Resolution Ratifying the Award of the Construction Contract S-935 Related to

Subject: Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department's Consent Decree and Capital

Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance

# Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) ratify the action of the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee, as authorized under Section 2-8.2.12 of the Miami-Dade County Code related to Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department's (WASD) Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance (WASD's Acceleration Ordinance) for the funded project identified below and on Exhibit A, as attached.

# **Capital Improvement Project**

This project is for the construction of proposed infrastructure necessary to increase the treatment capacity at the South District Wastewater Treatment Plant (SDWWTP). It includes the construction of proposed improvements to seven existing oxygenation trains, construction of two new electrical buildings, yard piping and site improvements at the SDWWTP.

<u>Item 1</u> – Recommendation awarding Construction Contract for Ocean Outfall Legislation Program Construction Package ST-1B Oxygenation Trains 1-7 Rehabilitation and Electrical Buildings, Contract No. S-935. This item requests ratification of a contract in the total amount not to exceed \$80,560,000 with a total contract period of 1,451 days to Poole & Kent Company of Florida (Poole & Kent).

# **Delegation of Authority**

This contract was awarded pursuant to Section 2-8.2.12 of the Miami-Dade County Code related to WASD's Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance, which delegates authority to the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to award certain projects, and among other things, negotiate, and settle claims, and execute change orders that do not exceed (10%) ten percent of the base contract amount, all subject to ratification by the Board.

# **Scope**

In an effort to continue providing good quality and reliable drinking water and sanitary services, the County needs to upgrade and rehabilitate its water and sewer assets located throughout the County. WASD operates SDWWTP, whose service area continues to increase in population due to growth and redevelopment. It has been observed that current wastewater flows to the plant are approximately 85% to 90% of the permitted daily flows. This project is for the construction of proposed infrastructure necessary to increase the plants permitted average annual daily flow

(AADF) from 112.5 to 131 Million Gallons per Day (MGD) and increase the peak flow capacity of the Plant from 285 MGD to 305 MGD. As shown on Exhibit A, the project is located in Commission District 8, which is represented by Commissioner Danielle Cohen Higgins. Projects awarded through WASD's Acceleration Ordinance have a countywide impact.

# **Fiscal Impact/Funding Source**

The fiscal impact and funding sources for this project are as follow: Future WASD Revenue Bonds, State Revolving Loan Wastewater Program, WASD Revenue Bonds Sold, Wastewater Connection Charges, and WIFIA Loan, and are detailed in Exhibit A and other accompanying attachments.

# Track Record/Monitoring

WASD's Deputy Director of Capital Improvements, Marisela Aranguiz, will oversee the implementation of this project.

# **Due Diligence/Safety Information**

Due diligence was conducted by WASD and the Internal Services Department (ISD) in accordance with ISD's Procurement Guidelines to determine responsibility, including verifying corporate status; performance; safety record, including Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) records; and compliance data. The lists that were reviewed include: convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There were no adverse findings related to the Contractor's responsibility. This information is being provided pursuant to Resolution No. R-187-12.

# **Background**

On September 3, 2014, the Board approved Ordinance No. 14-77 authorizing the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to award contracts for funded capital projects and related goods and services, and to accelerate the approval of WASD's (1) Consent Decree projects and (2) projects identified in WASD Multi-Year Capital Plan's Capital Improvement Program without the need for prior Board approval but subject to ratification by the Board.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Pursuant to the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance, Section 2-8.2.12 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, it is recommended that the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee approve this contract award recommendation to Poole & Kent Company of Florida (hereafter "Poole & Kent"), for Contract No. S-935 to construct Ocean Outfall Legislation (OOL) Program Construction Package ST-1B at the South District Wastewater Treatment Plant (SDWWTP). Construction Package ST-1B is one of several proposed projects that will increase the plant's permitted average annual daily flow (AADF) from 112.5 to 131 Million Gallons per Day (MGD) and peak flow capacity from 285 to 305 MGD. The total compensation amount is \$80,560,000 with a total contract period of 1,451 days. This contract award recommendation was prepared by WASD.

