Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) authorize additional expenditure authority to *Contract No. ITB-18-048-HR, Milk and Dairy Products*, for multiple County departments. The departments are requesting additional expenditure authority of \$1,438,000 and approval to exercise two, one-year options to renew to continue supporting departmental operations. Board approval of this item is required as the cumulative contract allocation will exceed the Mayor's delegated authority.

The Miami-Dade Corrections and Rehabilitation Department purchases milk and dairy products to serve approximately 4,000 inmates per day at its three correctional facilities; and the Community Action and Human Services provides milk and dairy products to domestic violence clients seeking shelter at its facilities. The milk and dairy products purchased under this contract include low-fat milk, fat-free chocolate milk, skim milk, whole milk, lactose-free milk, soymilk, buttermilk, sour cream and cottage cheese.

The County accessed this competitively solicited Miami-Dade County Public Schools contract in November 2019 under the County Mayor's delegated authority. Additional expenditure authority is needed to support the departments' operational needs through contract expiration and available options to renew. The Miami-Dade Public Schools contract contains every item requested by the County and offers better pricing than most other contracts found via market research.

<u>Scope</u>

The impact of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The initial contract term expires on July 23, 2022 and has an existing allocation of \$500,000. If this request is approved, the initial term will have a modified allocation of \$1,122,000, which includes additional expenditure authority of \$622,000. If the two, one-year options to renew are exercised at \$408,000 per year, the cumulative contract allocation will be \$1,938,000. The requested increase in expenditure authority is based on the annual estimated expenditures of each department.
