Subject: Resolution Ratifying the Award of Construction Contract W-948 Related to Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department’s Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance and Authorizing the County Mayor or County Mayor’s Designee to Execute Contract

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) ratify the action of the County Mayor or County Mayor’s designee, as authorized under Section 2-8.2.12 of the Miami-Dade County Code related to Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department’s (WASD) Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance (WASD’s Acceleration Ordinance) for the funded project identified below and on Exhibit A, as attached.

Capital Improvement Project

This project consists of the disconnection of existing water meters from the service water lines located in the rear and /or side of 2,733 properties and connection of new water service lines from water meters located in front of the properties as part of the Consumer Line Relocation (CLR) Program.

Item 1 – Recommendation awarding Construction Contract for Water Service Conversion from Rear Water Services to Front Water Services at 2,733 Locations in Miami-Dade County, Contract No. W-948. This item requests ratification of an award for a contract in an amount not to exceed \$12,869,202.90 with a total contract period of 561 days to Maestre Construction, Inc. (Maestre Construction). This contract was fully executed and attested by the Clerk Office on February 24, 2022.

Delegation of Authority

This contract was awarded pursuant to Section 2-8.2.12 of the Miami-Dade County Code related to WASD’s Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance, which delegates authority to the County Mayor or County Mayor’s designee to award certain projects, and among other things, negotiate, and settle claims, and execute change orders that do not exceed ten percent (10%) of the base contract amount, subject to ratification by the Board.

Scope

In an effort to continue providing good quality and reliable drinking water and sanitary services, the County needs to upgrade and rehabilitate its water and sewer assets located throughout the County. WASD established a CLR Program for the replacement of undersized small water mains and the transfer of water service from the rear to the front of properties. The objective is to improve

water service, reduce leakage losses from deteriorating aging lines, improve water quality, and enhance fire protection flows countywide. As shown on Exhibit A, the project is countywide. Projects awarded through WASD’s Acceleration Ordinance have a countywide impact.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The funding source for this project is WASD Operating Revenues and is detailed on Exhibit A and other accompanying attachments. The fiscal impact of this project will be \$12,869,202.90

Track Record/Monitoring

WASD’s Deputy Director of Capital Improvements, Marisela Aranguiz, will oversee the implementation of this project.

Due Diligence/Safety Information

Due diligence was conducted by WASD and the Internal Services Department (ISD) in accordance with ISD’s Procurement Guidelines to determine responsibility, including verifying corporate status; performance; safety record, including Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) records; and compliance data. The lists that were reviewed include: convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There were no adverse findings related to the Contractor’s responsibility. This information is being provided pursuant to Resolution No. R-187-12.

Background

On September 3, 2014, the Board approved Ordinance No. 14-77 authorizing the County Mayor or County Mayor’s designee to award contracts for funded capital projects and related goods and services, and to accelerate the approval of WASD’s (1) Consent Decree projects and (2) projects identified in WASD Multi-Year Capital Plan’s Capital Improvement Program without the need for prior Board approval but subject to ratification by the Board.

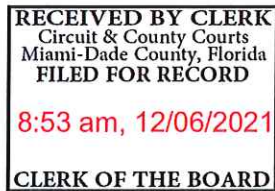

Subject: Recommendation Approving Award of a Construction Contract for Water Service Conversion from Rear Water Services to Front Water Services at 2,733 Locations in Miami-Dade County, Contract No. W-948

RECOMMENDATION:

Pursuant to the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance, Section 2-8.2.12 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, it is recommended that the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee approve this contract award recommendation to Maestre Construction, Inc. (hereafter, "Maestre Construction") to perform water service conversion from rear water services to front water services at 2,733 locations in Miami-Dade County. The total compensation amount is \$12,869,202.90 with a total contract term of 561 days. This contract award recommendation was prepared by WASD.

DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY:

Pursuant to Section 2-8.2.12 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee is authorized to amend and execute the Contract. Pursuant to the provisions of Sections 2-8.2.12(4)(d) and (e) of the Code, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to amend and/or extend the Contract to complete any unfinished work, waive liquidated damages, negotiate and settle claims, and execute change orders that do not exceed ten percent (10%) of the base contract amount. Pursuant to Section 2-8.2.12(7), all actions taken pursuant to Section 2-8.2.12 are subject to ratification by the Board of County Commissioners.

