# Multi-Year Capital Plan Project

<u>Item 1</u> – Recommendation to Award for Design-Build Services for the Installation of a 36-Inch Diameter Sanitary Sewer Force Main along 107 Avenue from N.W. 7 Street to N.W. 25 Street – Project No. DB18-WASD-01; Contract No. 19RMII003. This item requests ratification of a contract in the total amount of \$9,680,189.87 with a total contract term of 770 calendar days to Ric-Man International. Inc.

The total compensation amount shall not exceed \$9,680,189.87 with a total term of 770 calendar days.

## **EXPLANATION:**

On August 7, 2018, a Request for Design-Build Services (RDBS) was issued under full and open competition. On October 12, 2018, the Clerk of the Board received five (5) proposals in response to this solicitation. See attached Exhibit "E", "List of Respondents".

On November 26, 2018, SBD completed its review for compliance with SBE contract measures as noted above and determined that all five (5) firms were in compliance with the submittal requirements. See attached Exhibit "F", "SBD Compliance Review".

# Step 1

At the Step 1 "Evaluation of Qualifications" meeting held on February 7, 2019, the Competitive Selection Committee reviewed and ranked the five (5) proposers. The Competitive Selection Committee voted to short-list the top three (3) firms. See attached Exhibit "G", "Step 1 Tabulation Report".

## Step 2

The Step 2 "Technical and Price Proposal" meeting (Oral Presentation) was held on August 27, 2019. The Competitive Selection Committee recommended that the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee approve negotiations with Ric-Man International, Inc. as the highest ranked and responsive proposer. See attached Exhibit "H", "Step 2 Tabulation Report".

# SCOPE OF SERVICES AND EXPERIENCE AND QUALIFICATIONS

The scope of services shall include, but is not limited to, surveying, geotechnical investigations, engineering, design, technical specifications, permitting, construction, testing and commissioning services, and customer coordination for a new 36-inch sanitary sewer force main. The project consists of replacing the existing 24-inch force main on N.W. 107 Avenue from south of N.W. 7 Street to N.W. 25 Street with a new 36-inch force main, connecting existing force main laterals into the new 36-inch force main, and tie-in of the new 36-inch force main into the existing force main system in order to reduce system operating pressures and increase system capacity within the area.

The Project includes the following main elements:

- Furnishing and installing approximately 7,900 linear feet of 36-inch diameter ductile iron
  pipe with ceramic epoxy lining for sanitary sewer force main service. Pipe material shall
  be in accordance with the American Water Works Association Standard C151;
- Furnishing and installing all ancillary piping, tie-in connections and temporary bypass pumping and piping, required to facilitate successful construction and commissioning of the new 36-inch force main without any interruption of service to existing WASD customers;
- Furnishing and installing a 48-inch diameter steel casing under an active railroad using trenchless construction installation;
- Providing jacking and receiving pits for the trenchless casing and carrier pipe installation;
- Furnishing and installing 36-inch carrier pipe, casing spacers and ancillary materials for trenchless installation;
- Connecting to the existing 36-inch force mains along N.W. 107 Avenue, south of N.W. 7
   Street, and making connection using solid sleeve adapters;
- Connecting to existing 20-inch force main along N.W. 25 Street with tapping valve, tapping sleeve and reducer;
- Providing all required valves and piping to facilitate connection of the existing force mains to the new 36-inch force main;
- · Constructing access manhole assemblies, as required by the Contract Documents;
- Providing air release valve assemblies at all high points on the new force main and tributary force mains, as required by the Contract Documents;
- Relocating existing utilities in conflict with the alignment of the force main, as required by the Contract Documents;
- Removing, transporting, salvaging and/or legally disposing of construction and demolition materials, including asphalt pavement, concrete pavement, miscellaneous concrete, unsuitable backfill material, pipe, valves and sod;
- · Sheeting and shoring ordered left in place by the Design-Builder;
- Furnishing and placing suitable backfill for pipe bedding and backfill, as required by the Contract Documents;
- Constructing and restoring pedestrian curb ramps and detectable warning surfaces, temporary and permanent replacement or relocation of any utilities, pavement, sidewalk, curb and gutter, valley gutter, tree, landscaping, sod, pavement markings, and/or driveway damaged during construction to a condition equal to or better than at the start of construction;
- Furnishing all materials, equipment, supplies and labor necessary for cleaning, testing, commissioning and placing the new force mains into service;
- Upon completion and acceptance of the new work, abandoning in-place an existing 24inch force main, including dewatering of the existing sewage force main, hauling and legal
  disposal of wastewater, cleaning of the existing pipe and filling of the existing pipe with
  grout;

- Designing, permitting and maintaining all required vehicle and pedestrian traffic control measures; and
- Providing all other appurtenant and miscellaneous items and work for a complete and fully functional installation.
- Milling & Resurfacing N.W. 107 Avenue from N.W. 12 Street to N.W. 25 Street per Department of Transportation and Public Works Specs and the Florida Department of Transportation.