# **DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY:**

Pursuant to Section 2-8.2.12 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee is authorized to amend and execute the Contract. Pursuant to the provisions of Sections 2-8.2.12 (4)(d) and (e) of the Code, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to amend and/or extend the Contract to complete any unfinished work, waive liquidated damages, negotiate and settle claims, and execute change orders that do not exceed ten percent (10%) of the base contract amount. Pursuant to Section 2-8.2.12 (7), all actions taken pursuant to Section 2-8.2.12 are subject to ratification by the Board of County Commissioners.

# **PROJECT NAME:**

Ocean Outfall Legislation Program Construction Package ST-1B Oxygenation Trains 1 - 7 Rehabilitation and Electrical Buildings

# PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

This project is one in a series of projects that are being processed under Section 2-8.2.12 of the Code, entitled Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Accelerate Ordinance. In general, the project consists of furnishing all materials, labor, and equipment necessary for the construction of proposed improvements to seven (7) existing oxygenation trains, construction of two (2) new electrical buildings, yard piping and site improvements at the SDWWTP.

The scope of work includes, but is not limited to:

- 1. Constructing a new stand-alone building for Electrical Substations 5/6, and furnishing and installing all related equipment:
  - a. New feeders from Electrical Distribution Building (EDB)1 to provide temporary 13.2 kilovolt (kV) power to the new substation building.
  - b. New 13.2 kV-480 volt (V) transformers 5 and 6.
  - c. New 480V arc-resistant Switchgear fed from transformers 5 and 6.
  - d. New 480V feeders from new switchgear to Oxygenation Trains 1-4, Headworks 1/Odor Control Building 1, and EDB1 building service loads.
  - e. New 480V feeders from existing Substations 31/32 switchgear to Filtrate Station.
  - f. Testing of existing transformers and electrical equipment for asbestos containing material and lead based paint that was not tested as part of the Asbestos and Lead Survey (Sub-Stations 5&6 and 15&16) report (ATC, December 2020).
  - g. Connecting Substations 5/6 controllers (GE RX3i programmable logic controllers) and RIO to RTU 48 for incorporation into Owner's SCADA network.
  - h. Connecting Substations 5/6 power monitor to Owner's MIS network.
  - i. Furnishing and installing HVAC components.
  - j. Furnishing and installing all appurtenances to Substations 5/6.
- 2. Constructing a new stand-alone building for Electrical Substations 15/16, and furnishing and installing all related equipment:
  - a. New feeders from EDB1 to provide temporary 13.2kV power to the new substation building.
  - New 13.2kV-480V transformers 15/16.
  - c. New 480V arc-resistant Switchgear feed from Substation 15/16.
  - d. New 480V feeders from the Switchgear to Oxygenation Trains 5-8 Electrical Building, Headworks 2/Odor Control Building 2, High Level Disinfection (HLD) Building, and existing Substations 15/16 building service loads.
  - e. Testing of existing transformers and electrical equipment for asbestos containing material and lead based paint that was not tested as part of the Asbestos and Lead Survey (Sub-Stations 5&6 and 15&16) report (ATC, December 2020).
  - f. Connecting Substations 15/16 controllers (GE RX3i programmable logic controllers) and RIO to RTU 49 for incorporation into Owner's SCADA network.
  - g. Connecting Substations 15/16 power monitor to Owner's SCADA network.
  - h. Furnishing and installing HVAC components.
  - i. Constructing required modification of the existing Substations 15/16.
- 3. Construction of new Electrical Ductbank System:
  - a. Connect the existing Electrical Distribution Building 1 with the new Substations 5/6 and 15/16.
  - b. Furnishing and installation of new 480V Duct banks.
  - c. Furnishing and installation of new Signal Duct banks.

It is WASD's intent to obtain a completely functional and satisfactory installation under this project, and any items of labor, equipment or materials which may be reasonably assumed as necessary to accomplish this shall be supplied by Poole & Kent whether or not they are specifically shown on the plans or stated in the specifications. Poole & Kent shall provide all sheeting, shoring, bracing and all other labor, material or equipment required to preclude damage to, or loss of functionality of, any existing facility or system.

