **JUSTIFICATION:**

Pursuant to Section 163.387, Florida Statutes, the SEOPW CRA is bound to annually prepare and transmit a proposed budget to the City and County, attached and incorporated herein as Exhibit "A." The Board of Commissioners of the SEOPW CRA finds that the attached Resolution would fulfill that requirement and approves the Budget, and hereby authorizes the de-allocation of funds in the amount of \$1,101,305.00, attached and incorporated as Exhibit "B."

#### **BUDGET SUMMARY**

The 2025 Budget amounted to \$100,466,278.00. The Budget included the following revenue sources:

\$19,709,668.00 – Miami Dade County TIF \$30,694,090.00 – City of Miami TIF \$4,833,515.00 – Non-TIF Revenue fund \$2,017,387.00 – Children's Trust Contribution \$43,211,618.00 – 2024's carryover fund balance Administrative expenses total \$5,216,607.00, include employee salaries and fringes, and which represents ten percent (10%) of total budgeted expenditures, satisfying the twenty percent (20%) cap for administrative costs allowed by the Interlocal Agreement, and Section 163.387, Florida Statutes. This allocation of funds contemplates a six percent (6%) salary increase in the Executive Director's compensation, effective October 1, 2024.

Operating expenses total \$95,249,671.00 and include:

\$63,943,605.00 for Grants and Aid, including:

- Affordable/Workforce housing projects (\$19,017,660.00)
- MWC and Avanti economic incentive payments (\$6,351,320.00)
- A reserve for Eligible Activities under Chapter 163 (\$17,969,075.00)
- Other grants and projects such as arts, culture, infrastructure, job creation and quality of life (\$20,605,550.00)

\$15,967,569.00 for Interfund Transfer, including:

- Refund to the County for the Global Agreement (\$4,500,000.00)
- Grant to City for Construction of Gibson Park debt service (\$850,182.00)
- Disbursement to the Children's Trust (\$2,017,387.00)
- Enhanced Policing Services (\$600,000.00)
- Contribution to the Tri-Rail project (\$8,000,000,00)

\$4,502,500.00 for Debt Service payment/reserves \$2,000,000.00 for Purchase of Land \$2,513,709.00 for Professional and Contractual Services \$1,641,657.00 for Construction in Progress \$4,680,631.00 for Revenue Shortfall Reserve for future years.

All expenses incidental to or connected with the issuance, sale, redemption, retirement, or purchase of bonds, bond anticipation notes, or other form of indebtedness, including funding of any reserve, redemption, or other fund or account provided for in the ordinance or resolution authorizing such bonds, notes, or other form of indebtedness.
- 7. The development of affordable housing within the community redevelopment area.
- 8. The development of community policing innovations.
- 9. Expenses that are necessary to exercise the powers granted under s. 163.370, as delegated under s. 163.358.
- (7) On the last day of the fiscal year of the community redevelopment agency, any money which remains in the trust fund after the payment of expenses pursuant to subsection (6) for such year shall be:
  - (a) Returned to each taxing authority which paid the increment in the proportion that the amount of the payment of such taxing authority bears to the total amount paid into the trust fund by all taxing authorities for that year;
  - (b) Used to reduce the amount of any indebtedness to which increment revenues are pledged;
  - (c) Deposited into an escrow account for the purpose of later reducing any indebtedness to which increment revenues are pledged; or
  - (d) Appropriated to a specific redevelopment project pursuant to an approved community redevelopment plan. The funds appropriated for such project may not be changed unless the project is amended, redesigned, or delayed, in which case the funds must be reappropriated pursuant to the next annual budget adopted by the board of commissioners of the community redevelopment agency.

Any redevelopment project apart from the activities mentioned above will be funded from non-tax increment funding (Non-TIF) sources.

WHEREAS, the Southeast Overtown/Park West Community Redevelopment Agency ("SEOPW CRA") is responsible for carrying out community redevelopment activities and projects within its Redevelopment Area in accordance with the 2018 Southeast Overtown/Park West Redevelopment Plan Update (the "Plan"); and

WHEREAS, as a prerequisite to carrying out redevelopment activities for the fiscal year commencing October 1, 2024 and ending September 30, 2025 ("FY 2024 - 2025"), it is required that the SEOPW CRA's Board of Commissioners ("Board") approve and adopt the annual General Operating and Tax Increment Fund Budget ("Budget"), attached and incorporated herein as Exhibit "A"; and

WHEREAS, all the expenses included in the Budget are in accordance with local and state law, Interlocal Agreements, and the Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that authorizing this Resolution would further the SEOPW CRA's redevelopment goals and objectives; and

WHEREAS, the Board wishes to approve and adopt the SEOPW CRA's Budget for FY 2024 - 2025, as set forth in Exhibit "A," in the amount of One Hundred Million Four Hundred Sixty-Six Thousand Two Hundred Seventy-Eight Dollars and Zero Cents (\$100,466,278.00) ("Funds");
