Subject: Resolution Authorizing the Approval of the Application of Snow Transportation, Inc. for One Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the application of Snow Transportation, Inc. for one Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to operate one non-emergency vehicle.

SCOPE

These Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity are countywide, allowing the certificate holder to operate in unincorporated and incorporated areas of Miami-Dade County (County).

FISCAL IMPACT

Licensing, operating, permit, and inspection fees are collected by the Miami-Dade County Department of Transportation and Public Works (DTPW) to support regulatory activities. There is an annual regulatory fee of \$625.00 per certificate that will yield \$625.00 in revenue annually for the new certificate. The County also collects \$38.00 per vehicle inspection; with inspection frequency varying with the vehicle age from one to four per year.

TRACK RECORD/MONITOR

This applicant will be a new certificate holder upon approval and complies with all requirements of the Code of Miami-Dade County. DTPW will be responsible for monitoring this company.

BACKGROUND

On December 18, 1980, the Board adopted Ordinance 80-145, later codified in Chapter 4, Article III of the County Code of Miami-Dade County, providing for the regulation of non-emergency medical transportation. Section 4-44 of the County Code provides the procedures to be followed by the County in processing certificate applications. Based upon those requirements, the Board may issue or refuse to issue the certificate as applied for, or may issue the certificate with modifications or upon such terms and conditions as in its judgment the public interest may require. In reaching a determination, the Board shall consider the application, the Mayor's recommendation, all matters presented during the public hearing, and among others, the following criteria:

- (1) The ability of the applicant to provide the proposed service;
- (2) The adequacy of the management plan of the applicant; and
- (3) The benefits that will accrue to the public interest from the proposed service.

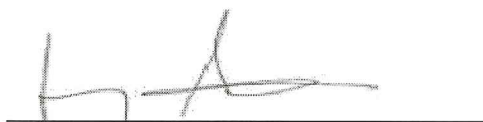
Snow Transportation, Inc., located at 1200 NW 78th Avenue # 900, Miami, Florida 33126, seeks to obtain one Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to provide wheelchair non-emergency medical transportation service to individuals requiring that type of transportation.

The applicant seeks to transport patients to and from various medical facilities throughout the County seven days a week, 24 hours a day. Non-emergency transportation rates are not regulated by the County. However, under the Code, the Certificate Holder must file their rates with DTPW and post them within the passenger compartment section of each vehicle. The proposed rate schedule is attached. The vehicle operated under this certificate will have to meet the requirements of Section 4-49 of the County Code, establishing vehicle inspection frequencies.

The management plan submitted by Mr. Jose Bejerano, President of Snow Transportation, Inc., includes maintenance, communication, and recordkeeping systems which meet the requirements of the County Code. All required financial statements and credit references have been submitted. The proposed service standards meet all requirements of the County Code, and adequately meet transportation and comfort needs. A background investigation revealed that all officers of the corporation meet the criteria of the County Code.

The proposed service to be provided under this certificate will increase the availability of licensed non-emergency medical transportation in the County, thus increasing competition and high service standards to the public.

m-) Proposed Service Standards:

Geographic area(s) to be serviced: We will begin to service South Miami, Kendall, Homestead, Westchester, South Miami Heights, Cutler Ridge, and Perrine. In the future, when our company expands, we will provide services to all Miami-Dade County.

Days and hours of operation: We will operate seven days a week and 24 hours a day.

Level of service standards: We will provide the highest level of service standards to our community. We will show courtesy, punctuality, quality, and high standards of communication to our passengers.

Other: Our intentions are not to compete with any local medical transportation companies. We want to join the team and help improve our medical transportation system in Miami-Dade County.

n-) Proposed Rates:

Stretcher = \$65 the first ten miles, after ten miles each mile will be charged \$1.35

Wheelchair = \$45 the first ten miles, after ten miles each mile will be charged \$1.20

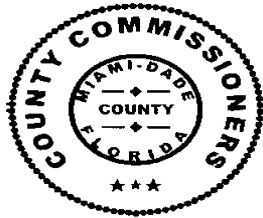
WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,
