RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO REVIEW COUNTY PURCHASES OF FRESH PRODUCE AND EXAMINE THE EXTENT TO WHICH SUCH PRODUCE IS LOCALLY GROWN, AND ANALYZE POTENTIAL **PROCUREMENT** STRATEGIES TO FACILITATE THE USE OF FRESH, LOCALLY-GROWN PRODUCE IN FUTURE COUNTY PURCHASES AND PROGRAMS; FURTHER DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO DEVELOP STRATEGIES FOR INCREASING PUBLIC ACCESS TO FRESH, LOCALLY-GROWN PRODUCE COUNTYWIDE, AND TO PROVIDE A REPORT

WHEREAS, chronic health conditions continue to be a problem nationwide, with six out of every ten adults in the United States having at least one chronic disease, and about four in ten adults having two or more chronic diseases, according to the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention; and

WHEREAS, dietary factors contribute to the development of many chronic conditions, and a healthy diet rich in fruits and vegetables can help reduce the risk of developing certain chronic diseases, such as heart disease, diabetes, and cancer, according to the National Institutes of Health; and

WHEREAS, there are a variety of reported benefits from consuming locally-grown produce, including increased nutritional value, better taste, and reduced environmental impact; and

WHEREAS, for example, locally-grown fruits and vegetables can be harvested closer to peak ripeness and nutrient density, and travel shorter distances to reach the consumer, which reduces spoilage and nutrient degradation; and

WHEREAS, Miami-Dade County ("the County") has a vibrant agricultural industry, with the climate providing a year-round growing season, as well as the ability to produce an extremely wide range of crops; and

WHEREAS, the County makes purchases of produce for a variety of purposes, and, through its departments as well as relationships with regional partners, operates or funds programs that supply food through direct delivery or distribution at locations countywide; and

WHEREAS, such programs typically serve vulnerable adults, children, and underserved communities who might have limited or uncertain access to affordable food options; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this Board that the County explore ways to increase the use of local produce in its food purchases and programs, as well as consider opportunities to expand community access to local produce,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Directs the County mayor or County Mayor's designee to: (i) review existing County purchases of fresh produce and examine the extent to which such produce is locally grown; (ii) analyze potential legally available procurement strategies to facilitate the use of fresh, locally-grown produce in future County purchases and programs; and (iii) develop strategies involving community stakeholders (including, but not limited to, the Miami-Dade Farm Bureau and local food producers and agricultural organizations) for increasing public access to fresh, locally-grown produce countywide.

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Section 2. Directs the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee, within 60 days of the effective date of this resolution, to prepare a written report regarding the directive in section 1 and to place the completed report on an agenda of this Board without committee review pursuant to rule 5.06(j) of the Board's rules of procedure. The report should include discussion of the estimated fiscal impact of any proposed strategies and identify potential funding sources.
