Subject: Resolution Ratifying Various Actions Related to Vehicle Purchases for Fiscal Year
2019-20

Resolution No. R-46-21

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) ratify the actions of the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee in executing contract awards in the amount of \$52,563,353.84 for the purchase of 811 light and heavy fleet vehicles. This item is being presented to the Board in accordance with Resolution No. R-39-20, which requires a report be provided for ratification.

Background

On January 22, 2020, the Board adopted Resolution No. R-39-20, which delegated contracting authority to the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to award, access, and modify competitively solicited contracts in an amount not to exceed \$89,007,830.70, for the purchase of 1,988 vehicles based on the budgeted amount in the Fiscal Year 2019-20 Adopted Budget, as well as approved carryover purchases and additional purchases requested by departments after the budget was adopted.

The Internal Services Department, Strategic Procurement and Fleet Management Divisions purchased a total of 811 light and heavy fleet vehicles in Fiscal Year 2019-20 for \$52,563,353.84 representing approximately 59 percent of the delegated amount authorized by the Board. Of the total vehicle purchases, 88 vehicles were purchased from 11 local Miami-Dade County vendors in the amount of \$19,172,291.00, which represents approximately 36 percent of the total amount spent.

The vehicles listed below were purchased to support various essential operations within Miami-Dade County to include police patrol, fire rescue, refuse collection and disposal, and other related operational support activities that provide services county-wide.

- The Department of Solid Waste Management utilized \$24,461,682.47 to purchase 142 vehicles for refuse collection, disposal, mosquito control operations, and other related operational support activities.
- The Miami-Dade Police Department utilized \$13,215,827.39 to purchase 508 vehicles to support uniform patrol, investigative and operational support activities.
- The Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department utilized \$9,774,225.43 to purchase 69 vehicles to support fire rescue and other life safety activities.
- The Miami-Dade Aviation Department utilized \$4,623,229.95 to purchase 72 vehicles to support aviation operations and maintenance activities at Miami International Airport and other County-owned Aviation locations.
- The Seaport utilized \$488,388.60 to purchase 20 vehicles necessary to maintain port operations.

In order to procure vehicles on behalf of County Departments for Fiscal Year 2019-20, the Internal Services Department, Strategic Procurement and Fleet Management Divisions conducted market research to include pricing comparisons amongst various co-operative contracts. The vehicles were purchased as follows:

- 804 vehicles totaling \$52,429,012.84 were purchased by accessing co-operative contracts, including the Florida Sheriff's Association, Houston-Galveston Area Council, Sourcewell, State of Florida, City of Tallahassee, OMNIA Partners and Public Sectors, and North Carolina Sheriff's Association.

- Two (2) vehicles totaling \$20,000.00 were purchased via County issued invitations to quote.
- Five (5) vehicles totaling \$114,341.00 were procured via emergency purchase for Fire Rescue. The vehicle purchases included one (1) forklift, and three (3) All Terrain Vehicles needed for COVID-19 response efforts, and one (1) emergency tug needed for the department's helicopters.

Attachment 1 lists the quantity of vehicles purchased and the amount spent by each of the departments for Fiscal Year 2019-20. The request to delegate contracting authority for the purchase of vehicles for the Fiscal Year 2020-21 is being submitted as a separate agenda item, and is intended as a companion item to this ratification. Vehicles that were not purchased in Fiscal Year 19-20 are included in the request for Fiscal Year 2020-21.

Scope

The scope of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The amount requested for ratification is \$52,563,353.84.

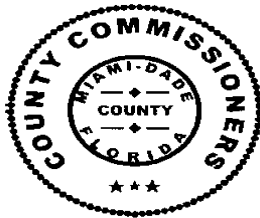
WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,
