Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) ratify the action of the County Mayor or County Mayor’s designee, as authorized under Section 2-8.2.12 of the Miami-Dade County Code related to Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department’s (WASD) Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance (WASD’s Acceleration Ordinance) for the funded project identified below and on Exhibit A, as attached.

Capital Improvement Project

Item 1 – Recommendation awarding Construction Contract to furnish and install 24-inch Sanitary Force Main along NW 170 Street from NW 97 Avenue to NW 75 Place, Contract No. S-947. This item requests ratification of a contract in the total amount not to exceed \$6,610,730.76 with a total contract period 402 days to Metro Express, Inc.

Scope

The commission district of the project location are noted in Exhibit A. The projects awarded through WASD’s Acceleration Ordinance have a countywide impact.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact and funding source for this project is detailed in Exhibit A and the other accompanying attachments.

Track Record/Monitoring

WASD’s Deputy Director of Capital Improvements, Hardeep Anand, will oversee the implementation of this project.

Due Diligence/Safety Information

Due diligence was conducted by WASD and the Internal Services Department in accordance with ISD’s Procurement Guidelines to determine responsibility, including verifying corporate status; performance; safety record, including Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) records; and compliance data. The lists that were reviewed include: convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There were no

adverse findings related to the Contractor’s responsibility. This information is being provided pursuant to Resolution No. R-187-12.

Background

On September 3, 2014, the Board approved Ordinance No. 14-77 authorizing the County Mayor or County Mayor’s designee to award contracts for funded capital projects and related goods and services, and to accelerate the approval of WASD’s (1) Consent Decree projects and (2) projects identified in WASD Multi-Year Capital Plan’s Capital Improvement Program without the need for prior Board approval but subject to ratification by the Board.

RECOMMENDATION:

Pursuant to the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance, Section 2-8.2.12 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, it is recommended that the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee approve this contract award recommendation to Metro Express, Inc., (hereafter "Metro Express") for Contract No. S-947 to construct a proposed 24-Inch Sanitary Force Main Along NW 170 St. from NW 97 Ave. to NW 75 Place. The total compensation amount is \$6,610,730.76 with a total contract term of 402 days. This contract award recommendation was prepared by the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD).

DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY:

Pursuant to Section 2-8.2.12 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee is authorized to amend and execute the Contract. Pursuant to the provisions of Sections 2-8.2.12 (4)(d) and (e) of the Code, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to amend and/or extend the Contract to complete any unfinished work, waive liquidated damages, negotiate and settle claims, and execute change orders that do not exceed ten percent (10%) of the base contract amount.

PROJECT NAME:

Furnish and Install 24-Inch Sanitary Force Main Along NW 170 St. from NW 97 Ave. to NW 75 Place

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

This project is one in a series of projects that are being processed under Section 2-8.2.12 of the Code, entitled Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance.

The project is for the construction of a 24-inch ductile iron pipe force main along NW 170th Street from NW 97th Avenue to NW 75th Place, in Sections 8, 9, 10, 11, 14, 15, 16 & 17, Township 52S, Range 40E, located in the City of Hialeah and Town of Miami Lakes, in Miami-Dade County, Florida.

The Project, including mobilization and demobilization, consists of furnishing and installing approximately 9,670 linear feet (LF) of 24-inch ductile iron pipe, valves and fittings for a sewage force main along NW 170th Street from 97th Avenue to NW 75th Place, including approximately 497 LF of 42-inch steel casing pipe via microtunneling under Interstate I-75, 496 LF of 24-inch High-Density

Polyethylene (HDPE) via Horizontal Directional Drill (HDD) for the NW 87th Avenue crossing and also approximately 166 LF of a canal crossing of C-1 Canal at NW 75th Place and twelve (12) plug valves. The work includes but is not limited to furnishing and installing the 24-inch pipe segments with restrained joints where required; making one (1) solid sleeve connection to an existing sewage force main including furnishing and installing a solid sleeve (stainless steel) and obtaining the services of a tapping specialist; making one (1) tapping connection to an existing 30-inch sewage force main including furnishing and installing a tapping sleeve (stainless steel) and tapping valve and obtaining the services of a tapping specialist; furnishing and installing two (2) concrete access manholes; furnishing and constructing sixteen (16) automatic air release valve assemblies for sewage force mains; sheeting and shoring ordered left in place by the Engineer; additional suitable backfill, if needed; furnish all materials, equipment and supplies necessary for cleaning and testing the main; tapping, cutting, dewatering, and capping existing sewage force mains; furnishing and constructing reinforced concrete protective slab; removal of existing asphalt pavement, concrete sidewalk and sod; removal, transport and legal disposal of demolition material; replacement of traffic loop detection assemblies; temporary and permanent replacement of any pavement, concrete sidewalk, concrete median, curb and gutter, valley gutter, guardrail and posts, sod, landscaping and pavement markings damaged by the construction of the Project and all other appurtenant and miscellaneous items and work for a complete and fully functional installation.

The lists that were reviewed include: convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There were no adverse findings related to Metro Express. This information is being provided pursuant to Resolution R-187-12.

