The Miami-Dade Aviation Department (Aviation Department or MDAD) began construction on a new airside operating area (AOA) access gate project to support Miami International Airport's (MIA) central base area. Strategically positioned at the intersection of McLaughlin Drive and the commercial vehicle entrance from southbound Le Jeune Road, this new AOA access gate will provide a much-needed additional entry point for construction vehicles and personnel working on various projects at MIA. By reducing congestion and streamlining access to construction zones, the access gate will enhance efficiency and safety. Moreover, it will help minimize disruptions to airport operations, ensuring that construction work progresses effectively and remains on schedule during MIA's transformation process. Substantial project completion is expected by Summer 2026.

MIA's Modernization Program

The modernization efforts to renovate 128 passenger boarding bridges, modernize 207 publicaccess restrooms, and improve 616 moving conveyance units (escalators, elevators and moving sidewalks) are not lagging, and measurable progress has been made. We began the new year with ninety-five percent (95%) of the conveyances in operation as compared to 2024 when only eighty-five percent (85%) were functional, and the remaining five percent (5%) were pending modernization, major repair or annual maintenance. Today, approximately ninety-seven percent (97%) of the conveyances are in operation. Below are three (3) charts that show the progress being made with respect to those facilities.

The number of out-of-service elevators decreased from six (6) to five (5), and the number of out-of-service walkways decreased from 13 to nine (9).

CIP Progress Summary

MDAD's capital portfolio continues to make measurable strides in its mission to transform MIA through the development of new terminals, concourses, ramps, runways, parking facilities, restrooms, and hotels. Two major expansion projects – the Central Terminal Redevelopment Phase II and MIA's New Concourse K are advancing with design work set to begin in Summer 2025. Additional details on these projects can be found in the sections entitled: Significant Design Solicitations and Request for Design-Build Services further below.

Background

At the September 4, 2024, Board of County Commissioners (Board) meeting, Board members amended Ordinance No. 19-122 revising the reporting requirements of the monthly Aviation Capital Program Report (Report) and deleting the ratification requirement for all federal and state grants applied for or received including any amendments or supplemental agreements set forth in Section 2-285.2 of the Code of Miami-Dade County related to MDAD's capital projects. The provisions of the adopted amendment require the inclusion of any information that highlights the improvements, infrastructure investments and capital projects at MIA in Miami-Dade in addition to any other relevant airport activities, accomplishments, and awards that contribute to making MIA a more efficient, innovative, and avant-garde airport. The amendment also requires that all federal or state grants (as described above) be included in the monthly Report, and as requested by Board members, it will also include all MDAD grant applications for the forthcoming year. As such, in addition to the reporting requirements established under the authority of Ordinance No. 19-122 before it was modified, this new Report will include snapshots of any significant action steps taken or any major achievements that serve to enhance efficiencies, expand service offerings, modernize infrastructure, optimize operations or promote growth at MIA, and although not required by law, it will also include any action steps that further develop the County's General Aviation Airports (GAA), which include Miami-Opa locka Executive Airport (OPF), Miami

Executive Airport (TMB), Miami Homestead General Aviation Airport (X51) and Dade-Collier Training and Transition Airport (TNT).

The action steps being implemented align with MIA's \$2 billion Modernization in Action Program that is currently underway. Over the next 5-7-years, this Program will continue to renovate and repair parking garages, passenger boarding bridges, public bathrooms, and the moving conveyance units. Additionally, it includes critical electrical and security upgrades. These improvements also complement the ongoing I AM MIA campaign, which is designed to enhance passenger loyalty and satisfaction through customer service training programs for the airport's 37,000 employees. Combined with a \$7 billion robust capital portfolio that funds the design and construction of new terminals, concourses, ramps, runways, parking facilities, restrooms, hotels, and more, these efforts will ultimately transform MIA into a future-ready, world-class, state-of-the-art airport.

In accordance with Ordinance 19-122 as amended, the Aviation Department has placed its fifty-sixth "Aviation Capital Program Report" on today's agenda. The new Report contains the additional content required by Ordinance No. 19-122 (as amended) to better inform residents, passengers, visitors, and Board members of the incremental action steps being taken by the County for MIA to achieve world class status and to further develop the GAA. Upon Board approval, a copy of the new Report will be posted on MDAD's webpage at http://www.miami-airport.com/transparency report.asp each month.

