**SUBJECT:** Resolution retroactively approving and authorizing the County Mayor's application for, acceptance, and receipt of grant funding from the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Administration for Children and Families, Office of Family Assistance, in an amount of \$3,516,715.00 over a five-year grant period, for the implementation of "Project DADS"; authorizing the County Mayor to expend the grant funds for Project DADS; authorizing a non-competitive designated purchase pursuant to Section 2-8.1(b)(3) of the County Code by a two-thirds vote of the board members present for sub-grant awards to two providers for the provision of services for Project DADS; further authorizing the County to: (i) apply for, receive, and expend future funding for Project DADS for up to 10 years; (ii) execute agreements and documents necessary for the receipt and expenditure of grant funds; and (iii) exercise provisions in such agreements and documents; waiving the requirements of Resolution No. R-130-06; and requiring annual impact reports from the County Mayor

**Subject:** Resolution Retroactively Authorizing the Community Services Department's Project DADS—Developing and Advancing Dads for Success; Authorizing Designated Purchase Contracts for Subcontractors of Project DADS

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**This item was amended during the March 9, 2026, meeting of the Safety and Health Committee to require the administration to prepare and provide to the Board with an annual impact report for the Project DADS program. Conforming changes were made to the title.**

## Executive Summary

The Community Services Department's (CSD) Head Start Program is the nation's third-largest and accredited by the National Head Start Association as a Program of Excellence, recognized for its continuous delivery high-quality early childhood education and empowering families toward economic self-sufficiency. The Head Start Program currently serves over 7,700 children from birth to age five, and their families, across each County Commission District of Miami-Dade County (County) through child care centers at CSD facilities or operated by small businesses, by community-based organizations that provide direct and wraparound services, and at locations within Miami-Dade County Public Schools.

Project DADS was developed in response to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) Family, Opportunity, Resilience, Grit, Engagement, or FORGE, Fatherhood initiative which seeks to inspire responsible fatherhood by funding projects that focus on healthy marriage, responsible parenting, and economic stability. Project DADS complements the Head Start Program's two-generation model through a No-Wrong-Door-approach centered on providing targeted services to the Program's fathers—many of whom face barriers such as underemployment, reentry challenges, or limited parenting support. Through curriculum-based workshops, intensive case management, and workforce development partnerships, Project DADS will strengthen engagement between fathers and their children, promote economic mobility, and enhance family stability. This integration expands the support network for Head Start families and directly improves child outcomes.

Retroactive approval is being sought from the Board of County Commissioners (Board) for CSD's application for, acceptance, and receipt of \$3,516,715 in grant funding over a five-year grant period. It is recommended that the Board accept the request for the award of designated purchase contracts to two subcontractors for this grant program as these entities were included as part of the application for funding and are the only entities in the County that met the grant criteria for their respective roles. It is further recommended to waive the requirements of Resolution No. R-130-06 and provide authorization for the County Mayor or County Mayor's

designee to apply for future grant funds for the project, and to enter into agreements and documents necessary for the receipt and expenditure of grant funds for a period of ten years from the effective date of this resolution to ensure that this critical work can continue in the County and further improve child outcomes.

**Recommendation**

It is recommended that the Board approve the attached resolution which:

- 1) Retroactively approves and authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee's application for, acceptance, and receipt of grant funds from HHS, in an amount of \$703,343 for the initial year of the grant, and in a total funding amount of \$3,516,715 over a five-year grant period, beginning on September 30, 2025, and ending on September 29, 2030, to implement Project DADS with fathers and father-figures of children enrolled in the Head Start Program.
- 2) Authorizes the County Mayor or County's Mayor designee to expend such grant funds for Project DADS, and approves a designated purchase pursuant to Section 2-8.1(b)(3) of the Code of Miami-Dade County (Code), by two-thirds vote of the Board members present, for sub-grant awards to two subcontractors providing services for Project DADS: (i) the Miami Dade Family Learning Partnership, Inc., a non-profit, 501(c)(3) organization, for up to \$250,000 over the course of the five-year grant period, for costs associated with the delivery of the Incredible Years Parenting Curriculum, inclusive of co-parenting and relationship-building sessions; (ii) an agreement with South Florida Workforce Investment Board d/b/a CareerSource South Florida (CSSF), for up to \$300,000 over the course of the five-year grant period, to conduct workforce development and employment services training, inclusive of job readiness, on-the-job training, paid apprenticeships, and post-employment case management.
- 3) Authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to apply for, accept, receive, and expend additional future grant funds that may become available for Project DADS, for up to 10 years from the effective date of this resolution, provided that future grant applications do not commit County funds, other than in kind.
- 4) Authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute agreements and documents necessary for the receipt and expenditure of the Project DADS grant funds, following review and approval for form and legal sufficiency by the County Attorney's Office, and authorizes the County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee to exercise the provisions set forth in any such agreements and documents, including termination and amendment provisions, provided that any such amendments do not alter the purpose of project, extend the term of any such agreements beyond the term authorized herein, or commit County funds other than in kind.
- 5) Waives the requirements of Resolution No. R-130-06, requiring all non-governmental entities to execute agreements prior to presentation to this Board for approval for the reasons stated below.

- 6) Directs the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to prepare and provide to this Board an annual impact report for the Project DADS program, and to place the completed report on an agenda of the full Board without committee review pursuant to rule 5.06(j) of the Board's Rules of Procedure.

