Subject: Recommendation for Approval of a Designated Purchase under Contract No. BW-10124, Patrol Management Solution

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) authorize this request for a designated purchase under *Contract No. BW-10124, Patrol Management Solution*, for the Miami-Dade Police Department (MDPD). Approval of a designated purchase, by a two-thirds vote of the Board members present, is being requested pursuant to Section 2-8.1(b)(3) of the Miami-Dade County Code to authorize additional expenditure authority in the amount of \$881,810 to exercise the five, one-year options to renew term.

Background

The ShotSpotter Acoustic Gunshot Detection System (ShotSpotter) was procured under competitive Contract No. RFP-00327, which was awarded by the Board via Resolution No. R-845-16, and later expanded via Resolution No. R-815-19 to increase the locations used by MDPD to identify gunfire and expedite response time. MDPD currently has 21.85 miles of Acoustic Gunshot Detection coverage areas in the Northside and South Districts. ShotSpotter is in the process of installing an additional 1.10 mile in the South District area. Accordingly, MDPD identified a need to improve analytics and resulting efficiencies in assigning officer patrols.

Through Directive No. 190222, MDPD was asked to determine the feasibility of implementing cameras and other technology to enhance the effectiveness of policing. As a result, this bid waiver contract was awarded to ShotSpotter, Inc. under delegated authority for \$214,000 in February 2021 for a one-year term, and the agreement included five, one-year option to renew terms for a Patrol Management System (System) which analyzes data extracted from the ShotSpotter Acoustic Gunshot Detection System to support crime forecasting and patrol/task force management. The contract is currently in the initial term.

As part of its operational mission to improve and promote public safety, MDPD has deployed various initiatives including, but not limited to, line patrol, neighborhood resource offices, anonymous tip lines, community involvement and community-oriented policing. MDPD also received federal Grant Award No. 2020-DJ-BX-0898 in September 2020 from the Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs in the amount of \$401,098 to the fund the implementation and a one-year subscription to the ShotSpotter Connect Patrol Management System provided by ShotSpotter, Inc. A portion of the grant was also used for training and compliance requirements associated with the project entitled Crime-Fighting Toolkit: Listening to Community Voices.

This contract provides MDPD with use of the System which is designed to provide law enforcement agencies with the technology to implement more precise and effective policing. The System incorporates data such as crime events, temporal cycles, and geographic locations to produce high probability crime forecasts. These forecasts are turned into a patrol plan and disseminated to officers in the field. The System uses artificial intelligence-driven analysis to help strategically plan directed patrols and tactics for maximum crime deterrence.

Competition is not feasible because ShotSpotter, Inc. is the proprietary owner of this technology. County staff will continue to monitor the associated industry to determine if new technology becomes available with the functionality needed to support these MDPD operations. Accordingly, it is in the County’s best interest to award this designated purchase pursuant to Section 2-8.1(b)(3) of the County Code to ensure the continuity of services. Pursuant to Resolution R-391-17, while competition is not feasible, the contract contains all current Board mandated terms.

Scope

The impact of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The contract term expires on February 28, 2022. If this request is approved, the contract will have a modified cumulative allocation of \$1,095,810 and will expire on February 28, 2027.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING DESIGNATED PURCHASE PURSUANT TO SECTION 2-8.1(B)(3) OF THE COUNTY CODE BY A TWO-THIRDS VOTE OF THE BOARD MEMBERS PRESENT; AUTHORIZING ADDITIONAL EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY IN A TOTAL AMOUNT UP TO \$881,810.00 FOR THE FIVE, ONE-YEAR OPTIONS TO RENEW TERM FOR A TOTAL MODIFIED CONTRACT AWARD OF \$1,095,810.00 FOR CONTRACT NO. 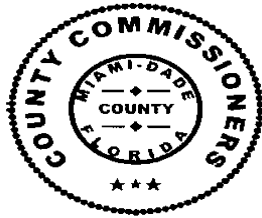
Section 1. This Board authorizes additional expenditure authority in a total amount up to \$881,810.00 for the five, one-year options to renew term for a total modified contract award of \$1,095,810.00 for Contract No. BW-10124 for the purchase of patrol management solution for the Miami-Dade Police Department, pursuant to section 2-8.1(b)(3) of the Code of Miami-Dade County, by a two-thirds vote of the Board members present. Copies of the contract documents are on file with and available upon request from the Internal Services Department, Strategic Procurement Division.

Section 2. This Board authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor’s designee to exercise all provisions of such contract, including any cancellation, renewals and extensions, pursuant to section 2-8.1 of the County Code and Implementing Order 3-38.
