Subject: Resolution Approving Amendment Number One to Non-Exclusive Professional Services Agreement Number 14CH2M006 with Jacobs Engineering Group, Inc. for Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department's Project No. E13-WASD-011 and Exercising the Six-Year Option-to-Renew

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the attached resolution authorizing execution of Amendment Number One to Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department's (WASD) Non-Exclusive Professional Services Agreement Number 14CH2M006 (Agreement); Project No. E13-WASD-11 with Jacobs Engineering Group, Inc. (previously known as CH2M Hill, Inc.) in order to continue to provide services as the Owner's Representative for Professional Engineering Services related to the State of Florida's Ocean Outfall Legislation and the Miami-Dade County Wastewater System. Amendment Number One exercises the six-year option-to-renew in the Agreement and extends the contract from October 29, 2020 to October 29, 2026 with no additional compensation added.

Delegation of Authority

The authority of the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute and implement Amendment Number One to Agreement No. 14CH2M006 is consistent with those authorities granted under the Code of Miami-Dade County. Resolution No. R-936-14, adopted October 14, 2014, approved the award of Agreement 14CH2M006 to Jacobs and required the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to seek approval from the Board prior to exercising the option-to-renew.

Scope

Jacobs Engineering Group, Inc. (Jacobs) is providing engineering services related to the State of Florida's Ocean Outfall Legislation and the Miami-Dade County Wastewater System and has countywide significance.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

There will be no fiscal impact from entering into Amendment Number One.

Track Record/Monitor

WASD's Deputy Director Hardeep Anand will monitor the implementation of Amendment Number One.

Background

On June 30, 2008, Governor Charlie Crist signed Senate Bill 1302 related to wastewater disposal/ocean outfalls (Section 403.086(9) of the Florida Statutes) (the "Ocean Outfall Legislation"). This law requires all southeast Florida utilities utilizing ocean outfalls for disposal of treated wastewater to:

- Eliminate the normal use of ocean outfalls by the end of 2025, except for peak flow management not to exceed five percent of the annual baseline, as amended in 2013;
- Reduce nutrient discharges by implementing advanced wastewater treatment by 2018 or equivalent; and
- Reuse sixty percent of the wastewater flows by 2025.

The Ocean Outfall Legislation relates to Miami-Dade County because the County has two ocean outfalls—one is located at the North District Wastewater Treatment Plant and the other is located at the Central District Wastewater Treatment Plant. Both ocean outfalls are used by WASD.

With the submittal of a five-year Progress Report and 2019 Updated Ocean Outfall Legislation Compliance Plan to the Florida Department of Environmental Protection on December 30, 2019, the planning phase of the Ocean Outfall Program has been completed, and design and construction are currently on-going. As presented in the 2019 Compliance Plan, in order to comply with the Ocean Outfall Legislation, the County's Ocean Outfall Legislation Program is comprised of 22 major projects located at the three wastewater treatment plants. Of the 22 projects, thirteen projects are located at the North District and Central District Wastewater Treatment Plants with a total expected cost of approximately \$1.5 billion. Of those thirteen projects, one is completed, two are under construction, eight are in the design phase, and two are in pre-design. Of the 22 projects, nine projects are located at the South District Wastewater Treatment Plant for capacity expansion with a total expected cost of approximately \$650 million. Of those nine, one is under construction, one is in procurement, and seven are in design.

On October 14, 2014, this Board adopted Resolution No. R-936-14, which approved award of Agreement No. 14CH2M006 to Jacobs for a total contract amount not to exceed \$139,394,748.00 over a twelve-year period. The contract is structured with a six-year term and one six-year option-to-renew. Resolution No. R-936-14 requires that, in the event the County opts to exercise the option-to-renew, the County Mayor must seek approval of the Board. WASD anticipates completing the Ocean Outfall Program within the compensation already approved by the Board. To that end, Jacobs will submit an annual report with status and accrued and projected expenditures, including SBE goal status, for the projects.