July 2025 Report

Table I, as depicted below, shows MIA's calendar year-to-date passenger and cargo growth rates for the last five years including Year 2025 through the month of April. As can be seen, since the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic in March 2020, the percent increase in the total number of passengers from Year 2020 to Year 2021 totaled 99.86 percent as MIA experienced a strong recovery in the demand for air travel in 2021 while the demand for air cargo rose by approximately 18 percent, from 2.3 U.S. tons to 2.7 tons. From Year 2022 to Year 2024, the average percent increase in the total number of passengers totaled 10.3 percent and the same percent for total freight. These percent increases culminated in 2024, when MIA handled nearly 56 million passengers and more than 3 million U.S. tons of cargo.

No less significant are the monthly passenger and total freight numbers, which show that approximately 4.7 million passengers traveled through MIA and more than 300 thousand U.S. tons of total freight were registered in the month of April 2025, making for a grand total of 19.3 million in total passengers (international and domestic) and 1.1 million U.S. tons in total freight (freight tons and mail tons) year-to-date through April 2025. The unprecedented increases in the demand for air travel and air cargo traffic has positioned MIA for further growth.

It is worth noting that the increases in passenger and cargo traffic have led MIA to be recognized as one of the busiest airports in the United States. As shown in Table II below, among U.S. airports, the 2024 preliminary rankings published by the Airports Council International (ACI) show that MIA continues to be ranked as the number 2 airport for international passengers, the number one in international freight and the number three airport in total cargo (freight and mail). Among airports worldwide, MIA continues to be ranked as the number 6 airport for total cargo (freight + mail), however, the ranking value for international freight changed from the number 6 airport in 2023 to the number 5 airport in 2024.

Action Steps in Progress

This new Report provides an outline of the action steps being put into effect to successfully implement \$7 billion of upgrades to modernize MIA and further develop the GAA, whether it is in the form of procurement solicitations, contract awards, large capital improvement projects that renovate terminals and concourses, or smaller but functional projects such as improvements to runways, taxilanes, passenger loading bridges, gates, checkpoints, restrooms, baggage handling systems, parking facilities, etc., as well as any achievements, awards or high-tech investments that contribute to making MIA a more well-ordered, voguish, future-ready airport. These action steps also include \$1.7 billion in maintenance upgrades over the next 10 years.

The successful implementation of MDAD's capital portfolio that will renovate the airport's Central, South and North Terminals and expand its cargo facilities is critical for MIA's growth and future readiness as these development projects will replace aging and obsolete airport infrastructure and boost freight capacity. More importantly, these improvements will enable MIA to meet the growing demand of its passenger and cargo aviation markets and provide patrons with an enhanced, innovative, modern-day customer experience that offers greater value and optimizes convenience and efficiency. Two major expansion projects, the Central Terminal Redevelopment Phase II and MIA's New Concourse K are already moving forward with the design work in the third quarter of 2025. Below is a summary of the sub-programs within MDAD's Capital Improvement Program (CIP) that will pave the way to meet passenger and cargo demand growth, which is projected to reach approximately 77 million passengers and more than four (4) million tons of freight by the year 2040.

- Central Terminal Redevelopment
- Concourse "F' Modernization
- North Terminal Redevelopment
- South Terminal Expansion (New Concourse K)
- Expanded Cargo Aircraft Parking Positions & Cargo Handling Facilities
- New Privately Funded Airport Hotel

The Scope of Work involves the procurement of an exterior screen system that will act as an aesthetic skin enhancing the highly visible parking garages and their facades. This contract was awarded through the Mayor's delegated authority in May 2025 per Ordinance No. 24-122. It has a five-year term with no renewal options.

2. April 1, 2025

- a) Non-Competitive "Restated Lease and Concession Agreement" for MIA concessionaires requiring retail concessionaires to invest a minimum of \$850.00 per square foot (SF) to renovate the first 1,500 square feet of retail space, and each food and beverage (F&B) concessionaire a minimum of \$1,000.00 per SF within three years of the effective date of the agreement. Both F&B and retail concessionaires are required to invest \$500.00 per SF on the balance of the concession space in that same timeframe. The term of each concession agreement will be extended by 12 years from the expiration of the existing agreements and include a three-year renewal option to be exercised contingent upon the concessionaire's investment of an additional 30 percent across their portfolio of properties, as appropriate. Each concessionaire will be responsible only for the investment in its own locations.

