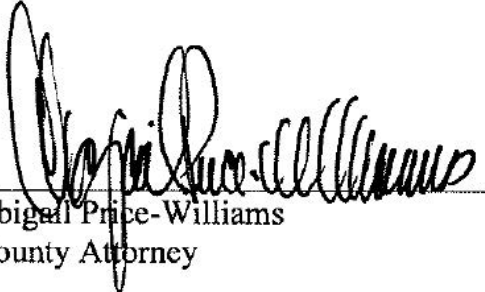

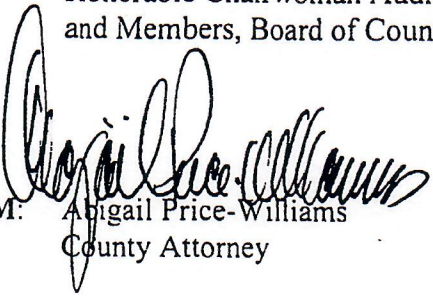

RESOLUTION URGING THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE AND
THE FLORIDA AGENCY FOR HEALTH CARE
ADMINISTRATION TO REQUIRE PERSONAL PROTECTIVE
EQUIPMENT FOR HOME HEALTH WORKERS FOLLOWING
THE SPREAD OF CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 (COVID-19)

WHEREAS, during the April 7, 2020, meeting of the Board of County Commissioners a motion was made to urge the Florida Legislature and the Florida Agency for Health Care Administration to require personal protective equipment for home health workers following the spread of coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19), including without limitation nurses, therapists, social workers, aides, certified nursing assistants, and companions,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Urges the Florida Legislature and the Agency for Health Care Administration to require personal protective equipment for home health workers following the spread of COVID-19, including without limitation nurses, therapists, social workers, aides, certified nursing assistants, and companions.

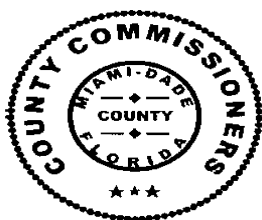
Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Governor, Senate President, House Speaker, the Chair and Members of the Miami-Dade Legislative Delegation, the Florida Surgeon General, and the Secretary for the Agency for Health Care Administration.

Section 3. Directs the County's lobbyist to advocate for the legislative action set forth in section 1 above and authorizes and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to amend the 2020 State Legislative Package to include this item, and to include this item in the 2021 State Legislative Package when it is presented to the Board.