The Design-Builder must complete the Work within the durations specified below, which exclude the warranty administration period:

Substantial Completion on or before 640 calendar days after the date of Notice to Proceed which requires placing into service all new force mains and connections within the public right-of-way and shall include all work associated with surveying, geotechnical investigations, engineering, design, technical specifications, permitting, construction, testing and commissioning services for the complete and fully operational installation of the new 36-inch diameter force main and reopening all roads and sidewalks to traffic.

Final Completion and Project Closeout on or before 700 calendar days after the date of Notice to Proceed which requires Final Completion and Project Closeout: including obtaining acceptance by all applicable regulatory agencies including WASD, of all Work and Services under the Contract, including all remaining site restorations, record documents, and all other remaining incomplete or unacceptable work items identified at or subsequent to Substantial Completion

If the Design-Builder does not achieve Substantial Completion by the established Substantial Completion Contract Date, Liquidated Damages (LDs) will be assessed in the amount of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) per calendar day, which will be paid to the County by the Design-Builder. If the Design-Builder does not achieve Final Completion by the established Final Completion Contract Date, LDs will be assessed in the amount of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) per calendar day, which will be paid to the County by the Design-Builder. LDs will be cumulative if both the Substantial Completion Contract Date and the Final Completion Contract Date are exceeded. All assessments of LDs to the Design-Builder may be adjustments to payments due to the Design-Builder.

# **EXPERIENCE AND QUALIFICATIONS**

Proposed Design-Builder shall demonstrate its Project team experience by presenting the qualifications and capabilities of each Design-Build Team member firm, for projects completed within the last ten (10) years from the date of the solicitation, including projects that may be at least fifty percent (50%) complete prior to the required submittal date of this Request Design-Build Services (RDBS) Step 1 solicitation, that demonstrate related minimum project experience as indicated below:

Qualifications and Experience of Lead Constructor(s):

- a. Construction firm shall demonstrate that it has performed open cut installation work must have a minimum of five (5) years total industry experience from the date of this solicitation. It also must have successfully constructed at least one (1) pressure pipeline project of similar size and complexity in an urban environment consisting of minimum 36-inch nominal diameter pipe.
- b. Construction firm shall demonstrate that it has constructed trenchless installation of the casing pipe of at least one (1) trenchless project utilizing a similar construction method and

consisting of Jacking similar type of casing pipe selected by the Design-Build team for this project, and completed a minimum of one (1) separate trenchless installations. To qualify, each of these installations must have been a minimum of four (4) feet internal diameter in soft ground below the groundwater and at least one (1) of the installations completed in ground conditions similar to those expected to be encountered on this project.

c. Construction firm performing the shaft construction shall have successfully constructed at least one (1) shaft(s) that was at least twenty-five (25) feet below the ground surface. At least one (1) of these shaft(s) must have been extended below groundwater and required means of controlling inflow and bottom heave of the shaft.

Qualifications and Experience of Lead Designer(s):

- a. The Lead Designer firm performing the design of the force main must have a minimum of five (5) years total industry experience from the date of this solicitation. It also must have designed at least one (1) pressure pipeline projects in an urban environment consisting of a minimum thirty-six (36) inch nominal diameter.
- b. The Lead Designer firm who will design the trenchless installation of the casing pipe must have designed at least one (1) trenchless project consisting of jacking a similar type of casing pipe selected by the Design-Build team for this project. The reference projects shall have minimum four (4) foot diameter casing pipe or larger. The following project experience is highly preferred and will be scored accordingly:

Qualifications and Experience of construction firm or specialty subcontractor performing the work:

- a. Construction firm **or specialty subcontractor performing the work** should demonstrate that it has performed open cut installation work and should have a minimum of five (5) years total industry experience from the date of this solicitation. 


