Recommendation for Approval of a Designated Purchase, Nyxcell Cellular Tracking

Equipment

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners approve this request for a designated. purchase, Contract No. SS10063, Nyxcell Cellular Tracking Equipment, to Tactical Support Equipment, Inc. (TSE), for the Miami-Dade Police Department (MDPD). Approval of a designated purchase is being requested, pursuant to Section 2-8.1 (b)(3) of the Miami-Dade County Code, to authorize award of a contract that provides the Department with cellular tracking technology which is used to aid criminal investigations, victims of natural disasters, terrorist incidents, and incidents involving an active shooter.

The Department's Telecommunications Unit conducts cellular telephone tracking on behalf of investigative entities and many municipal police departments within Miami-Dade County. This acquisition will provide for the outfitting of police vehicles with the equipment necessary to conduct tracking of cellular devices, and will include a hand-held device which will be used to locate cellular devices in multiunit structures such as apartment complexes and hotels.

This equipment will replace the Department's current cellular tracking technology provided by Harris Corporation under Contract No. GS-35F-0283J-4. Harris Corporation has advised that effective June 2020 they will no longer provide cellular tracking technology and vital software updates. As more cellular network providers upgrade their technology, the current equipment will not be able to access their cellular signals.

Competition for these goods is not practicable because the equipment supplied by TSE is the only cellular tracking technology available to local law enforcement agencies that can simultaneously search multiple cellular bands for active cellular signals, thus allowing for the timely capture of the signal emanating from a target cellular phone. Each piece of equipment provided by TSE is proprietary in nature, works in conjunction with each other, and cannot be combined with products from other manufacturers. Accordingly, it is in the County's best interest to award this designated purchase pursuant to Section 2-8.1(b)(3) of the County Code to acquire the Nyxcell Cellular Tracking Equipment.

The scope of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact for the three-year term is \$593,889. Should the County choose to exercise, at its sole discretion, the two, one-year options to renew, the estimated cumulative value will be \$696,139.

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. This Board finds it is in the best interest of Miami-Dade County to award Contract No. SS10063 for the purchase of Nyxcell Cellular Tracking Equipment to Tactical Support Equipment, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$696,139.00 over the initial three-year term and two, one-year options to renew term for the Miami-Dade Police Department, pursuant to Section 2-8.1(b)(3) of the Code of Miami-Dade County, by a two-thirds vote of the Board members present.

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Section 2. This Board authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to exercise all provisions of the contract pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the County Code and Implementing Order 3-38.