The lists that were reviewed include: convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There were no adverse findings related to Poole & Kent's responsibility. This information is being provided pursuant to Resolution R-187-12.

#### **EXPLANATION:**

WASD operates the SDWWTP, whose service area continues to increase in population due to growth and redevelopment. It has been observed that current wastewater flows to the plant are approximately 85% to 90% of the permitted daily flows. This project is for the construction of proposed infrastructure necessary to increase the plants permitted average annual daily flow (AADF) from 112.5 to 131 Million Gallons per Day (MGD) and increase the peak flow capacity of the Plant from 285 MGD to 305 MGD.

On May 27, 2021, WASD received and opened four (4) bids in response to an advertisement for an open competitive solicitation for Contract No. S-935, summarized as follows: (See Bid Tabulation, attached as EXHIBIT "C")

Because contract measures were assigned, the lowest three (3) bids were forwarded to ISD's SBD for a compliance review. On June 23, 2021, SBD issued the results of its compliance review. All three firms, Poole & Kent, Kiewit Water Facilities Florida Co. and Daniel O'Connell's Sons, Inc. were determined to be in compliance with the Implementing Order for the Small Business Enterprise (SBE/Cons) program for construction services and (SBE/GS) program for goods and services. A copy of SBD's Compliance Review is attached hereto as EXHIBIT "D".

In correspondence to WASD dated June 8, 2021, the project's Engineer of Record, Brown and Caldwell, confirmed that Poole & Kent meets the minimum experience requirements, that their bid is compliant and that Brown and Caldwell recommended that WASD proceed with award. (See EXHIBIT "E", as attached)

ISD's Capital Improvements Information System (CIIS) database contains seventy (70) contractor evaluations for Poole & Kent, which includes fifty-four (54) interim evaluations. Their overall average evaluation is 3.5 points out of a possible 4 points. (See EXHIBIT "F", as attached)

It is recommended that the project be awarded to Poole & Kent, the lowest responsible, responsive bidder, whose base bid of \$69,500,000.00 is approximately 6.26% below the engineer's base estimate of \$74,143,770.00.

The Contract, Collusion Affidavit and the Firm's Responsibility Affidavit (also called "Combined Affidavit") executed by Poole & Kent are attached as EXHIBIT "G", EXHIBIT "H" and Exhibit "i", respectively.

# PREVIOUS EXPERIENCE WITH THE COUNTY IN THE PAST THREE (3) YEARS:

According to the Firm History Report (attached as EXHIBIT "K") provided by the ISD, Poole & Kent has been awarded twenty-four (24) projects in the past three (3) years with the County, with a total value of \$575,966,434 and a total amount paid of \$291,511,353. These include both construction contracts and projects solicited as design-build services for the design and construction of WASD facilities and infrastructure.

# MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS EXCEED LEGAL REQUIREMENTS: Yes

In addition to licensing requirements, bidders were required to submit proof with their bids of the following:

- The Bidder has at least the minimum successful contract experience as required below for this Contract. Such proof shall consist of a list of projects, completed prior to the bid date, with the names and telephone numbers of the Department's or representatives that the Department can contact to confirm the listed experience.
- 2. The Bidder shall have successfully completed a minimum of one (1) project demonstrating experience with large wastewater treatment upgrade projects having a total construction value of greater than \$75 million and three (3) projects demonstrating experience with large wastewater treatment upgrade projects having a total construction (for each project) of greater than \$25 million. These projects shall have been performed within the past ten (10) years from the date of the Invitation to Bid.
- 3. The Bidder's proposed project manager shall have successfully completed a minimum of one (1) project demonstrating project management experience with large wastewater treatment upgrade projects having a total construction value of greater than \$25 million. This project shall have been performed within the past ten (10) years from the date of the Invitation to Bid.
- 4. The Bidder or Bidder's Electrical Subcontractor shall have successfully completed a minimum of three (3) projects demonstrating experience with similar sized motor control centers and dedicated electrical buildings for industrial service. These projects shall have been performed within the past ten (10) years from the date of the Invitation to Bid.
- 5. The Bidder or Bidder's Electrical Subcontractor Lead Electrician shall have successfully completed a minimum of one (1) project demonstrating experience with similar sized motor control centers and dedicated electrical buildings for industrial service. This project shall have been performed within the past ten (10) years from the date of the Invitation to Bid.