PROJECT NAME:

Water Service Conversion from Rear Water Services to Front Water Services at 2,733 Locations In Miami-Dade County (the "Project")

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

This project is one in a series of projects that are being processed under Section 2-8.2.12 of the Code, entitled Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Accelerate Ordinance.

In general, the Project consists of the disconnection of existing water meters from the service water lines located in the rear and/or side of 2,733 properties and connection of new water service lines from water meters located in front of the properties as part of the Consumer Line Relocation (CLR) Program.

The Contractor shall meet the property owners/tenants where the conversion will be performed, and the property owners shall have the opportunity to review the proposed route and provide their input.

The Contractor shall obtain the owner's signature for all required permits and shall be responsible for applying for and obtaining the required permits, including applying for and pulling the plumbing/electric permits and any other required permits from the Building Office of the municipality in which the work is to be performed.

The Contractor shall furnish all materials, labor, and equipment as specified or necessary for a complete Project, including but not limited to, excavating trenches; placing a sand/fine gravel bed on the bottom of the trench for pipe bedding; furnishing and installing the new water service from the new water meter located in front of the property to the existing household potable water system connection point, which includes copper pipes, tubing, fittings, valves, PVC valve boxes, and the grounding system (where applicable); installing the new vacuum breaker at each existing and new hose bibb; furnishing and installing backflow prevention devices where applicable; installing all piping, fittings, valve boxes and accessories to connect irrigation meter/sub-meter, where existing; performing pressure tests on the new water service pipe; flushing; disinfecting the new service line; disposing of super chlorinated water properly; backfilling and compacting the trench; cutting and plugging existing water service line(s) located inside of the property; removing and disposing of the existing water meter boxes; filling voids (at the abandoned 1-inch wing style angle stop valve) with ready mix concrete; placing top soil and sod on top of concrete as needed to cover areas and/or the necessary material to match the existing condition at this location; performing final cleanup/restoration; and landscaping disturbed areas to equal or better condition.

The Project also includes safety and protection of the homeowner's property, coordinating and obtaining necessary inspections from the Building Office of the municipality in which the work is to be performed, proper disposal of removed materials, and other appurtenant and miscellaneous related items and work needed for a completed Project.

A single contractor was sought by this Contract to administer and coordinate all required work for the CLR Program throughout the County. The work has been separated by Commission District. The successful bidder is required to furnish and provide the services of all plumbers, electricians, or specialty contractors required to successfully perform the relocation work. Further, it is a requirement that the Contractor hire only local licensed sub-contractors, plumbers, electricians, or specialty contractors from the respective District where the work will be done.

The lists that were reviewed include: convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties.

Maestre Construction is referenced on the September 21, 2021 Compliance Report of Open and Closed Small Business, Wage and/or Workforce Violations with an open violation with an SBE Goal

Deficit Makeup, as listed in the Compliance Review attached as Exhibit "D". However, this requirement does not apply to contracts with a 100% Set-aside measure. There were no other adverse findings related to Maestre Construction's responsibility. This information is being provided pursuant to Resolution R-187-12.

EXPLANATION:

On August 30, 2021, WASD received and opened a single bid in response to an advertisement for an open competitive solicitation for Contract No. W-948 (See Bid Tabulation, attached as EXHIBIT "C"). Below is a summary of the sole bid:

Because contract measures were assigned, the single bid was forwarded to ISD's SBD for a compliance review. On September 22, 2021, SBD issued the results of its compliance review. Maestre Construction was determined to be in compliance with the Implementing Order for the Small Business Enterprise (SBE/Cons) program for construction services and (SBE/GS) program for goods and services. A copy of SBD's Compliance Review is attached hereto as EXHIBIT "D".

In correspondence to WASD dated September 10, 2021, the Project's Engineer of Record, Ardurra, confirmed that Maestre Construction's total construction cost was within acceptable range and recommended award to Maestre Construction. (See EXHIBIT "F", as attached)

ISD's Capital Improvements Information System (CIIS) database contains forty-six (46) contractor evaluations for Maestre Construction, which include seven (7) interim evaluations. Their overall average evaluation is 3.8 points out of a possible 4 points. (See EXHIBIT "E", as attached)

It is recommended that the Project be awarded to Maestre Construction, whose total bid of \$12,869,202.90 is 3.85% above the total estimate of \$12,291,426.49.

The Contract, Collusion Affidavit and the Firm's Responsibility Affidavit (also called "Combined Affidavit") executed by Maestre Construction are attached as EXHIBIT "G", EXHIBIT "H" and Exhibit "I", respectively.

