Subject: Resolution Ratifying the Award of the Construction Contract S-960 Related to
Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department’s Consent Decree and Capital
Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) ratify the action of the County Mayor or County Mayor’s designee, as authorized under Section 2-8.2.12 of the Miami-Dade County Code related to Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department’s (WASD) Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance (WASD’s Acceleration Ordinance) for the funded project identified below and on Exhibit A, as attached.

Capital Improvement Project

WASD is required to make repairs and rehabilitate the County’s wastewater gravity lines within the sewage collection system. WASD intends to establish a contract with a successful bidder to repair the gravity sanitary sewer defects.

Item 1 – Recommendation ratifying the award of Construction Contract for One-Year Countywide Contract for Rehabilitation of Sanitary Sewers by the Sectional Lining Method with County Option to Renew for an Additional Three Years on a Yearly Basis, Contract No. S-960. This item requests ratification of an award for a contract in a total amount not to exceed \$4,000,000 with a total contract period of 1,460 days, if all options to renew are exercised, to UIT, LLC (UIT). The contract was fully executed and attested by the Clerk Office on December 21, 2021.

Delegation of Authority

This contract was awarded pursuant to Section 2-8.2.12 of the Miami-Dade County Code related to WASD’s Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance, which delegates authority to the County Mayor or County Mayor’s designee to award certain projects, and among other things, negotiate and settle claims, and execute change orders that do not exceed ten percent (10%) of the base contract amount, subject to ratification by the Board.

Scope

In an effort to continue providing good quality and reliable drinking water and sanitary services, the County needs to upgrade and rehabilitate its water and sewer assets located throughout the County. This project consists of furnishing all labor, materials, and equipment necessary for rehabilitating 8 through 36-inch diameter gravity sanitary sewer pipe faults by the cured-in-place sectional pipe lining method, at various locations within Miami-Dade County, Florida.

As shown on Exhibit A, the project location is Countywide, and in various Commission Districts. Projects awarded through WASD’s Acceleration Ordinance have a countywide impact.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The funding sources for this project are as follow: Future WASD Revenue Bonds and WASD Revenue Bonds Sold and are detailed in Exhibit A and other accompanying attachments. The fiscal impact of this project is \$4,000,000.

Track Record/Monitoring

WASD’s Deputy Director of Capital Improvements, Marisela Aranguiz, will oversee the implementation of this project.

Due Diligence/Safety Information

Due diligence was conducted by WASD and the Internal Services Department (ISD) in accordance with ISD’s Procurement Guidelines to determine responsibility, including verifying corporate status; performance; safety record, including Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) records; and compliance data. The lists that were reviewed include: convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There were no adverse findings related to the Contractor’s responsibility. This information is being provided pursuant to Resolution No. R-187-12.

Background

On September 3, 2014, the Board approved Ordinance No. 14-77 authorizing the County Mayor or County Mayor’s designee to award contracts for funded capital projects and related goods and services, and to accelerate the approval of WASD’s (1) Consent Decree projects and (2) projects identified in WASD Multi-Year Capital Plan’s Capital Improvement Program without the need for prior Board approval but subject to ratification by the Board.

RECOMMENDATION:

Pursuant to the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Acceleration Ordinance, Section 2-8.2.12 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, it is recommended that the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee approve this contract award recommendation to UIT, LLC (hereafter "UIT") to perform sewer rehabilitation for One-Year Countywide Contract for Rehabilitation of Sanitary Sewers by the Sectional Lining Method with County Option to Renew for an Additional Three Years on a Yearly Basis. The total compensation amount is up to \$4,000,000 with a total contract term of up to 1,460 days, if all options to renew are exercised. This contract award commendation was prepared by WASD.

DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY:

Pursuant to Section 2-8.2.12 of the Code of Miami-Dade County, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee is authorized to amend and execute the Contract. Pursuant to the provisions of Sections 2-8.2.12 (4)(d) and (e) of the Code, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to amend and/or extend the Contract to complete any unfinished work, waive liquidated damages, negotiate and settle claims, and execute change orders that do not exceed ten percent (10%) of the base contract amount. Pursuant to Section 2-8.2.12 (7), all actions taken pursuant to Section 2-8.2.12 are subject to ratification by the Board of County Commissioners.

PROJECT NAME:

One-Year Countywide Contract for Rehabilitation of Sanitary Sewers by the Sectional Lining Method with County Option to Renew for an Additional Three Years on a Yearly Basis

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

This project is one in a series of projects that are being processed under Section 2-8.2.12 of the Code, entitled Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department Consent Decree and Capital Improvement Programs Accelerate Ordinance.

The project consists of furnishing all labor, materials and equipment necessary for rehabilitating 8 through 36-inch diameter gravity sanitary sewer pipe faults by the cured-in-place sectional pipe lining method, at various locations within the limits of Miami-Dade County, Florida. It is WASD's intent to establish a "blanket" type contract with one (1) successful bidder, for a period of one year, to repair gravity sanitary sewer defects.

This is a non-exclusive contract, and as such, the Department may issue other similar contracts for this type of work, and therefore does not guarantee that the full amount of the contract work as listed in the proposal will be issued to the contractor. The actual amount of work orders assigned will be the prerogative of WASD in its sole discretion and dependent only upon its needs.

