The Board is requested to recommend the nomination of candidates to fill four (4) vacancies resulting from the term expirations of Dr. Clara Lora Ospina, Ms. Nicole Gomez, Mr. Richard P. Dunn, II and Ms. Marissa Joy Leichter.¹

Section 2-1521 of the Miami-Dade County Code established The Children's Trust as a 33-member board for the purpose of funding improvements for Miami-Dade County children in the areas of health, development, safety, parental responsibility, community responsibility and other necessary and important children's services.

The code establishes that seven (7) members of The Children's Trust be appointed by the Governor of the State of Florida from a list of candidates recommended by the Board. The County Commission is to submit to the Governor the names of at least three (3) persons to fill each vacancy.

I appreciate the opportunity to be considered as a member (gubernatorial appointment through the Miami-Dade County Board of County Commissioners) of the Board of Directors of The Children's Trust (TCT). I believe that I could make a strong contribution to the mission of TCT based on my commitment to the mission, my experience and my personal capabilities. As described in this letter, having been engaged in a professional career and involved with an educational system outside of the United States, I feel that my background and experience could enable me to provide a different perspective to the work of TCT. Please note that despite my years working as an expatriate in the United Kingdom, I have been a resident of Miami-Dade County for over twenty years and have strong family ties here (for example, I have a son that has been with Miami-Dade Fire Rescue for nearly ten years).

To start, I am very aware of the many challenges faced by our children and families in Miami-Dade County. One example of these challenges is reflected in the recent NAEP results in reading and math. ¹

First, I am committed to the mission of making a positive impact on the lives of children and families in Miami-Dade County. I believe that my commitment is reflected in my community volunteer work, my decision to spend last year studying educational policy analysis in a graduate school program in order to study "what works" in education (and my current enrollment at FIU), and my current work with newcomers to the United States and our community at Catholic Charities Legal Services in Miami.

Second, I have experience that can enable me to make a contribution to the work of TCT. I have served as members of the board of trustees both on the local school level (Olive School Hackney in London since 2017) and at the school system level (Star Academies Trust since 2020).² In these roles, I have been responsible at the school level for child safeguarding and special educational needs and building out the school reading program and, at the trust level, for academic performance (chair and member of Star's Academic Board). At Olive School Hackney, I have served as acting chairman and vice chairman of the board, including during the COVID era and the school relocation from three sites to one campus.