**Scope**

The scope of the resolution is countywide.

**Delegation of Authority**

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority set forth in the recommendation section above.

**Fiscal Impact/Funding Source**

There is no anticipated negative fiscal impact to the County's General Fund through the approval of this resolution.

**Track Record/Monitor**

CSD will use grant funds to expand the quality of family engagement services offered to Head Start families. Cathy Burgos, LCSW, CSD Director, or her designee(s) will oversee all work resulting from this resolution.

**Background**

Recognizing the critical role fathers play in the development and well-being of children, the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Administration for Children and Families, Office of Family Assistance released the FORGE Fatherhood Notice of Funding Opportunity on February 3, 2025. In alignment with this national priority, CSD developed Project DADS and submitted its respective grant application; CSD was awarded funding on September 30, 2025.

CSD's Family and Community Services Division will be leveraging its specialized job training personnel to provide employability skills training and job placement assistance to fathers and father-figures participating in Project DADS. This continuum of assistance will include individualized assessments to (i) ascertain the employment readiness of participants, (ii) provide targeted coaching through mock interviews and the teaching of interview techniques such as the structured STAR (Situation, Task, Action, Result) method, useful for behavioral interview questions, and (iii) facilitating connections with identified job opportunities that align with the skill set and goals of these fathers and father-figures. This employability skills training will also cover topics such as resume preparation, job search strategies and methodology, and workplace etiquette and professionalism norms and practices.

**Designated Purchase**

Approval of a designated purchase is being requested pursuant to Section 2-8.1(b)(3) of the Code of Miami-Dade County (Code), by two-thirds vote of the Board members present, to award Miami Dade Family Learning Partnership, Inc. and South Florida Workforce Investment Board d/b/a CSSF with contracts for parenting curriculum training for Project DADS and

workforce development. These providers were included in the County grant application to meet the requirements of the grant, which requires that programs provide parenting trainings for fathers. Miami Dade Family Learning Partnership, Inc., a non-profit, 501(c)(3) organization, has provided these trainings for some Head Start families for over ten years through grants funded by The Children's Trust, have the capacity to extend these services to Project DADS as part of this project, and have the knowledge and expertise to meet the parenting requirements for this sub-grant. The grant also requires that recipients partner with at least two employment-focused organizations in the community, such as a local American Job Center or other training and/or employment program funded under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA). CSSF is the only entity in Miami-Dade County that meets this requirement. A designated purchase is in the best interest of the County in order to implement the key components of this grant.

A waiver of Resolution No. R-130-06, which requires all legislation seeking contract approval to be fully negotiated and executed by non-County parties before being placed on the Board agenda, is necessary due to timing constraints. The funding notice from DHHS was received in September 2025, but a federal government shutdown delayed access to grant information until November 9, 2025. This impeded the program from signing the cooperative agreement with DHHS in order to begin the program. These delays are coupled with the need to begin program implementation in order to meet the grant requirements. The sub-contracts are being negotiated simultaneously with the preparation of this item.

**Due Diligence**

Pursuant to Resolution No. R-187-12, due diligence was conducted in accordance with the Strategic Procurement Department's Procurement Guidelines to determine contractor responsibility, including verifying corporate status and that there are no performance or compliance issues. The lists that were referenced included convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There were no adverse findings relating to contractor responsibility for the two subcontractors being recommended for grant contracts.

**Applicable Ordinances and Contract Measures**

- The two percent User Access Program, section 2-8.10 of the Code, does not apply.
- The Small Business Enterprise measures and Local Preference do not apply.
- The Living Wage does not apply.

**Section 3.** Authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to expend such grant funds for Project DADS, and approves a designated purchase pursuant to Section 2-8.1(b)(3) of the Code of Miami-Dade County ("Code"), by two-thirds vote of the Board members present, for sub-grant awards to two subcontractors providing services for Project DADS: (i) the Miami Dade Family Learning Partnership, Inc., a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization, for up to \$250,000.00 over the course of the five-year grant period for costs associated with the delivery of the Incredible Years Parenting Curriculum, inclusive of co-parenting and relationship-building sessions; and (ii) the South Florida Workforce Investment Board, d/b/a CareerSource South Florida, for up to \$300,000.00 over the course of five-year grant period to conduct workforce development and employment services training, inclusive of job readiness, on-the-job training, paid apprenticeships, and post-employment case management.

**Section 5.** Authorizes the County Mayor or the County Mayor’s designee to execute agreements and documents necessary for the receipt and expenditure of the Project DADS grant funds, following review and approval for form and legal sufficiency by the County Attorney’s Office, and to exercise the provisions set forth in such agreements and documents, including termination and amendment provisions, provided that any such amendments do not alter the purpose of Project DADS, extend the term of any such agreements beyond the term authorized herein, or commit County funds other than in kind.

**Section 6.** Waives the requirements of Resolution No. R-130-06, requiring all non-governmental entities to execute agreements prior to presentation to this Board for approval for the reasons stated in the accompanying memorandum.

>>**Section 7.** Directs the County Mayor or County Mayor’s designee to prepare and provide to this Board an annual impact report for the Project DADS program, and to place the completed report on an agenda of the full Board without committee review pursuant to rule 5.06(j) of the Board’s Rules of Procedure.<<<sup>1</sup>
