RESOLUTION CODESIGNATING THAT PORTION OF
SOUTHWEST 84TH STREET BETWEEN SOUTHWEST 97TH
ROAD AND SOUTHWEST 103RD AVENUE AS “SERGEANT
DAVID CAJUSO WAY”

WHEREAS, on October 28, 2025, Sergeant David Cajuso (“Sergeant Cajuso”) of the Miami Beach Police Department was tragically killed in a motorcycle crash on Interstate 75 in Hialeah; and

WHEREAS, he was only 33 years old; and

WHEREAS, for the last 10 years, Sergeant Cajuso had served the Miami Beach Police Department with unwavering dedication and professionalism, and above all, with a type of compassion that truly set him apart; and

WHEREAS, Sergeant Cajuso embodied the highest ideals of law enforcement, earning the admiration of his peers and the gratitude of the community he served; and

WHEREAS, his fellow officers remember him as the first to lend a hand, offer guidance, and go the extra mile to support others; and

WHEREAS, throughout his distinguished career, Sergeant Cajuso played an instrumental role in fostering trust between law enforcement and the community; and

WHEREAS, his approach to policing went far beyond enforcement, as it was anchored with an insightfulness into humanity and a belief that the heart of public safety begins with connection and acknowledging the worth and dignity of every person served; and

WHEREAS, Sergeant Cajuso’s kindness and integrity left a lasting impression, not only on his fellow officers, but on everyone that had the honor to know him; and

WHEREAS, his sacrifice in the line of duty serves as a powerful reminder of the profound risks faced each day by those who dedicate their lives to protecting our communities; and

WHEREAS, beyond his service, Sergeant Cajuso was a devoted husband, loving father, beloved son, brother, and friend whose heart overflowed with love for his family; and

WHEREAS, the loss of Sergeant Cajuso leaves a deep void in the hearts of family, friends, fellow officers, and the broader community, but his legacy will continue to inspire those who had the privilege of knowing him and serving beside him; and

WHEREAS, this Board would like to honor the memory and service of Sergeant Cajuso by codesignating that portion of Southwest 84th Street between Southwest 97th Road and Southwest 103rd Avenue as “Sergeant David Cajuso Way”; and

WHEREAS, that portion of Southwest 84th Street between Southwest 97th Road and Southwest 103rd Avenue is a County-maintained road located in unincorporated Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, this proposed codesignation is located in County Commission District 10,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Having considered this matter at a public hearing, codesignates that portion of Southwest 84th Street between Southwest 97th Road and Southwest 103rd Avenue as “Sergeant David Cajuso Way”.

Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the United States Postal Service, the Traffic Signals and Signs Division of the Department of Transportation and Public Works, the Development Services Division of the Regulatory and Economic Resources Department, the Miami-Dade Sheriff’s Office, and the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department.

The Co-Prime Sponsors of the foregoing resolution are Chairman Anthony Rodriguez and Commissioner Roberto J. Gonzalez. It was offered by Commissioner _____, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner _____ and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