According to the Firm History Report (attached as EXHIBIT "J") provided by ISD, Maestre Construction has been awarded twenty-seven (27) projects in the past three (3) years with the County, with a total value of \$30,881,851. These include construction contracts solicited via Miscellaneous Construction Contract (MCC) 7040 Plan and MCC 7360 Plan.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS EXCEED LEGAL REQUIREMENTS: Yes

BACKGROUND:

The Miami Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) established a Consumer Line Relocation (CLR) Program for the replacement of undersized small water mains and the transfer of water service from the rear to the front of properties. The objective is to improve water service, reduce leakage losses from deteriorating aging lines, improve water quality, and enhance fire protection flows. This Program has lead to a reduction in WASD's maintenance and operating costs while also conserving water resources.

WASD's water system has over 600 miles of small diameter pipe (i.e. less than 4-inches in diameter) that are over 30 years old and facing issues such as being undersized, leaking, low pressure, reduced water quality, etc. WASD has created the CLR Program to correct adverse issues with small diameter water mains while improving system pressure and providing fire flow protection. The objective is to identify, rehabilitate, replace or renew the small diameter aging infrastructure while also transferring water service to the front of the properties.

The CLR program will, in part, satisfy a condition by the South Florida Water Management District in issuing a 20-Year Water Use Permit to the County, which requires a reduction in water losses in the County's distribution system.

On December 2, 2008, through Ordinance No. 08-140, which amended Section 32-78 of the Miami-Dade County Code, the Miami-Dade County Board of County Commission authorized WASD to transfer the water service to the front of those properties that are still connected to a rear water main. The Ordinance requires premises abutting water mains in the public right-of-way and/or easements to connect to water mains that run in front of their properties. Where premises are abutted by two water mains and connected to the rear water main, under the CLR, WASD may require the premises to connect to the front water main at no cost to the property owner.

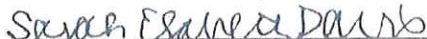

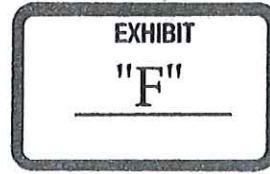

All items presented in our EOPC were verified and the prices shown are accurate within the current market prices.

When comparing the total construction cost of the EOPC (\$12,391,186.49) to the total construction cost of lowest bidder (\$14,135,829.00), it was found to be 14%, within the acceptable threshold of a class 1 estimate for the higher expected cost as established by AACE cost estimate classification system.

Note – The total construction costs reflected above include the following three dedicated allowances not included in the bid item documents submitted by the contractor:

- For relocation of additional existing water services
- For F&I water services (work in the Right of Way)
- Off-Duty police officers

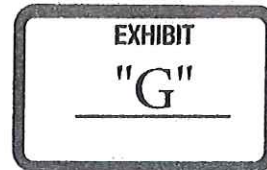

CONTRACT



THIS CONTRACT, made and entered into on the 29 day of November, 2021, by and between Miami-Dade County, Florida, acting by and through the Office of the Mayor, party of the first part (hereinafter sometimes called the "County"), and Maestre Construction, Inc., party of the second part (hereinafter sometimes called "Contractor");

WITNESSETH

That the parties hereto, for and in consideration of the covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth, mutually agree as follows, to wit:

1. That the Contractor shall furnish all labor, materials and equipment and perform all work in the manner and form provided by the Contract Documents covering the Project of the County known and identified as

for the aggregate amount reflected by the Proposal, said aggregate amount being of Twelve Million Eight Hundred Sixty-Nine Thousand Two Hundred Two Dollars and Ninety Cents (U.S. Dollars) \$12,869,202.90.

2. That the Contractor shall begin the work to be performed under this Contract on a day to be specified in a written order issued by the Engineer, and shall fully complete all work hereunder within the time or times stated in the Proposal.

3. That the County shall pay to the Contractor for the faithful performance of this Contract, in lawful money of the United States, and subject to additions and deductions as provided in the Contract Documents, the total amount of the Proposal as set forth above at the times and in a manner stated in the General Covenants and Conditions of the Contract Documents.

4. It is further mutually agreed that if at any time after the execution of this Contract, Surety Performance and Payment Bond, the County shall deem the surety upon such bonds to be unsatisfactory, or if for any reason such bond shall become inadequate to cover the performance of the work, the Contractor shall at its own expense, within five (5) days after the receipt of notice from the County to do so, furnish an additional bond or bonds in such form and amount and with such surety or sureties as shall be satisfactory to the County. In such event, no further payment to the Contractor shall be deemed to be due under this Contract until such new or additional security shall have been furnished in a manner and form satisfactory to the County.

