Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) ratify the action of the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee, pursuant to Miami-Dade Aviation Department's (MDAD) Ordinance No. 95-64, codified as Section 2-285(3) of the Code of Miami-Dade County in executing the First Amendment for MDAD Project No. E15-MDAD-03, as identified herein and in Exhibit A, as attached.

First Amendment

The First Amendment amends the Professional Services Agreement (PSA) between Miami-Dade County and Bureau Veritas North America, Inc. for Environmental and Safety Management System Consulting Services, Project No. E15-MDAD-03.

On February 12, 2020, the First Amendment was executed and filed with the Clerk of the Board. The First Amendment effectuates the reassignment of responsibility for all the rights, obligations, interests and liabilities specified in the PSA from Bureau Veritas North America, Inc. to Apex Companies, LLC., who purchased the Health, Safety and Environmental Division of Bureau Veritas North America, Inc.

No additional monies are being requested in the First Amendment, therefore, there is no fiscal impact to the County.

Scope

The impact of the First Amendment is countywide as it involves the County's airport system.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

There is no fiscal impact to the County as stated above and in Exhibit A.

Track Record/Monitoring

MDAD's Division Director of Civil Environmental Engineering, Nancy B. Pantoja Kirtland, will oversee implementation of the First Amendment.

Apex Companies, LLC has no evaluations in the Internal Services Department's Capital Improvements Information System (CIIS) database as the firm has no previous contracts with the County within the past three years. Apex Companies, LLC does have a local office located at 8175 N.W. 12 Street, Doral, Florida 33126.

Background

On April 6, 1995, the Board approved Ordinance No. 95-64 delegating to the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee, among other authorities, the authority to issue amendments to a PSA after such PSA is awarded by the Board. On November 1, 2016, the Board adopted Resolution No. R-963-16 awarding a PSA entitled: Professional Services Agreement to Bureau Veritas North America, Inc. for Environmental and Safety Management System Consulting Services; MDAD Project No. E15-MDAD-03.

The Internal Services Department's Small Business Development (SBD) Division established a 15 percent Small Business Enterprise – Architectural/Engineering (SBE A/E) goal for MDAD Project No. E15-MDAD-03. On January 14, 2020, SBD issued a memorandum (attached as Exhibit B) finding that that Bureau Veritas North America, Inc. is in compliance with Resolution No. R-1001-15, which requires that County contracts with small business measures meet at least 85 percent of the small business goals applicable to contract work performed to date before a contract amendment is considered.

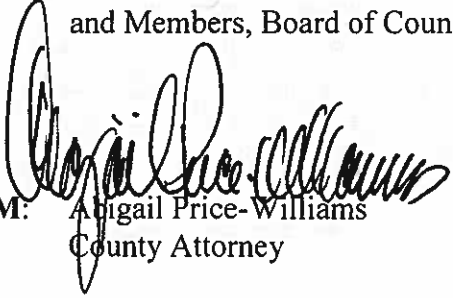

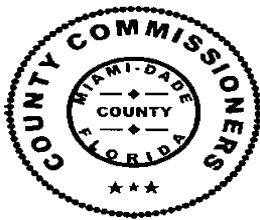
WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum and documents, copies of which are incorporated herein by reference,

Project No. E15-MDAD-03, Environmental and Safety Management System, was reviewed for compliance with the 15% Small Business Enterprise - Architectural and Engineering (SBE-A/E) goal. To date, the prime has requisitioned \$378,122 requiring \$56,718 in SBE-A/E participation for compliance with the goal based on dollars performed to date.

Resolution No. R-1001-15 requires County contracts with small business measures meet at least 85 percent of the small business goals applicable to the contract work performed to date before a change order or contract amendment is considered for Board approval. Resolution R-525-17 exempted change orders or amendments for non-compensatory time extensions only from this requirement. The SBE-A/E meeting the goal has performed \$66,671 and is currently in compliance with the 15% SBE-A/E goal and Resolution R-1001-15.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE
PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY AND
BUREAU VERITAS NORTH AMERICA, INC.
FOR ENVIRONMENTAL AND SAFETY MANAGEMENT SYSTEM
CONSULTING SERVICES
PROJECT NO. E15-MDAD-03

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA AND BUREAU VERITAS NORTH AMERICA, INC, is hereby made and entered into this 12th day of February, 2020 by and between MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as the "County or Owner", BUREAU VERITAS NORTH AMERICA, INC., hereinafter referred to as "BVNA", and Apex Companies, LLC, a Delaware corporation authorized to do business in the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as "Apex", and collectively referred to as the "Parties".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. R-963-16, passed and adopted by the Board of County Commissioners ("Board"), a Professional Services Agreement was awarded for Environmental and Safety Management System Consulting Services ("Agreement") for the Miami-Dade Aviation Department to Bureau Veritas North America, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, substantially all of BVNA's Health, Safety and Environmental Division has been purchased by Apex, and the operations and obligations of BVNA pursuant to the sale are being assumed by Apex; and

WHEREAS, BVNA has agreed to assign, and Apex has agreed to accept, assignment upon the terms and conditions contained herein, of any and all rights, title, obligations, and interests BVNA may have in and to the Agreement;

WHEREAS, the County desires to amend the Agreement to allow for the assignment of the Agreement as hereinafter set forth.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises contained herein, the Parties hereto agree as follows:

1. Add the following to the end of Sub-article 3.3, Assignment:

"Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, this Agreement may be assigned by BVNA to Apex with the prior written consent of the County. "

2. The County consents to the assignment of all of BVNA's rights and obligations as the Architect/Engineer under the Agreement to Apex, and agrees that Apex shall be deemed the Architect/Engineer under the Agreement.
3. Apex assumes all of the rights, liabilities, and obligations of the Architect/Engineer under the Agreement, including with respect to all work previously performed by BVNA.
4. All compensation due and payable under the Agreement after the date of this First Amendment shall be made payable to Apex.
5. Apex shall assume any and all liability to the County for any claim arising under the Agreement, whether such claim accrued before or after this Assignment. Apex shall indemnify and hold harmless the Owner from any and all claims by BVNA under the Agreement pursuant to the terms of this Agreement.
6. In all other respects, the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect in accordance with the terms and conditions specified herein.
7. This First Amendment shall become effective as of the date first written above.
