RESOLUTION URGING THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY (“DHS”) AND THE U.S. TRANSPORTATION AND SECURITY ADMINISTRATION (“TSA”) TO INSTITUTE THE “FAMILIES ON THE FLY” PROGRAM AT MIAMI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (“MIA”) AS EXPEDITIOUSLY AS POSSIBLE; DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR’S DESIGNEE TO WORK WITH THE DHS AND THE TSA TO BRING THE “FAMILIES ON THE FLY” PROGRAM TO MIA AS EXPEDITIOUSLY AS POSSIBLE; AND DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR’S DESIGNEE TO PROVIDE A REPORT TO THIS BOARD REGARDING SUCH EFFORTS WITHIN 90 DAYS OF THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS RESOLUTION

**WHEREAS**, Miami International Airport (“MIA”) is one of the nation’s busiest airports, ranking first and second in the nation for international freight and international passenger travel, respectively; and

**WHEREAS**, MIA is not only the Gateway of the Americas, but it is also a major hub for traveling families who use MIA to visit South Florida’s myriad family-friendly destinations, including Port Miami, the cruise capital of the world; and

**WHEREAS**, air travel is typically more stressful for traveling families, particularly with small kids and particularly during the security screening process; and

**WHEREAS**, in addition to managing small kids, traveling families typically have additional items, such as strollers and diaper bags, which cause families to need more time and attention from TSA officers than other members of the traveling public; and

**WHEREAS**, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (“DHS”) recently announced the creation of a program called “Families on the Fly,” a Transportation Security Administration (“TSA”) initiative designed to enhance hospitality for families during the airport security screening experience; and

**WHEREAS**, according to a DHS press release, “Families on the Fly” will offer families dedicated TSA screening lanes and discounted TSA PreCheck fees; and

**WHEREAS**, in addition to benefiting families, having dedicated security lines for families will also benefit the traveling public generally because security screening wait times in non-family lines will be shorter; and

**WHEREAS**, “Families on the Fly” is not currently available at MIA; and

**WHEREAS**, according to a DHS press release, “Families on the Fly” will roll out at select airports including Charleston International Airport (CHS), Jacksonville International (JAX), Rhode Island T. F. Green International Airport (PVD), Luis Muñoz Marín International Airport (SJU), and Tampa International Airport (TPA) with additional airports slated for addition in the coming months.”; and

**WHEREAS**, this Board desires that the “Families on the Fly” program be instituted at MIA as expeditiously as possible,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA**, that this Board:

**Section 1.** Incorporates the foregoing recitals herein and approves same.

**Section 2.** Urges the DHS and TSA to institute the “Families on the Fly” program at Miami International Airport as expeditiously as possible.

**Section 3.** Directs the County Mayor or County Mayor’s designee to work with the DHS and the TSA to bring the “Families on the Fly” program to MIA as expeditiously as possible.

**Section 4.** Directs the County Mayor or County Mayor’s designee to provide, within 90 days of the effective date of this Resolution, a report regarding the status of the administration’s efforts to bring the “Families on the Fly” program to MIA. Such report shall be placed on an agenda of the full Board, without committee review, pursuant to rule 5.06(j) of the Board’s Rules of Procedure.

**Section 5.** Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this Resolution to the members of the Florida Congressional Delegation, U.S. Department of Homeland Security Secretary Kristi Noem, and Deputy Transportation Security Administration Administrator Ha Nguyen McNeill.

**Section 6.** Directs the County’s federal lobbyists to advocate for the actions set forth in section 2 above, and authorizes and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to amend the 2025 Federal Legislative Package to include this item and to include this item in the 2026 Federal Legislative Package when it is presented to the Board.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Natalie Milian Orbis and the Co-Sponsor is Commissioner Roberto J. Gonzalez.