In the event a firm is established by executives, supervisors, and other senior field staff (key employees) that would have met these minimum experience requirements with a prior firm, the County reserves the right to qualify the firm based on the County 's sole determination and evaluation of the knowledge and prior experience of these key employees employed by the new firm. The experience of key senior personnel with other firms may be counted towards the experience requirement, if acceptable to the Engineer. Should such evidence not be satisfactory to the Engineer, whose decision shall be final, the bid will be considered non-responsive, and the second lowest bidder will be considered for award. The qualifying proof shall be submitted in a separate sealed envelope with the bid.

# BACKGROUND:

The South District Wastewater Treatment Plant (SDWWTP) is owned and operated by the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department. This project is for the construction of proposed infrastructure and is necessary for the increase of SDWWTP's permitted average annual daily flow (AADF) from 112.5 to 131 Million Gallons per Day (MGD) and increase of the peak flow capacity of the Plant from 285 MGD to 305 MGD. Since the SDWWTP's service area continues to increase in population due to growth and redevelopment, it has been observed that current wastewater flows to the SDWWTP is approximately 85% to 90% of the permitted AADF.

it should also be noted that the SDWWTP is one of three (3) regional wastewater treatment facilities operated by WASD and serving the southern portion Miami-Dade County. The wastewater conveyance system to the three wastewater plants is interconnected so flow can be directed between wastewater treatment plants to allow for operational flexibility, therefore the expansion project is part of a regional solution for the wastewater treatment system of the County to meet future flows and loads. The project will also result in a more robust and resilient facility designed to meet WASD's facility hardening criteria. This criterion will allow for the continuous operation of the wastewater treatment system during severe climatological events, which are frequent in the South Florida area.

In addition to being part of the Ocean Outfall Legislation (OOL) program, in accordance with Appendix D of the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) Consent Decree, this project is also required for compliance with Consent Project Number CD 1.03(2), Oxygenation Trains – Mixer Upgrade / Electrical Building. The compliance date for CD 1.03(2) is November 16, 2025.

Contract Documents, b) are compliant and responsive with the bid requirements and c) if that the bid prices generally align with the EOR's Opinion of Probable Construction Cost (OPCC). Brown and Caldwell has reviewed the bid documents provided by MD-WASD and concludes the following:

- a) Poole & Kent Company of Florida meets the minimum construction experience defined in the Contract Documents.
- b) The bid from Poole & Kent Company of Florida is compliant and responsive with the bid requirements.
- c) While there are outliers within the individual bid items, the overall bid is within the low- and high-end ranges of the Engineer's OPCC. Note that the low bidder, Poole & Kent Company, was approximately 12.1% lower than the Engineer's OPCC.

Table 2 and Table 3 are provided as attachments to this letter. Table 2 compares the Engineer's OPCC, to the four bidding contractors, while Table 3 compares the compliance of the Poole & Kent bid versus bid documentation requirements.

With the above review, we recommend that MD-WASD proceed with an issuance of a Notice of Intent of Award for Contract S-935 to Poole & Kent Company of Florida.



Any change orders or amendments shall not exceed 10 percent of the base contract price in cumulative percentage amount; provided however, that the foregoing limitation shall not apply to any change order or amendment related to emergency actions impacting remediation, public safety, health requirements or recovery from natural disaster and the foregoing change orders and amendments shall require ratification by the Board; provided further that the County Mayor or his designee may reduce in any amount the scope and compensation payable under this Contract and grant compensable and non-compensable time extensions thereunder. Pursuant to Section 2-8.2.12 (5), the County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee's award and execution of this Contract is subject to ratification by the Board of County Commissioners.