5. The "Contract Documents" are hereby defined as the Questionnaire, the Advertisement for Bids, the Instructions to Bidders, the Proposal, the Certified Resolution (Proposal/Prescribed Bid Bond), the Prescribed Bid Bond, the Contract, the Surety Performance and Payment Bond, the Certified Resolution (Contract/ Surety Performance and Payment Bond), the General Terms and Conditions, the Supplemental General Terms and Conditions, Special Provisions, the Supplemental General Conditions (if Ordinance 90-143 is applicable) including Wage and Benefit Schedules, the Specifications, the Plans, any Addenda which may be issued, the Subcontractor /Supplier Listing Form (Ordinance 97-104 as amended by Ordinance 00-30), the Reporting Subcontracting Policies and Procedures (Ordinance 98 -15 9), the Small Business Enterprise Programs Participation Provisions and Forms (if applicable), and the W-948

provisions for the following: Vendors Affidavit (Uniform County Affidavits); Criminal Record (Felony) (as amended by Ordinance 00-30; Community Workforce Program County Code Section 2-1701, Office of Miami-Dade County Inspector General (IG) (if Ordinance 97-215 as amended by Ordinance 99-15 is applicable); Sworn Statement – Public Entity Crimes [Florida Statute Sect. 287.133 (3) (a)]; Change Orders; Notice to Proceed, Referenced Codes and Standards, Warranties and Guarantees, all related correspondence, field notes, logs, and other documents.

The General Terms and Conditions of said Contract Documents are incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof as though fully set forth herein. The Contract Documents are complementary, so that a recital in one is tantamount to a recital in all, and the Contractor specifically acknowledges that it has read and understands all of said Contract Documents.

6. The various indemnities of the Contractor contained in the Contract Documents indemnifying the County from liability for damages to persons or property caused by acts, omissions, or defaults in the performance of the Contract Documents shall have a monetary limitation of the larger of the following: \$1,000,000.00, or the entire amount of the Contract.

7. The County retains the right to audit any and all information regarding this Contract as described in the General Covenants and Conditions, Section 41 "Audit Rights and Review of Records".

8. Notwithstanding and prevailing over any other provision of the Contract Documents to the contrary, the County Mayor or Mayor's designee's, may exercise the provisions of Section 2-8.2.12 (4)(d) and (e) of the Code of Miami-Dade County. Any change orders or amendments shall not exceed 10 percent of the base contract price in cumulative percentage amount; provided however, that the foregoing limitation shall not apply to any change order or amendment related to emergency actions impacting remediation, public safety, health requirements or recovery from natural disaster and the foregoing change orders and amendments shall require ratification by the Board; provided further that the County Mayor or his designee may reduce in any amount the scope and compensation payable under this Contract and grant compensable and non-compensable time extensions thereunder. Pursuant to Section 2-8.2.12 (5), the County Mayor or the County Mayor's designee's award and execution of this Contract is subject to ratification by the Board of County Commissioners. If the Mayor or the Mayor's designee's action is not ratified, and such legislative action becomes final, this Contract shall be deemed terminated without further notice. In such event, the Contractor shall not be entitled to recovery of any lost profits or other consequential or indirect damages. However, the Contractor is eligible for payment for any work done prior to failure of the ratification, in accordance with General Terms and Conditions Article 11.D(1) Termination for Convenience.

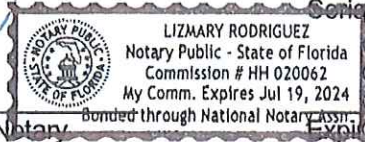

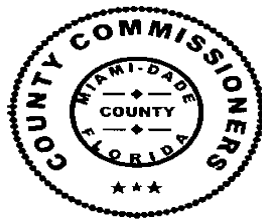
WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board ratifies the action of the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee, as authorized by Section 2-8.2.12 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, specifically, approving the award of a construction contract for Water Service Conversion from Rear Water Services to Front Water Services at 2,733 Locations in Miami-Dade County, Contract No. W-948, to Maestre Construction, Inc., in a total amount not to exceed \$12,869,202.90; and authorizes the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to exercise the provisions contained in such contract, as set forth in the accompanying memorandum and attachments thereto.