The Scope of Work provides for the provision of janitorial services for a 5-year term inside MIA's Terminal and the landside areas including the lobbies, ticketing areas, hallways, stairwells, elevators, escalators, moving walkways, and restrooms. - c) Non-Competitive Contract Award to Flagship Aviation Services, LLC for Contract No. BW-10573. The Scope of Work provides for the provision of janitorial services for a 5-year term in MIA's Terminal and the landside areas including the lobbies, ticketing areas, hallways, stairwells, elevators, escalators, moving walkways, and restrooms. (\$131,292,181.00)
- d) Competitive Lease Agreement with Mandich Group, LLC, for Contract No. EVN0002820. The Scope of Work provides for the design and construction of a phytosanitary treatment and cold chain processing facility for a term of 35 years with two, 5-year renewal options for the lease of 14.61 acres of county-owned property for

PortMiami and the Aviation Department. It is anticipated that the County will receive \$206,810,000.00 for the initial 35-year term and if the two 5-year options to renew are exercised, the estimated cumulative revenue to the County is projected at \$318,300,000.00.

The NTPC was advertised on September 16, 2024, and the project briefing took place on September 23, 2024; Requests for Information (RFIs) were due on September 30, 2024, and the proposals received on October 30, 2024, the second-tier evaluation meeting took place on February 7, 2025; the award recommendation Board approval process is in progress and the anticipated contract execution date is June 1, 2025.
- 2. MIA Concourse Low E and E Satellite Mechanical and Electrical Rooms Upgrade (CA010A) The scope of work involves upgrading the Mechanical and Electrical rooms in Lower Cc, E, and E-Satellite (all levels). This includes replacing equipment, making necessary room adjustments to fit new equipment, and retrofitting existing equipment to meet current code compliance. The NTPC is anticipated to be advertised in June 2025.

Request for Design-Build Services (RDBS)

3. MIA South Terminal Expansion East (X078A) – This project includes a three-level expansion of the South Terminal to the east of Concourse J. The project will provide six (6) domestic narrow-body aircraft gates and increase post-security concessions space. The RDBS was issued on April 23, 2024, and the Step II presentations took place on December 18, 2024. The award recommendation Board approval process is in progress and the anticipated contract execution date is June 1, 2025.

MIA Satellite E New Chiller Plant (Project No. U010D-I): The Scope of Work involves the construction of a modular type building to house two (2) new centrifugal water-cooled chillers with a total net peak load refrigeration capacity of 1,050 tons. The RFP was issued on September 6, 2024, and proposals were received on January 15, 2025. The evaluation process has been initiated. The RTA is being prepared. (Overall Total Project Costs: \$39,300,000.00)
- 2. MIA Bridge Rehabilitation (AB003B): The Scope of Work addresses multiple deficiencies identified in the Bridge Inspection Report dated April 2022, which was prepared by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT). The RTA was issued on April 2, 2022, the pre-bid conference is scheduled for April 17, 2025, and the bid opening was held on May 8, 2025. (Overall Total Project Costs: \$19,000,000.00)
- 3. MIA Airports Operation Center (P250A): The Scope of Work involves combining the functions of MIA's Airport Operations Center and Emergency Operations Center to provide a more efficient and unified control center. The RTA was issued on January 10, 2025, the pre-bid conference took place on January 31, 2025, and the bid opening was held on April 30, 2025. During the evaluation process, it was determined that a re-bid

needed to be initiated. The RTA process is being coordinated. (Overall Total Project Costs: \$35,000,000.00)

- 4. MIA Concourse J Gates Advanced Visual Guidance Detection System (VGDS) (V100A): The Scope of Work involves the procurement of 17 Advanced Visual Guidance Detection System displays and operator panels for installation at 17 gates in Concourse J, Gates J-2 through J-18. The RTA is anticipated to be issued in June 2025. (Overall Total Project Costs: \$8,200,000.00)
- 5. MIA Concourse H Visual Guidance Detection System (VGDS) (T012A-1): The Scope of Work includes the procurement of VGDS displays and operator panels for installation at MIA Concourse H gates. The RTA is expected to be issued in June 2025. (Overall Total Project Costs: \$8,900,000.00)


