Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approve the establishment of a prequalification pool, *RTQ-01797, Valves, Gas/Vapor, Parts and Services for* the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department with an allocation of \$1,116,000. This pool will replace prequalification pool no. 7605-1/22-1, which was established by the Board through Resolution No. R-576-12 for a five-year term with one five-year option to renew term. The pool is currently in the option to renew term. The pool had four vendors, of which three had local addresses and none were certified Small Enterprise (SBE) firms. The pool currently has seven vendors, of which three have local address and one is certified SBE firm.

The Small Business Enterprise Bid Preference and Local Preference will be applied at the time of spot market competition where permitted by the funding source. An SBE set-aside applies for spot market competition, where permitted by the funding source when there are three or more SBE-certified firms available.

There are three vendors being recommended for inclusion in the pool, of which one has a local address and is a certified Small Business Enterprise firm. The County received four responses to the solicitation, including one "No Bid." The solicitation was advertised on BidSync with 1,761 notifications, for which 29 suppliers viewed the notification. This prequalification poll will remain advertised on the County's website to encourage additional participation. Staff will continue its outreach to firms to encourage additional participation by qualified vendors.

The Pool consists of two groups: Group 1 will be used for the purchase of vapor and gas valves, parts, accessories, and supplies for vapor and gas valves; and Group 2 will be used for services for gas and vapor valves. The Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department will use the replacement pool for the purchase and service of new original equipment manufacturer (OEM) units, parts, accessories and supplies for the following valve types: gas/vapor vacuum relief, check valves, control valves, safety valves, safety relief valves, flame arrestors, emergency relief covers, air release valves and biogas valves. The vapor valves are used in various applications throughout the County's water and wastewater treatment plants and sewer pipelines to control, restrict, or relieve gas or vapor pressure and flow of various types of gases. Services for gas and vapor valves will include inspecting, testing, certifying, assembling and /or repairing gas valves.

<u>Scope</u>

The scope of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact for the five-year term is \$1,116,000. The current pool, 7605-1/22-1, is valued at \$4,798,000 for a ten-year term and expires on July 31, 2022. The allocation under the replacement pool is lower than the allocation under the current pool, and is based upon the department's projected usage for the five-year term.

Manuel Jimenez of the Internal Services Department is the Procurement Contracting Manager.

Delegated Authority

Upon approval of this item, a pool of prequalified vendors will be established to participate in spot market competitions. The County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee will have the authority to solicit pricing and award contracts up to an aggregate amount of the allocation authorized by the Board. The County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee will also have the authority to (a) exercise all provisions of the solicitation documents and any resulting contracts pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the County Code and Implementing Order 3-38 and (b) add vendors to the pool at any time, subject to ratification by the Board on a bi-annual basis.

Vendors Prequalified for Pool

Four vendors responded to the solicitation, including one "No Bid," and three are being recommended for inclusion in the pool, of which one is local and a certified SBE firm.

Pursuant to Resolution No. R-477-18, fewer than 75 percent of vendors recommended are local due to a small number of local firms submitting responses. Approximately 14 manufacturers were identified as currently being used by the County for valve parts and services under two identified groups of products and services. After the establishment, additional qualified vendors may be added to the pool at any time, subject to bi-annual ratification by the Board.

Due Diligence

Pursuant to Resolution No. R-187-12, due diligence was conducted in accordance with the Internal Services Department's Procurement Guidelines to determine vendor responsibility, including verifying corporate status and that there are no performance and compliance issues through various vendor responsibility lists and a keyword internet search. The lists that were referenced included convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There were no adverse findings relating to vendor responsibility.

Pursuant to Resolution No. R-140-15, prior to re-procurement, a full review of the scope of services was conducted to ensure the replacement pool reflects the County's current needs. The review included

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conducting market research, posting a draft solicitation for industry comment and receiving feedback from the user department. There were no updates to the scope of services from the user department. The department will continue to purchase vapor and gas valves, parts, accessories, supplies, and services.

Applicable Ordinances and Contract Measures

- The two percent User Access Program provision applies where permitted by the funding source.
- The Small Business Enterprise Bid Preference and Local Preference will be applied at the time of spot market competition where permitted by the funding source. An SBE set-aside applies for spot market competition, where permitted by the funding source when there are three or more SBE-certified firms available.
- The Living Wage does not apply, as these are not covered services under the ordinance.
