Operation of Micromobility Devices, Electric Bicycles, and Motorized Scooters –

This ordinance re-establishes Section 2-98.3 of the Code of Miami-Dade County to regulate the operation of micromobility devices, electric bicycles, and motorized scooters on County-maintained roads and sidewalks along Crandon Boulevard between the northern limits of the Village of Key Biscayne and the northern entrance to Bill Baggs Cape Florida State Park. The prior ordinance creating this section expired pursuant to its two-year sunset provision. This ordinance substantially re-establishes the existing regulatory framework and includes a new two-year sunset provision. It does not create new operational requirements.

The ordinance expressly provides that it should not be construed as a determination that the operation of micromobility devices, electric bicycles, or motorized scooters on roads or public sidewalks is safe or advisable. Rather, operators continue to assume responsibility for operating these devices safely and in compliance with applicable laws.

Social Equity Statement

The principal social benefit of this ordinance is the promotion of public safety. The affected portion of Crandon Boulevard serves as a heavily traveled recreational corridor used by motorists, bicyclists, pedestrians, and micromobility users accessing beaches, parks, and other public amenities. Re-establishing the existing regulatory framework provides clear operating rules intended to reduce conflicts among roadway and sidewalk users, improve the orderly movement of traffic, and support consistent enforcement within the limited area where the ordinance applies.

Because this ordinance primarily renews an existing temporary regulatory framework without materially changing its substantive provisions, no additional social benefits or burdens can be determined at this time.

Fiscal Impact Statement

It is not anticipated that this ordinance will have a fiscal impact to the County. Enforcement of the ordinance will continue to be carried out by existing entities within the unincorporated and incorporated areas using current personnel and operational resources.
