RESOLUTION NO. _____ R-960-21

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO STUDY THE POTENTIAL IMPACTS OF SEA LEVEL RISE, SUCH AS INCREASES IN FLOODING, WITH RESPECT TO EXISTING UNDERGROUND AND LOWER-LEVEL PARKING GARAGES AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THIS BOARD AS TO MITIGATION MEASURES AND PRACTICES; AND URGING MUNICIPALITIES WITHIN MIAMI-DADE COUNTY TO TAKE ACTION TO ADDRESS AND MINIMIZE POTENTIAL IMPACTS OF SEA LEVEL RISE, SUCH AS INCREASES IN FLOODING, WITH RESPECT TO SUCH PARKING GARAGES WITHIN THEIR JURISDICTIONS

WHEREAS, sea level rise is a matter of significant concern in Miami-Dade County, and beginning with the creation in 2013 of the Miami-Dade County Sea Level Rise Task Force, this Board has taken numerous actions to study and address the potential impacts of sea level rise and also incorporate the consideration of sea level rise into the County's decision-making processes; and

WHEREAS, underground and lower-level parking garages may be particularly vulnerable to potential impacts from sea level rise, such as increases in flooding over time; and

WHEREAS, it is of the utmost importance to assess these issues and to determine what types of mitigation measures and practices, including, but not limited to, more effective pumps or barriers, can best protect existing underground and lower-level garages against such impacts of sea level rise; and

WHEREAS, in the early morning hours of June 24, 2021, a residential condominium building known as Champlain Towers South located at 8777 Collins Avenue in Surfside, Florida experienced a major structural collapse; and

WHEREAS, the structural collapse of the building tragically resulted in many fatalities among the building's residents and visitors; and

WHEREAS, the cause of the collapse at Champlain Towers South is still under active investigation; and

WHEREAS, it has been reported in the media that the building's lower-level parking garage experienced regular flooding and that there was significant flooding in the parking garage immediately before the collapse; and

WHEREAS, although it may be currently unclear whether there is a link between the collapse at Champlain Towers South and flooding in its parking garage, it is nevertheless important to study the impact of sea level rise on such flooding issues, with the goal of mitigating the risk of future damage to existing structures; and

WHEREAS, as such, this Board wishes to direct the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to study potential sea level rise impacts, such as increases in flooding, with respect to existing underground or lower-level garages, and to make recommendations to this Board as to measures and practices that may mitigate flooding occurrences in such existing garages; and

WHEREAS, in addition, this Board wishes to urge municipalities to take action to address and minimize potential impacts of sea level rise, such as increases in flooding, with respect to existing underground or lower-level parking garages within their municipal boundaries,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Directs the County Mayor or County Mayor’s designee to study potential sea level rise impacts, such as increases in flooding, with respect to existing underground or lower-level garages, and to make recommendations to this Board as to measures and practices that may mitigate flooding occurrences in such existing garages.

Section 2. Directs the County Mayor or County Mayor’s designee to prepare a written report to this Board as to Section 1 of this resolution. The completed report shall be placed on an agenda of this Board pursuant to Ordinance No. 14-65 within 180 days of the effective date of this resolution.

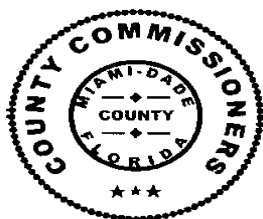
Section 3. Urges municipalities in Miami-Dade County to take action to address and minimize the impacts of sea level rise, such as increases in flooding, with respect to existing underground or lower-level parking garages within their municipal boundaries.

Section 4. Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit certified copies of this resolution to the Mayors and City Councils or City Commissions of the all municipalities within Miami-Dade County.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Rebeca Sosa and the Co-Sponsor is Commissioner Sally A. Heyman. It was offered by Commissioner **Raquel A. Regalado**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Joe A. Martinez** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