EXPLANATION:

On April 24, 2020, WASD received and opened seventeen (17) bids (See Bid Tabulation, attached as EXHIBIT "C") in response to an advertisement for an open competitive solicitation for Contract No. S-947, with the lowest eight (8) bids summarized as follows:

Because contract measures were assigned, the lowest three (3) bids were forwarded to Internal Services Department's (ISD) Division of Small Business Development (SBD) for a Compliance Review. On May 6, 2020, SBD issued the results of its Compliance Review. All three (3) firms, Metro Express, Pabon Engineering, Inc. and R.P. Utility & Excavation Corp. were determined to be in compliance with the Implementing Order for the Small Business Enterprise (SBE/Cons) program for construction services and (SBE/GS) program for goods and services. A copy of SBD's Compliance Review is attached hereto as EXHIBIT "D".

Since the project scope was comprised of the construction of approximately 2.1 miles of 24-inch diameter sanitary sewer force main, which included a microtunnel under I-75 and a directional drill under NW 87 Ave., the contract documents required that the bidder's submittal includes a minimum of three (3) qualifying projects completed within the last ten (10) years. Upon review of the low bidder's submittal, it was determined that the qualifying projects for the bidder met the required minimum experience. In addition, it was a requirement of the contract documents that the bidder or its trenchless construction subcontractor furnish a listing of qualifying projects with the bid, which was missing in the bid submittal from Metro Express. Upon WASD's request, Metro Express provided a listing of qualifying projects for Huxted Tunneling Inc., the firm that will be performing the proposed microtunnel under I-75, and Florida Sol Systems, Inc., the firm that will be performing the directional drill under NW 87th Avenue. It has been determined that Metro Express' failure to provide the listing of qualifying projects for its trenchless subcontractor(s) with its bid is a matter of responsibility and does not render the bid non-responsive. Therefore, it is recommended that the County exercise its reserved right, waive the referenced requirement for submittal of three (3) qualifying projects, as referenced above, for the bidder or its trenchless subcontractor at the time of bid submittal and accept the project listings provided for both Huxted Tunneling Inc. and Florida Sol Systems, Inc. (See EXHIBIT "E", as attached)

ISD's Capital Improvements Information System (CIIS) database contains fifty-nine (59) contractor evaluations for Metro Express, which includes twenty-four (24) interim evaluations. Their average overall rating was 3.61 points out of a possible 4 points. (See EXHIBIT "F", as attached).

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It is recommended that the project be awarded to Metro Express, the lowest responsible, responsive bidder, whose base bid of \$5,267,260.78 is approximately 9.98% below the engineer's base estimate of \$5,851,176.60.

PREVIOUS EXPERIENCE WITH THE COUNTY IN THE PAST FIVE (5) YEARS:

According to the Firm History Report (attached as EXHIBIT "J") provided by the Internal Services Department, Division of Small Business Development, Metro Express has been awarded eight (8) construction contracts in the past three (3) years with the County, with a total value of \$9,325,852.53. All of these projects were awarded pursuant to Section 2-8.2.7.01, Miscellaneous Construction Contracts Program, of the Miami-Dade County Code via MCC 7360 Plan.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS EXCEED LEGAL REQUIREMENTS: Yes

In addition to licensing requirements, bidder shall submit proof that their firm has a minimum of three (3) years of experience, under its current business name (which can include the experience of key supervisory employees that would man the project), in the construction of roadway / horizontal projects of similar scope and scale involving public right-of-way construction / installation / repair / replacement of main water distribution systems and/or main sanitary sewer collection systems, and maintenance of vehicular traffic, supported by references for three (3) projects completed within the past ten (10) years. Submitted reference Projects must demonstrate that the Bidder served as the Prime Contractor for the referenced Projects provided.

The Bidder or his trenchless construction subcontractor shall furnish a list of at least three (3) microtunnel projects for a minimum of 36-inch diameter pipe successfully completed by him or his trenchless construction subcontractor.

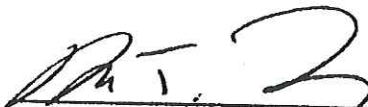

An analysis of the factors contained in Section VI. C. of Implementing Order 3-22 indicates that a 12.74% Small Business Enterprise - Construction (SBE-Con) subcontractor goal is appropriate for the trades of: Site Preparation Contractors (0.08%-Clearing/Grubbing); Water and Sewer Line and Related Structures Construction (10.54%-24" DIP/Install, 1.02%-Air Release Valves Construction, 0.84%-Existing Mains) and Highway, Street, and Bridge Construction (0.08%-Concrete Sidewalks, 0.18%-Curb/Gutter).

