**Subject:** FY 2025-26 Second Quarter Federal and State Funding Report – Directive No. 240752

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## **Executive Summary**

The FY 2025-26 Second Quarter Federal and State Funding Report is submitted in response to Resolution No. R-333-24, adopted by the Board of County Commissioners (Board) on April 16, 2024, and sponsored by Commissioner Danielle Cohen Higgins. The resolution requested a quarterly report detailing (i) the total amount of state and federal funding secured by Miami-Dade County (County) through grants and other allocations since 2020, and (ii) all state and federal grants for which the County has submitted an application and its status.

Between the period of January 1, 2020, and March 31, 2026, the County has been awarded approximately \$6.4 billion in federal funding and \$732.4 million in state funding.

The attached report includes federal and state grants along with other allocations awarded and applied for during the second quarter of FY 2025-26. During this quarter, the County was awarded \$3.2 million in federal awards and \$8.2 million in state awards. As of March 31, 2026, the County has approximately \$485.1 million in pending federal applications and approximately \$347.5 million in pending state applications.

Additionally, included below is a summary of proposed revisions to 2 CFR Part 200, commonly known as the Uniform Guidance, and their potential future implications for Miami-Dade County. On May 29, 2026, the U.S. Office of Management and Budget issued proposed revisions to the Uniform Guidance, which governs federal discretionary grants and pass-through grants where funding originates from a federal agency. The proposed revisions have a target implementation date of October 1, 2026. The County continues to take proactive steps to ensure alignment with evolving federal requirements. Several proposed changes, including broader discretionary termination provisions, the addition of agency and political appointee pre-award review standards, and additional compliance and reporting requirements could negatively impact future federal and pass-through grant awards. It is important to note, my administration is preparing comments in response to the proposed revisions ahead of the July 13, 2026 public comment deadline. These comments will advocate for clear, consistent, and administrable requirements that preserve accountability while minimizing unintended impacts on local governments and the communities they serve.

## **Background**

The attached report is organized alphabetically by the granting organization and identifies any applicable pass-through agencies. Additional details include: (i) award or requested amount, (ii) amount of matching funds (cash or value of in-kind services and source if applicable), (iii) County department responsible for the award or request, (iv) project title and brief description, and (v) start date of award (if applicable). The report is based on available data entered by County departments into the Grants Information Management System (GIMS), a database of grant and other federal and state funding information developed by the Communications, Information and Technology Department (CITD) and managed by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB).

**Proposed Uniform Guidance Rule Changes**

On May 29, 2026, the U.S. Office of Management and Budget published proposed revisions to 2 CFR Part 200, commonly known as the Uniform Guidance, which establishes the government-wide framework for the administration of federal grants. The proposed rule represents the most significant change to federal grants administration since the Uniform Guidance was established in 2013. Changes include the centralization of federal grants policy under the U.S. Office of Management and Budget through binding agency-wide regulation, replacing agencies' discretion to tailor grant provisions; increased oversight of competitive and discretionary grant awards, including pre-award reviews by senior political appointees; expanded agency authority to terminate certain grants; codification of several recent Executive Orders and policy directives into grant requisites; and increased compliance, reporting, and oversight requirements for grant recipients.

The Uniform Guidance applies to discretionary, mandatory, and appropriated federal funding awarded to grantees; awarded to states and other agencies that are then passed through to grantees; and subrecipients and contractors who receive any portion of direct or pass-through awarded funds.

The County continues to take proactive steps to ensure alignment with evolving federal requirements. The most consequential change is the proposed expansion of discretionary termination authority and the introduction of broader policy-based review standards. The proposed rule introduces greater uncertainty regarding continuation funding, future funding increments, and the potential impact of changing federal priorities on multi-year projects.

Miami-Dade County enters this environment with significant advantages, including strong grants management protocols, mature financial systems, established procurement and compliance processes, standardized procedures, multi-layered grants oversight, and extensive experience executing large and complex federal awards. Miami-Dade County is well-positioned to adapt to these changes and, through early preparation and coordinated action, may strengthen its competitive position relative to many peer jurisdictions.

It is important to note this is an initial summary of the proposed rule changes, which may undergo further revisions prior to the target implementation date of October 1, 2026. The County's Office of Management and Budget will continue to monitor these changes and provide training and technical assistance to County departments once final regulations are issued.