To date, Jacobs has assisted WASD in building an integrated compliance plan and has supervised initial designs to deliver the Ocean Outfall Legislation projects. The South District Wastewater Treatment Plan projects are 90 percent designed and are moving into procurement and construction; the Central District Wastewater Treatment Plant projects are being refined to address cost savings opportunities; and the site wide planning for the North District Wastewater Treatment Plant projects has been completed, and projects at that plant are beginning active design.

As of April 2020, WASD has compensated Jacobs for a total of \$70,434,233.20 or 50 percent of the total contract maximum compensation. It is WASD's intent to continue working with Jacobs to deliver all projects required to meet the Ocean Outfall Legislation within the required time periods as well as the capacity expansion projects at South District Wastewater Treatment Plant. The recommendation to exercise the six-year option to renew set forth in the Agreement will provide continuity and assurance that WASD can work diligently with Jacobs as Owner's Representative. This will include monitoring costs and assignments on a quarterly basis to continually assess the required services for both program completion and legislative compliance.

The Jacobs Team is composed of 21 consulting and engineering firms all of which have a local presence and/or staff, and half of which are SBE firms. As of the latest Monthly Utilization Report, SBE participation is at 15 percent, and on track for compliance at contract completion as depicted in Jacob's SBE expenditure plan. The final compliance will be reviewed at contract completion. The staff currently working on the County's Ocean Outfall Legislation Program totals 79 individuals, who are largely local residents. See attached Exhibit A.

Project No. E13-WASD-11 was reviewed for compliance with the 28% Small Business Enterprise - Architectural and Engineering (SBE-A/E) goal. To date, the prime consultant, Jacobs Engineering, Inc. (Jacobs) has requisitioned \$75,096,327 requiring \$21,026,972 in SBE-A/E Participation for compliance with the goal based on dollars performed to date. The SBE-A/Es meeting the goal have performed \$11,336,024 resulting in a current deficit of \$9,690,948. Final goal compliance will be reviewed at contract completion.

Please note, Resolution No. R-1001-15 requires County contracts with small business measures meet at least 85 percent of the small business goals applicable to the portion(s) of the contract work performed to date before a change order or contract amendment is considered for Board approval. Resolution R-525-17 exempted change orders or amendments for non-compensatory time extensions from this requirement. Amendment No. 1 is for a time extension only, as such R-1001-15 does not apply.

RESOLUTION APPROVING EXECUTION OF AMENDMENT NUMBER ONE TO THE NON-EXCLUSIVE PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY AND JACOBS ENGINEERING GROUP, INC., AGREEMENT NO. 14CH2M006, EXERCISING THE COUNTY'S SIX-YEAR OPTION-TO-RENEW AND EXTENDING THE AGREEMENT FROM OCTOBER 29, 2020 TO OCTOBER 29, 2026 IN ORDER TO ALLOW JACOBS ENGINEERING GROUP, INC. WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

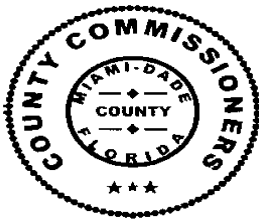
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board hereby approves the execution of Amendment Number One to the Non-Exclusive Professional Services Agreement between Miami-Dade County and Jacobs Engineering Group, Inc., Agreement No. 14CH2M006, in substantially the form attached hereto and made a part hereof. Amendment Number One exercises the County's six-year option-to-renew under the Agreement and extends the contract from October 29, 2020 to October 29, 2026 in order to allow Jacobs Engineering Group, Inc. to continue to perform services as the Owner's Representative for professional engineering services related to the State of Florida's Ocean Outfall Legislation and Miami-Dade

County's wastewater system. The Board also hereby authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute the same and exercise the provisions contained therein for and on behalf of Miami-Dade County, Florida.