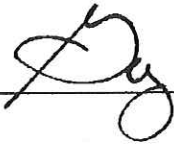

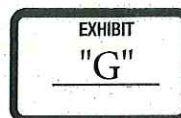

THIS CONTRACT, made and entered into on the _____ day
of _____, 20_____, by and between Miami-Dade County, Florida,
acting by and through the Office of the Mayor, party of the first part (hereinafter sometimes
called the "County"), and **Metro Express, Inc.**, party of the second
part (hereinafter sometimes called "Contractor");

WITNESSETH

That the parties hereto, for and in consideration of the covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth,
mutually agree as follows, to wit:

1. That the Contractor shall furnish all labor, materials and equipment and perform all work in the
manner and form provided by the Contract Documents covering the Project of the County known
and identified as

**"FURNISH AND INSTALL 24-INCH SANITARY FORCE MAIN ALONG NW 170TH
STREET FROM NW 97TH AVENUE TO NW 75TH PLACE,
CONTRACT NO. S-947"**

for the aggregate amount reflected by the Proposal, said aggregate amount being of **Six Million
Six Hundred Ten Thousand Seven Hundred Thirty Dollars and Seventy Six Cents (U.S.
Dollars) \$6,610,730.76.**

2. That the Contractor shall begin the work to be performed under this Contract on a day to be
specified in a written order issued by the Engineer, and shall fully complete all work hereunder within the
time or times stated in the Proposal.

3. That the County shall pay to the Contractor for the faithful performance of this Contract, in lawful
money of the United States, and subject to additions and deductions as provided in the Contract
Documents, the total amount of the Proposal as set forth above at the times and in a manner stated in the
General Covenants and Conditions of the Contract Documents.

4. It is further mutually agreed that if at any time after the execution of this Contract, Surety
Performance and Payment Bond, the County shall deem the surety upon such bonds to be
unsatisfactory, or if for any reason such bond shall become inadequate to cover the performance of the
work, the Contractor shall at its own expense, within five (5) days after the receipt of notice from the
County to do so, furnish an additional bond or bonds in such form and amount and with such surety or
sureties as shall be satisfactory to the County. In such event, no further payment to the Contractor shall
be deemed to be due under this Contract until such new or additional security shall have been furnished
in a manner and form satisfactory to the County.

5. The "Contract Documents" are hereby defined as the Questionnaire, the Advertisement for Bids,
the Instructions to Bidders, the Proposal, the Certified Resolution (Proposal/Prescribed Bid Bond), the
Prescribed Bid Bond, the Contract, the Surety Performance and Payment Bond, the Certified Resolution
(Contract/ Surety Performance and Payment Bond), the General Terms and Conditions, the
Supplemental General Terms and Conditions, Special Provisions, the Supplemental General Conditions
(if Ordinance 90-143 is applicable) including Wage and Benefit Schedules, the Specifications, the Plans,
any Addenda which may be issued, the Subcontractor /Supplier Listing Form (Ordinance 97-104 as
amended by Ordinance 00-30), the Reporting Subcontracting Policies and Procedures (Ordinance 98 -15

9), the Small Business Enterprise Programs Participation Provisions and Forms (if applicable), and the provisions for the following: Vendors Affidavit (Uniform County Affidavits); Criminal Record (Felony) (as amended by Ordinance 00-30; Community Workforce Program County Code Section 2-1701, Office of Miami-Dade County Inspector General (IG) (if Ordinance 97-215 as amended by Ordinance 99-15 is applicable); Sworn Statement – Public Entity Crimes [Florida Statute Sect. 287.133 (3) (a)]; Change Orders; Notice to Proceed, Referenced Codes and Standards, Warranties and Guarantees, all related correspondence, field notes, logs, and other documents.

The General Terms and Conditions of said Contract Documents are incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof as though fully set forth herein. The Contract Documents are complementary, so that a recital in one is tantamount to a recital in all, and the Contractor specifically acknowledges that it has read and understands all of said Contract Documents.

6. The various indemnities of the Contractor contained in the Contract Documents indemnifying the County from liability for damages to persons or property caused by acts, omissions, or defaults in the performance of the Contract Documents shall have a monetary limitation of the larger of the following: \$1,000,000.00, or the entire amount of the Contract.

7. The County retains the right to audit any and all information regarding this Contract as described in the General Covenants and Conditions, Section 41 "Audit Rights and Review of Records".

8. Notwithstanding and prevailing over any other provision of the Contract Documents to the contrary, the County Mayor or Mayor's designee's, may exercise the provisions of Section 2-8.2.12 (4)(d) and (e) of the Code of Miami-Dade County. Any change orders or amendments shall not exceed 10 percent of the base contract price in cumulative percentage amount; provided however, that the foregoing limitation shall not apply to any change order or amendment related to emergency actions impacting remediation, public safety, health requirements or recovery from natural disaster and the foregoing change orders and amendments shall require ratification by the Board; provided further that the County Mayor or his designee may reduce in any amount the scope and compensation payable under this Contract and grant compensable and non-compensable time extensions thereunder. Pursuant to Section 2-8.2.12 (5), the County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee's award and execution of this Contract is subject to ratification by the Board of County Commissioners. If the Mayor or the Mayor's designee's action is not ratified, and such legislative action becomes final, this Contract shall be deemed terminated without further notice. In such event, the Contractor shall not be entitled to recovery of any lost profits or other consequential or indirect damages. However, the Contractor is eligible for payment for any work done prior to failure of the ratification, in accordance with General Terms and Conditions Article 11.D(1) Termination for Convenience.
