RESOLUTION NO. R-829-21

RESOLUTION URGING THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO
APPROPRIATE FUNDING FOR THE MIAMI RIVER
COMMISSION

WHEREAS, the Miami River Commission was created by the Florida Legislature over 20 years ago to improve the 5.5-mile Miami River and its surroundings, including the 69-square-mile water basin that includes portions of the City of Miami and Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, the Miami River Commission is comprised of numerous stakeholders and is established as the official coordinating clearinghouse for all public policy and projects related to the Miami River; and

WHEREAS, the Miami River Commission endeavors to improve the natural environment and the economy of the Miami River and adjacent areas by operating water decontamination vessel services, removing illegally dumped material and invasive plant species from submerged lands, and purchasing and delivering plants, mulch, and dirt for volunteers to use at frequent public Miami River walk beautification events; and

WHEREAS, in section 163.065(3), Florida Statutes, the Miami River Improvement Act recognizes that “state and regional agencies shall provide all available assistance to the Miami River Commission in the conduct of its activities”; and

WHEREAS, Miami-Dade County, the City of Miami, and the Miami Downtown Development Authority currently provide about 50 percent of the funding for the Miami River Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature approved the Miami River Commission's request for funding for State Fiscal Year (FY) 2014-15, FY 2015-16, FY 2016-17, and FY 2017-18; and

WHEREAS, on June 2, 2017, Governor Rick Scott vetoed funding for line item 1613A, funding for the Miami River Commission in the final budget for FY 2017-18; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature did not approve the Miami River Commission's request for funding for FY 2018-19, FY 2019-20, FY 2020-21, or FY 2021-22; and

WHEREAS, funding for the Miami River Commission is critical to continue the successful revitalization and sustained urban redevelopment of the Miami River and its surroundings,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Urges the Florida Legislature to appropriate funding for the Miami River Commission.

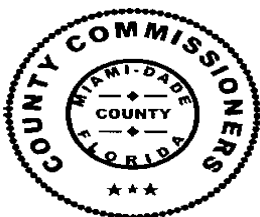
Section 2. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Governor, Senate President, House Speaker, and Chair and Members of the Miami-Dade State Legislative Delegation.

Section 3. Directs the County's state lobbyists to advocate for the appropriation set forth in section 1 above, and authorizes and directs the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to include this item in the 2022 State Legislative Package when it is presented to the Board.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Eileen Higgins. It was offered by Commissioner **Rebeca Sosa**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Sally A. Heyman** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
