Subject: Request for Additional Expenditure Authority to Prequalification Pool No. RTQ-00593, Storage Containers

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) authorize additional expenditure authority to *Prequalification Pool No. RTQ-00593, Storage Containers*, for multiple County departments. The departments are requesting \$790,519 in additional expenditure authority to continue purchasing a variety of storage containers throughout the term of the pool.

On March 6, 2018, the Board established prequalification pool *RTQ-00593* under Resolution No. R-208-18 for an initial term of five years, with one, five-year option to renew term. The pool was subsequently modified under delegated authority and the Board approved additional expenditure authority through Resolution No. R-907-19. There are three prequalified vendors in the pool, of which all have local addresses. Additional vendors may be added throughout the term of the pool. The pool is currently in the initial term. Small Business Enterprise (SBE) measures and Local Preference will be applied at the time of spot market competition where permitted by the funding source.

Background

Departments use these storage containers to store tools and equipment during construction and infrastructure upgrades, secure parts and materials for ongoing projects and refrigerate food for inmates.

Additional expenditure authority is requested as follows:

- Miami-Dade Fire and Rescue (MDFR) is requesting \$350,000 to purchase storage containers to provide a separate space, outside the livable space of the fire station, where bunker gear and bunker gear lockers will be housed. Currently, some older fire stations do not have a separate area in which to house gear. It is important to note that when firefighters return to the fire station from the scene of a fire, the gear must be kept in a separate and controlled area to isolate the carcinogens on the gear. In 2017 the department purchased a shed, which over time has proven to be inadequate for the storage of bunker gear. As such, it was determined by MDFR that the remote storage of bunker gears in a controlled environment would comply with the above recommendations and ensure the safety of our firefighters and the longevity of the gear, increasing its usage from five years to ten years. This initiative has been approved by the Department's Health and Safety Committee and the Firefighter's Union Local 1403
- Water and Sewer Department (WASD) is requesting of \$440,519 to continue purchasing storage containers used throughout storerooms, plants and pump stations to secure parts such as tires, wires, pumps and motors parts. Also, the additional allocation will be used to purchase eight, 40-foot storage containers for the Department's Medley Yard project. This critical weatherization project is to protect items stored outdoors from sun and water damage. As WASD's consent decree and capital improvement projects are accelerated, the need for additional containers is crucial to ensure the proper storage of tools and equipment.

Scope

The scope of this item is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The pool is in the initial term, which expires on June 30, 2023. The pool has an existing cumulative allocation of \$926,200. If this request is approved, the initial term of the pool will have a modified cumulative value of \$1,716,719. The requested increase in expenditure authority is based on new projects that were not anticipated at time of pool establishment. The additional expenditure for this year was approved by the Board as part of the fiscal year 2021-2022 County budget.

It should be noted the pool contains termination for convenience provisions, which can be exercised if the commodities and services in this item are affected by the establishment of the constitutional offices.

Delegated Authority

There is no additional delegation of authority sought in this item as the authority to solicit pricing and award contracts up to an aggregate amount of the allocation authorized by the Board, exercise all provisions of the solicitation documents and any resulting contracts pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the County Code and Implementing Order 3-38, and add vendors to the pool at any time, subject to ratification by the Board on a bi-annual basis, was granted when the pool was established under Resolution No. R-208-18.

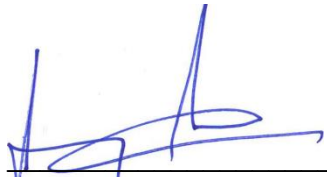

Due Diligence

Pursuant to Resolution No. R-187-12, due diligence was conducted in accordance with the Internal Services Department's Procurement Guidelines to determine vendor responsibility, including verifying corporate status and that there are no performance and compliance issues. The lists that were referenced included convicted vendors, debarred vendors, delinquent contractors, suspended vendors, and federal excluded parties. Additionally, litigation history of the companies was included as part of due diligence.

Applicable Ordinances and Contract Measures

- The two percent User Access Program provision applies where permitted by funding source.
- The Small Business Enterprise measures and Local Preference will be applied at the time of spot market competition where permitted by the funding source. An SBE set-aside applies for spot market competition up to \$250,000 of at least two available SBE certified firms or over \$250,000 of at least three available SBE certified firms, where permitted by the funding source.
- The Living Wage Ordinance does not apply as the services are not covered by the Ordinance.

DEPARTMENTS

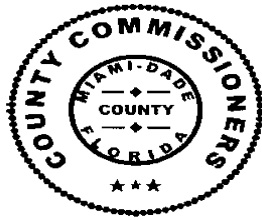
WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference,
