RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO EXAMINE THE FEASIBILITY OF DEVELOPING A SMARTPHONE APPLICATION TO ALLOW INDIVIDUALS TO REPORT SUSPECTED HUMAN TRAFFICKING ACTIVITY TO LAW ENFORCEMENT AND TO PROVIDE A REPORT

WHEREAS, human trafficking is a form of modern-day slavery, which involves the exploitation of persons for commercial sex or forced labor and often subjects victims to force, fraud, and coercion; and

WHEREAS, while many victims of human trafficking are forced to work in prostitution or the sexual entertainment industry, trafficking also occurs in forms of labor exploitation, such as domestic servitude and restaurant, janitorial, sweatshop factory, and agricultural work; and

WHEREAS, the federal government estimates that 25 million people are currently victims of human trafficking for both sex and labor; and

WHEREAS, a 2011 report by the Department of Justice's Bureau of Judicial Statistics also found that nearly half of all incidents of sex trafficking in the United States involve victims under the age of 18; and

WHEREAS, statistics provided by the Miami-Dade State Attorney's Office shows how human trafficking disproportionately affects the lives of females with approximately 96 percent of the minor victims and 92 percent of the adult victims of human trafficking in Miami-Dade County being female; and

WHEREAS, these actions have no place in our world, and this Board has long believed that we should do everything in our power to end this horrific practice to prevent any more innocent lives from being exploited; and

WHEREAS, individuals in Miami-Dade County currently have multiple ways to report suspected human trafficking activity, including various national and local hotlines such as 305-FIX-STOP; and

WHEREAS, notwithstanding these multiple reporting options, there remain opportunities for law enforcement to use advances in technology to obtain better information from the public about suspected human trafficking activity; and

WHEREAS, for example, in December 2020 the St. Petersburg Police Department announced the creation of a smartphone application, based on recommendations from the Tampa Bay Human Trafficking Task Force, that allows individuals to anonymously submit information to law enforcement regarding human trafficking and, through the application, include any relevant photo or video clips with their tips; and

WHEREAS, this Board supports these goals and ideals, and it would like to do its part to help raise awareness and assist in the investigation and prosecution of human trafficking,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee is hereby directed to examine the feasibility of developing a smartphone application that would allow individuals in Miami-Dade County to submit anonymous information to law enforcement regarding suspected human trafficking activity and also allow individuals to include relevant photo and video clips with their anonymous tips. The County Mayor or County Mayor's designee shall provide a feasibility report to this Board that shall include, at a minimum,

the following: (1) the feasibility of developing such an application; (2) whether any of the County's existing smartphone applications can be updated or whether any applications developed by other entities can be licensed to provide the same capabilities, and if doing so would be the most cost effective and expeditious manner to allow individuals in Miami-Dade County to submit anonymous information to law enforcement regarding suspected human trafficking activity over a smartphone application; (3) a timeline for the development and deployment of such an application; and (4) any fiscal impact that the development and operation of such an application may have and potential funding sources, including grant funding, that could be used. Such report shall be provided to the Board within 90 days after the effective date of this resolution and be placed on an agenda of this Board pursuant to Ordinance No. 14-65. And, to the extent further action is required to develop a smartphone application for individuals in Miami-Dade County to submit anonymous information to law enforcement regarding suspected human trafficking activity, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee shall also present necessary amendments to existing contracts and recommendations for any new contract awards to this Board for approval as soon as practicable.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Chairman Jose "Pepe" Diaz. It was offered by Commissioner **Rebeca Sosa**, who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner **Danielle Cohen Higgins** and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