The work includes cleaning of the affected existing gravity sanitary sewers, isolating the reach of sewer to be repaired (line between two manholes), inspecting it with closed circuit television (CCTV), repairing the fault by installing a cured-in-place sectional pipe liner, reinstating any service laterals and video-reinspecting and logging the entire length of the repaired reach. The work in the sewer line shall be accomplished through manholes, without disturbing the street surface or adjacent property or any utility. The Contractor shall furnish all other materials, labor and equipment as specified or necessary for a complete Project.

Due diligence was conducted by WASD and the Internal Services Department (ISD) in accordance with ISD's Procurement Guidelines to determine responsibility, including verifying corporate status, safety, performance and compliance data. The lists that were reviewed include: convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. There were no adverse findings related to UIT, LLC's responsibility. This information is being provided pursuant to Resolution R-187-12.

EXPLANATION:

On October 20, 2021, WASD received and opened a single bid in response to an advertisement for an open competitive solicitation for Contract No. S-960 (See Bid Tabulation, attached as EXHIBIT "C"). Unit prices bid were used for uniform comparison amongst bidders, and bids were evaluated based upon the lowest total amount in the Proposal. Below is a summary of the sole bid:

Because this contract measures were assigned, the single bid was forwarded to ISD's SBD for a compliance review. On November 16, 2021, SBD issued the results of its compliance review. UIT was determined to be in compliance with the Implementing Order for the Small Business Enterprise (SBE/Cons) program for construction services and (SBE/GS) program for goods and services. A copy of SBD's Compliance Review is attached hereto as EXHIBIT "D".

Since UIT was awarded Contractor S-900, the previous sectional lining annual contract awarded and filed with the Clerk of the Board on October 19, 2016, along with three (3) options to renew executed in 2018, 2019, 2020, UIT meets the minimum experience requirements. (See EXHIBIT "E", as attached)

ISD's Capital Improvements Information System (CIIS) database contains two (2) contractor evaluations for UIT, which includes one (1) interim evaluation. Their overall average evaluation is 3.7 points out of a possible 4 points. (See EXHIBIT "F", as attached)

It is recommended that the project be awarded to UIT, LLC, the sole bidder who is also a responsible, responsive bidder.

The Contract, Collusion Affidavit and the Firm's Responsibility Affidavit (also called "Combined Affidavit") executed by UIT, LLC are attached as EXHIBIT "G", EXHIBIT "H" and Exhibit "I", respectively.

PREVIOUS EXPERIENCE WITH THE COUNTY IN THE PAST THREE (3) YEARS:

According to the Firm History Report (attached as EXHIBIT "J") provided by the ISD, UIT has been awarded four (4) projects in the past three (3) years with the County, with a total value of \$3,543,004. These include both construction contracts and projects solicited via the County's Miscellaneous Construction Program 7040 Plan.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS EXCEED LEGAL REQUIREMENTS: Yes

In addition to licensing requirements, Bidders were required to submit proof that his/her firm has been regularly and successfully engaged in the installation of sectional liners in sanitary sewers for a minimum of one (1) year and has successfully performed an aggregate amount of at least 200 repairs in the United States, for their bid to be acceptable.

BACKGROUND:

In 1996, the Volume Sewer Customer Ordinance was adopted by the Board to comply with the requirements of the first Consent Decree issued to the County in 1994 resulting from operational violations of the County's wastewater system. Among the requirements of the first Consent Decree was the evaluation, inspection and repair of gravity wastewater pipelines. The objective was to minimize the number of leaks that infiltrate into wastewater pipelines which cause operational inefficiencies and wastewater flows that exfiltrate and seep into the ground. This mandate was superseded by the County's current Consent Decree, which was approved by the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Florida on April 9, 2014 in Case No. 1:12-cv-24400-FAM. Under the current Consent Decree, the repair and rehabilitation of the County's wastewater gravity lines continues to be a regulatory priority.

In addition, WASD is required to make repairs to the sewage collection system to comply with the Volume Sewer Customer Ordinance and the Wellfield Protection Ordinance, Section 24-13.1 and Section 24-12.1 of the Miami-Dade County Code, respectfully.

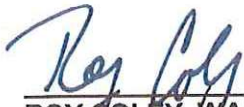

On August 29, 2016, SBD issued the results of its findings confirming that all three bidders that submitted were in compliance with the contract measures established. A copy of SBD's Compliance Review along with UIT, LLC's Schedule of Intent Affidavit are attached (See EXHIBIT "E", as attached).

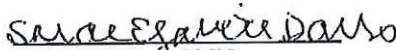

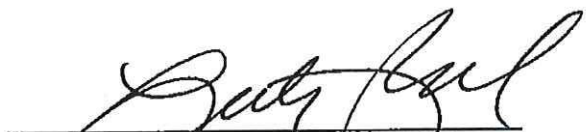

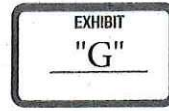

However, the Contractor is eligible for payment for any work done prior to failure of the ratification, in accordance with General Terms and Conditions Article 11.D(1) Termination for Convenience.
